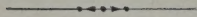

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

{ L. S. } *To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs:—*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers, for the ensuing year.

Third. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library and the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Eleventh. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of, "An act to provide for State Aid and for the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State," Approved February 24th, 1905, or act thereon.

Twelfth. To determine the division of the School money.

Thirteenth. To hear the report of the Auditors and the Town School Board.

Fourteenth. To see if the town will vote to elect a committee of three to act in conjunction with the Selectmen in making a general appraisal of all taxable property, or act thereon.

Fifteenth. To see if the town will vote to elect a Superintendent of Cemeteries, or act thereon.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will appropriate the sum of fifty dollars for the erection of two substantial markers, one on the spot where the first religious meetings were held in the town, and the other on the spot where the first meeting-house stood, or act thereon.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to construct a sewer on Clark Street this year, or act thereon.

Report of the Board of Health.

On March 29, 1907, the Board of Health was notified that a case of suspected small-pox existed in a tenement on Mechanic street in Lebanon. On investigation it proved to be a true case of the disease.

The tenement was immediately quarantined, together with several other tenements in the same block, and a guard was kept on duty night and day to see that no one entered or left any of the tenements. On March 31, two days later, the woman who had small-pox, her husband and two years' old child, and a young woman to care for the patient, were removed to an isolated hospital, improvised for the occasion, about two miles out of the village. Two days after their removal, April 2, the man came down with varioloid, and two days later still, April 4, the child came down with small-pox. None of these cases proved fatal. These four individuals were in quarantine 33 days, being liberated April 30. Twenty-two other persons were in quarantine 18 days, each, and two who had escaped the first ten days were each in quarantine 8 days.

The infection was brought to Lebanon from Wilder, Vt., by a man who knew that he had small-pox. Fortunately the disease was confined to the family in which it originated.

All the tenements that had been quarantined were thoroughly disinfected and the occupants were required to take an antiseptic bath before being liberated. The tenement where the disease occurred and the isolated hospital were each twice disinfected.

Aside from the small-pox, there were 28 cases of communicable diseases in town during the year 1907, as follows:

Measles, 3 cases, 1 in Lebanon, 2 in West Lebanon;

scarlet fever, 11 cases, all in Lebanon; diphtheria, 6 cases, 1 in Lebanon, 5 in West Lebanon and East Wilder; typhoid fever, 8 cases, 4 in Lebanon, 4 in West Lebanon.

In no case, after the disease was recognized, did it spread beyond the house in which it was discovered. None of the cases were fatal.

The sanitary condition of the town has been improved by the extension of the sewers to a number of places where the need was greatest, so now there is little excuse for the existence of surface drains or cess pools in town. This, with the installing of an efficient filter plant in Lebanon during the past year, ought to do much to increase the healthfulness of the town, especially if supplemented by the co-operation of each individual in keeping all places likely to breed disease in a cleanly and wholesome state.

It is no small task to collect the bills for the care of the large number that are mowed in the Village, Glenwood and Mt. Calvary Cemeteries with the lot owners scattered from Canada to California.
