

Chester E. Merrow

Dedication

Born in Center Ossipee in 1906, Chester E. Merrow served his town, state and nation with distinction for many years. He died February 11, 1974. It is with a sense of real appreciation that this report on the affairs of the community he loved and served so well is dedicated to his memory.

The son of Llewellyn and Florence Nichols Merrow, young Chester worked his way through school graduating from Brewster Academy in 1925 and in 1929 from Colby College, Me. He received a Master's

degree from Columbia University in 1937.

From 1929 to 1938 he served as an instructor, headmaster and dean of secondary schools and colleges in Vermont.

In 1933 he married Nellie Margaret Sands of Albion, N. Y. and the couple had one son, Daniel S. Merrow.

His public career began in 1938, following his return to Ossipee. He was elected to the N. H. State Legislature serving as Chairman of the House Ways and Means Committee and as a member of the Committee on Banks.

In 1942, Mr. Merrow was elected to Congress and served on the House Foreign Affairs Committee for 18 years. He travelled extensively during those years and in 1945 was a delegate to the United Nations International Conference on Education and Cultural Relations as well as several other United Nations commissions. He also served as a congressional advisor to the State Department and the Treasury Department.

Following his years in Congress's he worked for the State Department and completed his book "My

Twenty Years in Congress."

Active in local affairs, Mr. Merrow was also a Trustee of Brewster Academy in Wolfeboro, a member of numerous fraternal and social organizations, and active in the affairs of the Moultonville Church.

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Ossipee qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Center Ossipee, in said Town of Ossipee on the first Tuesday of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon of said day to act on the following articles, the polls to remain open until six o'clock in the afternoon of said day.

Article 1. To choose a selectman for three years, library trustee for three years, cemetery trustee for three years, town clerk, treasurer, tax collector and two auditors for one year and all other officers and agents required by law to be elected or nominated at the annual meeting.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to alter the hours during which the polls shall remain open.

Article 3. To set maximum height of new construction for fire protection purposes, height not to exceed twenty-eight (28) feet from lowest ground elevation to highest window sill.

Article 4. To set a minimum size of residential lots, said lots to be one acre per single family unit and have a minimum road frontage, river frontage or lake frontage of two hundred (200) feet.

Article 5. To establish a Building Code for Special Flood Hazard Areas to read as follows:

No person, firm or corporation shall erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, improve, move or demolish any building or structure in any area designated as a special flood hazard area by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development without first applying for and obtaining a separate building permit for each building or structure from the Selectmen.

The Selectmen shall review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a location that has a special flood hazard, any proposed new construction or substantial im-

provement (including prefabricated and mobile homes) must (1) be designed (or modified) and anchored to prevent floatation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure, (2) use construction materials and utility equipment that are resistant to flood damage, and (3) use construction methods and practices that will minimize flood damage.

A building permit shall be issued by the Selectmen only upon their being satisfied that the foregoing three (3) conditions shall be met by the person, firm or corporation making any such new construction or substantial improvement.

You are also notified to meet at the Town Hall on the first Tuesday of March, next, at seven thirty o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following articles.

Article 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any property taken by tax title or otherwise.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the ensuing year the following sums of money for the following purposes:

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 for Winter Highways and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw that sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972. This sum to be deducted from the Line Item Budget (Article No. 8 - Town Maintenance, Summer & Winter) if voted in the affirmative. (approved by Budget Committee)

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and expend the sum of \$36,630.00 for the purpose of the preparation of a Tax Map of the Town and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow said sum on long term notes or temporary loans and to repay the same over a four year period by withdrawals from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, if available, or otherwise. (approved by Budget Committee)

Article 11. In the event that the vote on Article 10 is in the affirmative, to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$9,157.50 from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for the purpose of making the first payment on the Tax Map. (approved by Budget Committee)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for construction of a new Town Records Vault and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw that sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972. (approved by Budget Committee)

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 for the purchase of two (2) highway power sanders and to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw that sum from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972. (approved by Budget Committee)

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow and expend a sum not to exceed \$58,667.00 (Town Share) for the purpose of reconstruction of the Mill Pond Bridge (No. 145 / 236) on Moultonville Road. This sum to be repaid by means of long term notes. (approved by Budget Committee)

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 (\$1.00 per capita) to fund in whole or in part, a "Meals On Wheels" program for the aging and the administration thereof, pursuant to RSA 1670a:10. (approved by Budget Committee) (Inserted by Petition)

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to spply for, contract for, and accept grants of Federal or State aid, or both, as may become available and to do all things necessary to carry out the purpose of these grants.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept Remle Road, Leavitt Bay, Center Ossipee, as part of the Town road system.

Article 18. Resolution. WHEREAS, there continues to exist within the state a serious shortage of safe and sanitary dwelling accommodations at rents which elderly and low income persons can afford, and that such persons are forced to occupy substandard dwelling accommodations; and

WHEREAS, the General Court of the State of New Hampshire has enacted Chapter 204-A of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated establishing the New Hampshire Housing Commission; and

WHEREAS, Section 9 of that Act provides that in a municipality where there is no local housing authority operating, the Commission shall not operate without the consent of the governing body of a municipality; and WHEREAS, said Section 9 provides that consent of the governing body must be given for each project, and

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Section 8 of the U. S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended, the United States of America acting through the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, is authorized to enter into annual contributions contracts with public housing agencies pursuant to which such agencies may enter into contracts to make assistance payments to owners;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Meeting of the Town of Ossipee, County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire, that the New Hampshire Housing Commission be and is authorized to operate in said Town of Ossipee, County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire; That said New Hampshire Housing Commission is authorized to sponsor a project, under Section 8 of the U. S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended, for any of the following dwelling accommodations or a combination thereof: (a) existing standard housing; (b) rehabilitated housing; (c) newly constructed housing; the total amount of the foregoing not to exceed 25 dwelling units.

Article 19. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.

Article 20. Resolution. WHEREAS, certain areas of the Town of Ossipee are subject to periodic flooding from STREAMS, RIVERS, LAKES, ETC., causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the form of Federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Town Meeting to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards; and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to N.H. RSA Chapters 31, 36, 156, and 156 A,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Meeting hereby:

- 1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it intends to enact and maintain in force for those areas having defined flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and
- 2. Vests the Planning Board with the responsibility, authority, and means to:
- (a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood hazards on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites.
- (b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain.
- (c) Cooperate with Federal, State and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
- (d) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligbility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of flood plain management measurer.
- 3. Appoints the Selectmen to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request a record of elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures located in the special flood hazard areas. If the lowest floor is below grade on one or more sides, the elevation of the floor immediately above must also be recorded.
- 4. Intends to take such other official action within its powers as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.

Article 21. RESOLUTION. WHEREAS, the Town of Ossipee has adopted and is enforcing a Town Building Code Ordinance for Flood Hazard Areas, and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance prohibits any person, firm or corporation from erecting, constructing, enlarging, altering, repairing, improving, moving or demolishing any building or structure without first obtaining a separate building permit for each building or structure from the Selectmen, and

WHEREAS, the Selectmen must examine all plans and specifications for the proposed construction when application is made to them for a building permit.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town

Meeting of Ossipee, as follows:

- 1. The Town Meeting recommends that the Planning Board amend their regulations pertaining to the flood hazard area to assure that (1) all proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage, (2) all public utilities and facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems are located, elevated, and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage, and (3) adequate drainage is provided so as to reduce exposure to flood hazards; and
- 2. The Town Meeting recommends that the Planning Board amend their regulations pertaining to the flood hazard area to require new or replacement water supply systems and / or sanitary sewage systems to be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters, and require on-site waste disposal systems to be located so as to avoid impairment of them or contamination from them during flooding, pursuant to N. H. RSA 36:21.

Article 22. To transact such other business as may legally come before the Town Meeting. Given under our hands and seals this 15th day of February,

REPORT OF THE OSSIPEE DISTRICT COURT (for the year of 1974)

The workload of the Court continues to increase, with 1526 cases being filed in 1974. The change in the law regarding civil jurisdiction and the economic recession have had their effect, with 308 civil actions filed, 276 of them being Small Claim collections.

While the Court is not a business and shouldn't be expected to show a profit, it is true that the Town has benefitted economically from the Court's existence. The Court's reduction in receipts of some \$3,000. was somewhat offset by the \$1,900. saved due to the Governor's failure to fill the vacancy in the Special Justice's office. The questions of whether the Court should be adding to the Town's revenues and should a Special Justice be appointed to strengthen its ability to serve the District may soon be answered by the present Legislature.

Pending before the N.H. General Court is a bill to abolish part-time justices, along with the Ossipee District Court. Should this be enacted into law, Ossipee would be without a District Court. All cases arising in the District, which includes Ossipee, Wakefield, Effingham, Freedom and Tamworth, would be brought before the Carroll County District Court sitting either in Wolfeboro or Conway. The Town of Ossipee would pay no expenses for the

operation of the Court nor would it receive any share of its

revenues.

As long as the Ossippe District Court continues, it abides as a public forum wherein the people of the 5 towns it serves may seek redress of their grievances and the State, in the name of the people, can prosecute those violating the laws within its confines. Whether its continuances is warranted is in the hands of the members of the Legislature representing these towns and their colleagues voting in Concord.

REPORT OF OSSIPEE POLICE DEPT. 1974

I would like to express my sincere thanks to the Board of Selectmen, Department Heads, other Town Employees and the Citizens for their support and cooperation during the past year.

Again this year our traffic program proved its worth in that we had no fatal Motor Vehicle accidents and for the most part minor injuries.

The Summer Cadet Program worked well with the town using two Cadets for a total of 800 hours at a cost of only \$86.00. The Cadets job covers all phases of Police work, except carrying fire arms and making arrests.

The case of double Homicide is by far the toughest case of the year, with the States Attorney General heading the investigation along with County Attorneys office, State Police, Sheriff Dept., Ossipee Police, and many other agencies. At one point in the investigation up to fifty people were working on the same day. The case is now 5 months old and is still being worked on, on a daily basis. The Cadets were very valuable. They were active in the investigation in many areas, such as paper work, phone answering, radio dispatching, and some of the field investigating. The Town saved much money.

In closing, let me say that it has been a pleasure to serve you, the people of Ossipee for the past year.

Since its conception in January of 1971, the Ossipee Recreation Department has rapidly progressed with the addition of programs influencing a large majority of the towns population.

Girls' Basketball, weight lifting program, public ice skating rink, guitar instruction, gymnastics with trampoline, (trampoline loaned by the Bradleys of Bradley's Landing), Girls and boys fourth, fifth, and sixth grade after school recreation, Adult Recreation, Open Recreation for Youth (table hockey, table tennis, volleyball, badminton, wrestling, basketball, trampoline, weight lifting, floor hockey, juke box, yatzee, monopoly, cards, chess, checkers), summer and in school employees (Tri-County-C.A.P.), sponsor of Carnival Queen Contestant, tutoring High School Equivalency participants in cooperation with the High School Equivalency Program.

The town has been fortunate in acquiring federal funds for an Assistant Recreation position filled by University of Maine graduate, Wesley Shattuck. Mr. Shattuck's versatility has increased the departments output since his acceptance of the position last December.

The Recreation Department takes this opportunity to extend appreciation to the citizens of the Town of Ossipee for their support of the Recreation Program - the sponsors, the coaches, volunteers, and participants who create, by their interest in the community the successfulness of the

program.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

REPORT TO OSSIPEE

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.
