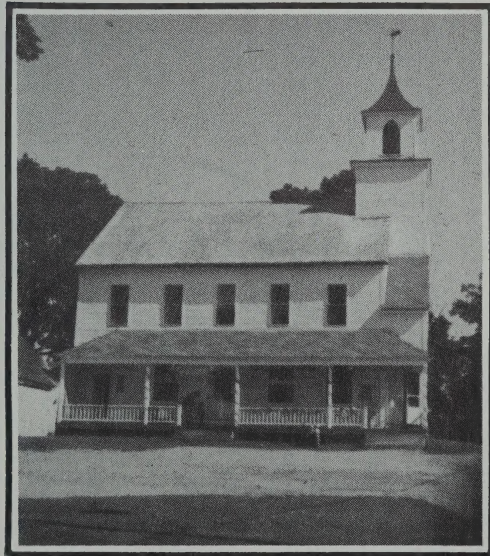

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SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The 1979 Annual Town Report brings to an end the 70's -- a decade of much change. Even in such a small community as Surry we have experienced the onrush of change. Most dynamic in recent years is our period of incorporation with Monadnock Regional School. In 1979 Surry participated in a feasibility study, checking the soundness of continued connection with Monadnock District. Our tax rate's largest portion goes to schools (approximately \$199,000 this year) and this rate increases each year. The Feasibility Study is not complete as of this report, but our connection to it has shown these things: we would face some costly years starting our own school administration while paying tuition to Keene; a bond issue is going to be forthcoming pushing our tax rate higher; the education within MRHS is comparable to KHS and surrounding schools; our enrollment figures will make no major change in the crowding. We must show more involvement with who governs the budgeting and decisions of that school district, if our taxes are ever to show a downward trend in school figures.

Good news from the Board of Selectmen in the trend of downward Town Tax Rate. For the second year, 1980 will definitely show lower Town rate. We have also shown a surplus in our budget this year and erased the previous deficit and its problems. Our goals are to make our government procedures more efficient yet.

The Board, to further save through the highway department, urges favorable consideration of articles 5 & 6 on this year's warrant. The truck in mention would be paid for minimally by taxation, as indicated, by use of Revenue Sharing Funds. The combination truck, tractor would provide access at all times to road equipment in town. We would have two salaried men (one full, one part-time) who would be constantly on project work by the Road Committee. We feel that in the future, when initial establishment costs of a road department are paid, that the rental figures, contractor's rising pay scales and rates that have always boosted that ever talked about Highway Maintenance figure, can be reduced by use of our own equipment. The goals to improve these Surry roads are constantly talked of at all meetings. We feel this would be a major advance that way.

The Road Committee needs to be commended this year. They were drafted and have worked very hard at establishing criteria, goals and guidelines for maintaining and upgrading the quality of Surry Roads. They have made some recommendations for Mine Ledge Road, which will be brought forth at Town Meeting under article 7, by request last year at the Meeting. The money for these and other projects are all within the budget figures of maintenance or subsidy.

Concerning the Articles of Social Security, we have placed them here for consideration due to the salary payments for full time employees and the suggestion of an IRS representative.

The budget shows some rises; Town Hall and other buildings due to repairs long awaited, and the increased electric and fuel costs. The Salaries for Town Officers increase reflects a \$200 figure for a secretary for the selectmen who may aid the tax collector as well in clerical needs; a bookkeeper will be instituted also, under existing expenses for town officers. Those figures failed to stay within budget figures last year, largely due to rising paper and printing costs. The Police Department is up due to the Federal Government Patrol contract not being reinstated as of our reports. NCHHA has merged to become Cheshire Home Health, it and Monadnock Family and Health are still asking low per capita figures for the benefits. The Recreation Department issue is relative to Old Home Committee changing its name under article 9. We support this, as there are matching funds and grants for a Recreation Department, and the purposes of the group can include Old Surry Day, but also expand to other town events. They have turned over to the town the monies they have raised toward purchase of tables and chairs for the town hall - through suppers etc. They are asking \$200 for shipping and an additional \$200 for the Town Meeting supper, which should draw revenue and return that \$200 figure plus. The figure looks large, but broken out it shows:

The soil maps have been ordered. We will receive 25 soil reports, 1 mylar mosaic soils map, 1 interpretive map and 10 extra mosaic. The cost will be \$550. Also 1 set of photo copies of the field soil survey sheets, scale 1" = 1000'. Contract price ...\$1,302.50.

As a goal of efficiency, when you receive your Inventory soon, please help the Board by completing it thoroughly and factually and returning it by April 15 (post marked) 1980. There is a \$10 penalty plus interest for any not postmarked April 15, 1980 and received later.

All exemptions were included in the figures in the Town Report but by privacy law not written out. All exemptions are based on filing at the Selectmen's Office. Once you've filed a permanent card for veteran or old age, you are eligible to fill in your inventory for the exemptions. No card -No exemption. Someday we hope to see Expanded Elderly adopted.

Current Use requires 10 acres contiguous and an application at the office that is accepted. That application will have maps, information and data for decision of eligibility. Once accepted you may renew on the inventory.

Please fill in the names and ages accurately of everyone resident in your home so our census information is complete.

All taxation is relative to April 1, 1980 -- if you own or have a structure or land as of this date in Surry, YOU are responsible for that tax bill of 1980. If sold, YOU must get the bill to appropriate owner or YOU will be up for TAX SALE, not they.

The South Western New Hampshire Regional Commission presented our town with a historical survey this year. Surry homes, landmarks, geologic interests etc. were done by street survey and the book is quite inclusive of homes and descriptions. Taken by "sidewalk survey" the survey needs many more details for all houses and landmarks or historic sites. The selectmen want interested people to further this grand start of continuing the Surry History. Anyone interested please contact them to form a working group.

Our goal for the year 1980 and on include lower taxes on the town and schools, level through monitoring spending of our budgets. Through wiser use of tax dollars we want more service for the town in roads and aids. Communication among the boards of the town can provide better unity in Town Growth. Involvement of the new and current citizenry can insure the spirit and character of cooperation, so strong in Surry, continues to make us all feel glad we live here.

This report is new. But we hope in future years it will make a bridge between town government and you, for we can feel that we're working together, as it should be.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the town of Surry, in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Surry on Tuesday, the eleventh (11th) day of March, 1980, at 2:00 P. M. in the afternoon to act upon the following:

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 2:00 TO 7:00 P. M.

ON MARCH 11, 1980 TO CHOOSE THE TOWN OFFICERS AS LISTED ON THE OFFICIAL BALLOT: ON THURSDAY, MARCH 13, 1980 FOR THE BUSINESS MEETING AT THE TOWN HALL AT 7:30 P. M., TO ACT ON THE FOLLOWING ARTICLES OR IN RELATION THERETO.

1. To hear the reports of the Town Officers and Committees.
2. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
3. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds that have been received by the Town during the past year.
4. To see if the Town will designate a cemetery lot in the Village Cemetery for a Memorial Plot.
5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate eighty-five hundred dollars (\$8,500.) for a 1976 International Dump Truck with Plow and Wing, and authorize the withdrawal of five thousand fifty-seven dollars and seventy-eight cents (\$5,057.78) for this purpose, from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the balance to be raised by taxation.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,500 for the purchase of a tractor equipped with loader. To authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue and sell bonds or notes in the name of and on the credit of the Town, under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, Chapter 33 RSA, and to delegate the Board of Selectmen authority to fix the time and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interest of the Town of Surry, or take any action in relation thereto.
7. To ask the Town to take action upon a plan submitted by the Selectmen and Road Committee on improvements to the Mine Ledge Road.
8. To see if the Town will vote to have the Board of Selectmen appoint members of the Board of Adjustment to conform with RSA 31:66 of the State, commencing 1981.

9. To see if the Town will vote to change "Old Home Day Committee" title within the town to "Surry Recreation Department" and that the third Saturday in August be established as the annual "Community Day".

10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget for the Calendar Year of 1980.

11. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of Title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age, Survivors, Disability and Health Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated amended by Chapter 302 and 322 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of sixteen hundred dollars (\$1,600.) to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.

12. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions filled by popular election.

13. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is a fee basis.

14. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services performed by election officials or election workers for a calendar year in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$100.00.

15. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a Dog Control Ordinance on ballot.

17. To take up any other business brought legally before said meeting.

ROAD COMMITTEE REPORT

The Surry Road Committee was appointed by the Board of Selectmen on April 10, 1979 to oversee the maintenance of the roads of the town and the expenditures of town funds for such maintenance. During this period the committee was responsible for the expenditure of \$16,430.84 of town funds. The lack of town-owned equipment has compelled all work to be performed by contractors that have been hired by the town to do specific jobs. This method has allowed only minimum amounts of work to be done at maximum costs to the town.

The Road Committee goal is to operate with a sound fiscal policy and provide the town with maximum service at minimum costs. This will be done by planning and supervising on a yearly basis, and to plan and anticipate needs on a multiyear projection.

The Road Committee recommends the town purchase the following items:

1. A truck suitable for both summer and winter maintenance including snow plowing.
2. A loader/backhoe to be used for town work.

The purchase of this equipment will enable the town to maintain its roads on a year-round basis and at a higher level of efficiency with better use of town funds than has been possible in past years.

Upon recommendation of the Road Committee and approval of the Selectmen, two employees, one full-time and one part-time, were temporarily hired on a salaried basis to man the rental truck. If the truck is purchased, we recommend continuing their employment.

Work Carried Out During 1979

Dam Road - Replaced posts and cables.

East Surry Road - Pot holes patched.

Hallwood Drive - Graded and leveled.

Joslin Road - Graded and leveled, gravel placed, culverts installed and replaced, pot holes patched, road surface repaired.

Malcolm Drive - Graded and leveled.

Mine Ledge Road - Graded and leveled, gravel placed, culverts installed.

Old Walpole Road - Pot holes patched, blasting and road widening.

Pond Road - Culverts replaced, pot holes patched, graded and leveled.

Webster Road - Graded and leveled, culverts installed.

All roads were maintained as needed by cutting brush, cleaning out culverts, cleaning and opening ditches, plowing and sanding.

The Fire Engineers would like to report that the number of fires has decreased from the previous year. We are pleased and hope this trend continues. We would like to remind people that with the energy crunch and many switching to alternative means of heating their homes, such as wood stoves, that the installation of these require a few basic rules. Rules for clearances and operations may be obtained from any Fire Engineer. Any other questions that concern fire safety, wood stoves, chimneys, smoke detectors, etc., can be directed to the Fire Engineers. We would also like to remind people that if they suspect a fire or other emergency to call Fire Mutual Aid immediately. The telephone number is 352-1100 and this is the only number you should call for an emergency.

REPORT ON EQUIPMENT

Our 30-M1 unit has now been put into full service with a 300 gallon per minute front mount pump. With this pump we can relay water from the 1,000 gallon tank on the truck, draft water from a stream or pond, fill the tank and/or supply other lines. This truck was donated by the State of New Hampshire. It has been built by members of the Surry Volunteer Fire Department at no cost to the town.

The 30-M2 unit, our new 4-wheel drive, has proven to be a valuable and reliable piece of equipment. This unit has the capability of getting off the road and into the hard-to-get-at spots and supply water to our attack truck or other tankers.

The 30-M3 unit, our main attack unit, purchased in 1968. It is in excellent shape. We recently made repairs on the brake system and other minor repairs.

REPORT ON BUILDING

During the past year a new roof was put on the old section of the building, as this was badly needed. All of the old large glass steel-framed windows were replaced with glass blocks. The stairway was enclosed and insulation was added. New fluorescent lights were added in the downstairs of the station. We hope that these changes will help conserve fuel and energy.

REPORT ON TRAINING

During the past year we have had several training exercises. A training session has been planned and held each month at our monthly meeting. Throughout the year we have also had several non-scheduled training exercises.

In addition to our own training programs, several of the Department's members enrolled in the Annual Spring Fire School which was held at Meadowwood. This is a very good school and offers several courses. In September, the Fire Chiefs Club offers a Fall Fire School. This is a good course and several of our members attended.

Two CPR courses were held in the past year. This allowed many of the new members to be certified and for the others to be re-certified.

GOALS

In the insuing year, the Fire Engineers hope to accomplish several goals in the department. One goal is the squad system. In the squad system, the members are divided between three squad leaders who are the Lieutenants. This allows each Lieutenant to work with his group; this aids greatly in training. We also hope to add three additional dry hydrants in the town. These would be located in areas where water is hard to get.

Our base station radio is now in bad need of replacement and this being a required item, we hope that it can be replaced with a new transistorized unit, which would save considerably on electricity.

Finally, more training programs and general all around training will be carried out.

In closing, the Fire Engineers would like to thank the people of Surry and especially the members of the Surry Volunteer Fire Department for their loyal support during the past year.

MONADNOCK FAMILY AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE REPORT

Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service requests your support for continuation of our outpatient psychiatric services. During the past three years, the agency has been gradually expanding its services in outlying areas and has been able to offer increasing services to special groups, such as the elderly and children. This makes it increasingly important that we maintain support from all local sources. We hope that your support will continue.

As we are aware that local towns face similar budgeting problems, we are not increasing our request for support. For the sixth year we are using the formula of 50¢ per capita based on population figures from the Southwestern Regional Planning Commission. For the town of Surry the amount is \$275.00.

The allocation from the towns in the Keene area are used directly to support the Outpatient Program. This program is the basic service which provides individual, marital, family and group treatment service. Last year our Outpatient Program served over 1,172 adults.

While the allocation from Surry supports the Outpatient Program, many other services are available to you as residents. They include 24-hour emergency service, a day treatment and inpatient service provided in cooperation with Cheshire Hospital, specialized services to the elderly, youth, patients returning from long term hospitalization, and consultation and education services. These services are primarily supported with state and federal support which, combined with local support and fees make it possible for the agency to provide comprehensive mental health services in this area.

**NORTH CHESHIRE COUNTY HOME HEALTH SERVICE
REPORT FOR YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1979**

Dear Friends:

Since September 1969 the North Cheshire County Home Health Service has been providing visiting nurse and other home health services to our area towns. In the last fiscal year the nurses made 643 visits, the Physical therapist made 133 visits, and the Homemaker/Home Health Aides made 290 visits to make a total of 1,066 visits to people in their homes.

This is the year for change for our Agency. The Board of Directors felt that considering all the Federal regulations for Medicare certification that it is no longer practical to try to maintain the small part-time agency. Negotiations began last Spring with Cheshire Senior Services and Marlborough Community Nursing Association to effect a merger of the three agencies into one Medicare certified agency. It is expected that final merger will take place this month when the new Agency, Cheshire Health and Social Services will receive their notification of Medicare certification.

The office in Gilsun Legion building will continue the same. You may call the nurse at 357-0969 from 9 to 10 a. m. or call the Cheshire Health & Social Services office, 93 Roxbury Street, Keene, N. H., at 352-2253 - 8:00 a. m. to 4:30 p. m. Mrs Edith Hasbrouck, R.N. and Mrs. Sandra Gourley, R.N. will continue to serve as visiting nurses. A new Physical Therapist, Mrs. Christine Kopec, R. P. T., is contracting for that service.

We are also in the planning process with the Keene Visiting Nurse Association and other agencies to develop an area-wide comprehensive Child Health Program. It is hoped that this will begin next Spring. We plan to continue our present well child program until then. Due to discontinuation of State funding our preschool Dental Health Program had to be discontinued.

As a result of these changes we have not conducted our annual membership drive. It is expected that Cheshire Health and Social Services will have a membership drive in the new year. We are grateful for the support of so many of you for the past ten years and we hope that you will continue your support to the new agency.

We are also asking that the same town appropriations usually requested for North Cheshire County Home Health Service, \$1 per capita, be appropriated to Cheshire Health and Social Services, where it will be used exclusively for Cheshire Home Health Services.

We firmly believe that the merger into a larger agency will provide the people of our area with better more efficient and comprehensive home care services.
