SCHOOL REPORT

For the Year Ending August 1901

This report is abridged, as the school year ends in August and the Fall and winter terms were included in last year's report. Before the beginning of the third or summer term the school books were collected and re-labeled, many of them being found in a bad condition and unfit for use. Three schools of ten weeks each, Parker Hill, Tinkerville and Pond were maintained. The attendance at Parker Hill was irregular on account of scarlet fever:

Whole number of different pupils five years of age and upwards registered at least two weeks during the year, 101; boys, 54; girls, 47; number under 6 years of age, 6; number over 16 years of age, 1; number between 6 and 16, 94; average membership, 70 7 9; average attendance, 56 5-9; number of visits by parents, citizens and others, 126; number of different men teachers employed during the year, 3; number of different women teachers, 6; number of teachers who have attended a teacher's institute, 2. We would recommend a general attendance of the teachers at the county institutes.

Constant attendance of all the pupils is desirable and essential in order to attain thorough and systematic training.

We would especially urge parents to visit the schools each term. All may justly feel an interest and indeed a sacred trust in our institutions, so wisely founded by our forefathers, that have to do with the character of citizenship.
