

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD,

OF WARREN FOR YEAR ENDING AUGUST, 1896.

Eight schools have been maintained, the village grammar and primary having three terms of ten weeks each. The other six, Clough, East Warren, Swain Hill, Summit, Ore Hill and Foote's, each two terms of ten weeks.

These schools have been well managed by faithful and competent teachers; wise and efficient discipline, and thorough methods of instruction have been manifested in all.

Of the twelve different persons employed as teachers during some part of the year, all females, eight are residents of this town, graduates of our town schools. Three of these taught for the first time in 1895, two others in 1896. The notice of the school board has been called to no case of insubordination during the year.

Branches of Study. As usual, arithmetic receives its full share of attention, rather more than its due, perhaps. Grammar and geography are pretty thoroughly studied. Spelling and penmanship above

the average of former years, while to history decidedly more time and attention should be given.

But reading is the one branch in all our schools in which there is the loudest call for improvement. Methods of recitation in reading demand the careful attention of teachers. As a rule, the work of the older classes in this branch, is less satisfactory than that of the primary grades.

Whole number scholars five years of age and upwards, attending school not less than two weeks during the year, 127.

Whole number of any age attending one-half day or more during the year, 135

Average attendance during the year, 96.

Number between 5 and 16 not attending school, 8. Four of these are furnished with books by the school board and study at home.

Length of all schools in weeks, 182. Average wages of teachers per month, \$24.37.
