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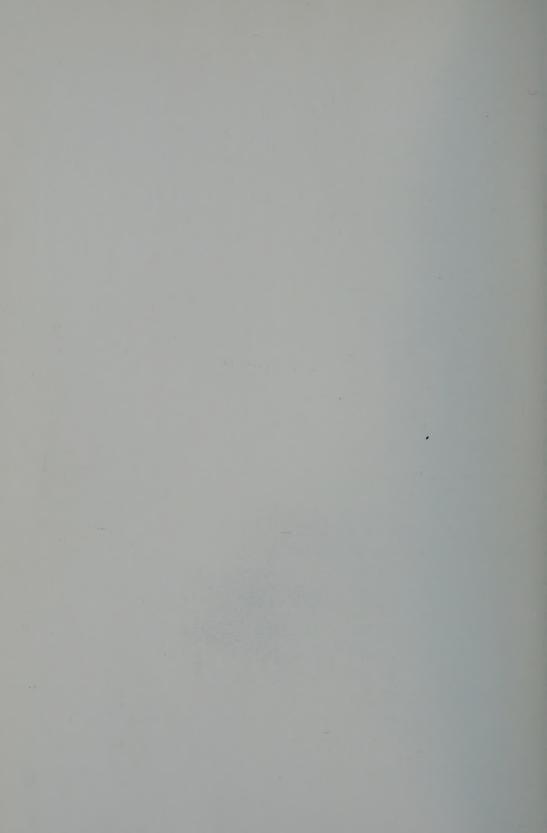

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Newbury, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Newbury on Tuesday the 13th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defrav town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Art. 3. To hear Reports of Town Officers, Agents and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 5. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to disposing of property acquired by tax deed.

Art. 6. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to raising and appropriating the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages of the Town, together with the other Towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee area.

PLOWING DRIVEWAYS

At the present time we are plowing an average of 160 driveways and parking lots each storm and the number is increasing yearly. This is a job which consumes as much time and expense as plowing the roads in town of which we have to keep approximately forty miles open.

I am making this information known through this means so that you, the taxpayers, will know what we are up against and that at all times we are doing our best to get everyone out as soon as possible. Also so that you will realize why it is impossible to do a finished job at every place the first time around.

I would also like to make it known that some of you could make our job much easier and enable us to do a better job for you if you would improve your drives by removing stones which we cannot see under snow and which do costly damage to equipment, also remove trees and stumps where possible so that we many have some place to put the snow. Another thing is to have some room to turn equipment around at the end of long drives as there are some in which we cannot turn now.

If you have obstructions which cannot be moved or seen under snow please mark them with a stake of some kind at least six feet tall.

One other thing I would like to mention is that when you want drives opened up that have not been right along give us a week's advance notice if possible so that we may save extra trips.

I hope this information will be of help to you, the taxpayers, as well as the Highway Department.

PREVENTING FOREST FIRES-IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2,200 acres burned. Residents, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules.

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.

2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.

3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.

4. Have something to keep the fire under control — pails

of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.

5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.

6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

DARTMOUTH-LAKE SUNAPEE REGION ASSOCIATION

RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES

January 1. 1962 to March 1, 1963

The financial statement of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association for the period January 1, 1962 to March 1, 1963 shows that a very large percentage of the moneys received are used to publicize the region. The Region name will have appeared on 1,000,000 pieces of publicity during this period. The actual funds used in the development work and daily operation of the region office seem small but much of the selecting and bringing to fruition of our projects is the time of the executive secretary and that of many region officials — the later pay their own expenses.

Receipts from towns totalled \$3,400; membership \$612; and state \$5,500; Total: \$9,512.

Expenditures were as follows: executive salary \$3,475. \$2,000 of this may be realistically allocated to "publicity" and the remainder to development work and operation of regular region functions. \$1,833 covered the cost of postage, clerical help, telephone, treasurer and 4-H club prizes plus executive expenses for travel and keep. \$908 of this may be considered as part of the publicity budget.

Direct expenditures for printed publicity material and advertising totals \$4,035. If we add the portion of office and operating expenses allocated to publicity above (\$908) and the part of the executive secretary's salary used for publicity (\$2,000), we find that the overall expenditures for the publicity program amounts to \$6,943.

Total expenditures are \$9,343 (\$4,035 for direct publicity material, \$3,475 for executive salary, \$1,833 for all other outlays) and receipts \$9,512. The individual outlays of the "publicity" program approximates 35 individual items. Major items include "Where-to-Live" (accomodations for vacationists), "Where-to-Play" (lists of our state parks, where to swim, historical sites, auctions, picnic areas, shopping centers, etc.), 200,000 return cards in the New Hampshire Vacation Guide and picture booklet, advertisements in Lake Sunapee Board of Trade Booklet, in Boatorama magazine, Newport Winter Carnival Booklet, printing and distribution of Covered Bridge folders and napkins, Autumn Ablaze folders and signs, base maps, general place mats, ski place mats, sugar envelopes with DLSR name, the DART-SUN news, newspaper ads and news stories for region and out-of-state consumption.

All these figures spell low cost publicity and development costs for each of the 36 towns and 2 cities who invest from \$15 to \$800 each for this varied and productive program. Demand for our services from local businesses and from our out-of-state customers far exceeds our supply of materials. Every increase in investment in the region association work will be used to supply this increasing demand without a major increase of region association operation. Can you think of a better investment?

The meeting was opened by the moderator, Randolph H. Milligan who explained the procedure. He stated that Sugar Hill had just been made the 240th Town and that out of this number the Town of Newbury was the 3rd to hold Courtesy meetings, out of which many good things had come.

Art. 1. Could signs be installed at the beginning of Bay Point Road near the Sunapee State Beach. Signs have been put there for cars coming down the hill, but it is necessary to have signs put up for those going up the hill as the speed of some cars is excessive and there are many children in the four homes at this point of the road. Signs suggested — Slow-Down and Children Ahead.

Patrick Volpe

Mr. Volpe stated that the signs going up would be for the interest of the children concerned.

Action — Chief Jones stated that signs were ordered and would be put up.

Art. 2. What can be done to control the speed limit of automobiles on Bowles Road?

S. A. DeVeau

- Action Chief Jones stated that there are 72 miles of road to be partolled and that the speed limit on this particular road should be brought down from 35 miles per hr. to 25 miles per hr. and that signs Children and Slow should be put up and that he would see what could be done.
- Art. 3. Proposed that the Town of Newbury sponsor a Red Cross swimming program for children. That the Town of Newbury arrange with the Town of Sunapee or New Lon-

don to participate in their program at the same cost as residents of these Towns enjoy.

Action — The moderator read Article #13 in Town Warrant under year of 1959, when \$500.00 was appropriated for recreational purposes. The Town of Newbury had such a program but it was noted that very few attended.

Art. 4. Request that rubbish be controlled at the public dock by provisions of litter barrels and periodic emptying of them.

Action — Mr. Rich stated that 9/10ths of the rubbish was dumped by summer people on the way home, so that barrels were not put back.

Mr. Roche stated that he thought the Selectmen should take a part in this and see that they were emptied, and think it would be well worth it.

Art. 5. There were many questions on the same subject— Blodgett's Landing Sewer Project, which the Moderator read as follows:

How is the cost of maintenance of the Blodgetts' Landing Sewer Project to be financed?

Would you tell the people just what the cost per family will be to tie on the sewer at Blodgetts'.

Mrs. James Kelly

Why should a lone widow who is up here only 4 weeks in the year be taxed \$2,520.00 for sewerage she didn't need? I am too far back from the lake to need the sewer. Mrs. Herbert S. Mould

Legally how far back from the Lake Shore is sewerage required i.e., if a cottage owner is beyond the legal limit could he not reconnect to his former sewer system? Since all taxpayers pay for convenience of the Town, even tho they do not directly benefit (schools, etc.) should not all taxpayers share the burden of the sewer tax as voted by their representation?

A. L. Connear

Is a person obliged to connect to the sewer? I do not want them to cut down my trees.

Mrs. G. W. Turney

We would like to know what the plans are to extend the sewer to the Bowles Road Beach?

S. J. De Veau

I move than an Article be included in the warrant of the Town Meeting 1963, that the Town of Newbury pay the capital charges of the sewer system at Blodgetts' Landing by general taxation.

Helen C. Kitchin

Moderator — read Article #20 from the Town Warrant of 1957.

Mr. Emerson presented a petition to the Moderator which in turn was turned over to the Town Clerk for recording and filing.

Reads as follows:

We, the undersigned, being property owners and taxpayers in the Town of Newbury and also users or prospective users of the sewer system at Blodgetts' Landing, Newbury, do hereby protest the method of assessment to pay for this project which has been used to date by the said Town of Newbury.

The great majority of us, being summer residents, had no voice or vote in the decision of the Town of Newbury in 1960 to require the entire payment for the said sewer system to be borne by the 93 users of this system. We feel this to be taxation without representation. Furthermore, the amounts of the annual individual sewer assessments, not only in the present but in the future, are and will be so large that they amount to confiscatory taxes.

We, therefore, respectfully petition the Town of Newbury to change the present method of assessment for payment of the aforesaid sewer system to the method of equal taxation on all the taxable property in the said Town of Newbury.

One hundred and eleven signatures attached thereto.

A lengthy discussion was then held after which Mr. Leonard made a motion that a Courtesy meeting be held the second Saturday in August 1963 at 8 P.M. This was seconded and so voted.

Meeting adjourned at 9:40 P.M.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The teaching staff in Newbury remains the same as last year with Mrs. Gretel Cole in the upper grade room and Mrs. Grace Tucker in the lower grade room. Blanche Bailey continues to provide a fine music program for our children; Ruth Whitcomb still has the health program and takes care of emergencies; Edith Eaton still prepares her excellent meals and Milford Newell takes care of the school building. A teacher from the Rinehart Writing System, Mr. Robertson, visits once a month to instruct the pupils in handwriting, reviews the previous lesson and assigns a new one. He has remarked about the fine progress of the children and the good cooperation he is getting from the teachers. Unfortunately Mrs. Laganas was not able to return to do the art work, but we are hoping to get some one to replace her.

Bradford has instituted a physical education program to go along with their ski program. Mrs. Margaret Bacon of Bradford is a qualified physical education teacher and Newbury might well consider adding this to their program of studies.

The 1961 State Legislature set up an Interim Commission to study Education in the State of New Hampshire. Their preliminary report has just come out, and a final report is expected in January 1963. I don't know what the final report will be, but they are recommending very sweeping changes which will affect all the small communities in the state if the Legislature in 1963 adopts legislation to carry it into affect. I hope that I will be able to give you substantial information about the proprosals by the time of the school district meeting. How far the Legislature will go is a matter of conjecture.

I enjoy visiting the Newbury school. We have a fine group of children and they deserve nothing but the best.
