

DISTRICT, No. 6. The spring term as taught by Miss Minnie R. Anderson, I should pronounce as successful. The winter term is in charge of Miss Kilgore. The school commenced well.

DISTRICT, No. 8. There was but one term in this district and that during the winter. Miss Fannie L. Eastman teaches here. The school is very small indeed. The teacher I judge to be competent.

In reviewing the school year just past, I find little change from last year. There seems to be a great lack of interest, and irregularity of attendance is a bad feature of the schools but more especially of the larger ones. This is very much to be deplored as the privileges are so limited. I would respectfully call the attention of parents, guardians and others to the law in regard to non-attendance. It can be found by reference to the General Laws or to the School Notices posted throughout the town. There is a sad lack of uniformity of text-books which ought to be remedied as soon as a chance can be made for the better. I also note a tendency to hire inexperienced teachers. This is a mistake. For we cannot afford to have our children taught *untrouths* or *fooled in government*.
