

**TOWN MEETING WARRANT**

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 13th Day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all articles except Article 1 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon:

**Article 1.** To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

**Article 2.** To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

**Article 3.** To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges, the same being: Town Officers' Salaries and Expenses, Election-Registration Expenses, Expense of Town Hall and for other town buildings, and make appropriation for the same.

**Article 4.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the Police Department for the ensuing year.

**Article 5.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection for the ensuing year, including \$1,750.00 for the Sugar Hill Fire Department.

**Article 6.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Pine Blister Rust Control.

**Article 7.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for Insurance for the ensuing year.

**Article 8.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the protection of health including Health Officer's salary and expenses, and a sum of money to be equally divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.

**Article 9.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

**Article 10.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Vital Statistics for the ensuing year.

**Article 11.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of maintaining the Sugar Hill Dump. The Selectmen to administer and be in charge of the funds so raised.

**Article 12.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

**Article 13.** To see if the Town will vote to plow the Town roads, and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

**Article 14.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,000.00 to light the streets in the Town of Lisbon under the same conditions as they were heretofore lighted.

**Article 15.** To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to oil such roads in the Town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate \$7,000.00 for the same.

**Article 16.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how same shall be divided.

**Article 17.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Poor.

**Article 18.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

**Article 19.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

**Article 20.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the community Skating Rink.

**Article 21.** To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the cemeteries in the Town of Lisbon.

**Article 22.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$525.94 (being 7/1000ths of 1% of the Town's 1960 equalized valuation) for the purpose of uniting with the 45 other towns in the White Mountains Region Association in the cooperative development and promotion of the North Country's economy.

**Article 23.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 to defray the Town's share of the Federal Social Security Act.

**Article 24.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,400.00 for interest on short and long term notes.

**Article 25.** To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,161.32.

**Article 26.** To raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,673.75 for the payment on the bridge bonds, - comprising the interest which will be due August 1, 1962; and the bond payment of \$5,000.00 and the interest which will be due February 1, 1963.

**Article 27.** To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase a much needed tract of land bordering on the north and east side of the present Grove Hill Cemetery property, and containing approximately two and one half acres. Purchase price not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars.

**Article 28.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase for a sum not to exceed \$15,000.00, a fire truck which will be approved by the New Hampshire Board of Underwriters, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same. The money to be raised as follows:

The first year \$3,000.00 and issue serial notes for the balance. This series of notes due yearly in the amount of \$3,000.00 each year hereafter until the purchase price is paid, at such rate of interest as may be necessary.

This truck to be stationed at and used by the Sugar Hill Fire Department as the apparatus now in use at Sugar Hill does not meet the standards of the New Hampshire Board of Underwriters.

**Article 29.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to engage the State Tax Commission to revalue the Real Estate in the Town of Lisbon.

**Article 30.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Moderator to appoint a committee to plan for the proper observance of the 200th anniversary of the Town's Charter in 1963.

**Article 31.** To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of "AN ACT AUTHORIZING MUNICIPALITIES TO REQUIRE THE REPAIR, CLOSING OR DEMOLITION OF DWELLINGS UNFIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION AND TO ESTABLISH AND ENFORCE MINIMUM STANDARDS FOR USE AND OCCUPANCY OF DWELLINGS."

Chapter 48, New Hampshire Revised Statutes, Annotated, 1955, as amended by Chapter 293, Laws of New Hampshire, 1959.

**Article 32.** To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the road leading from Lovers Lane Road running in a southerly direction approximately 1/10 of a mile long. Beginning of road is up the hill from route 117 and before approaching the main house of Peckett's on Sugar Hill. This road was used years ago by the Phillips House, which is now a section of Peckett's on Sugar Hill.

**Article 33.** To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Do the things that are required of you -

1. Follow the warden's directions.
2. Secure the required burning permit.
3. Keep your fires under control.
4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

## PROGRAM OF THE WHITE MOUNTAINS REGION ASSOCIATION

The White Mountains Region Association as a voluntary non-profit organization, receives support from the communities of the Region, the state and from individual members so that a program of cooperative promotion and development of northern New Hampshire may be carried on.

The Association publishes and distributes six different folders a year advertising the many advantages of the Region. It receives and carefully answers about 6,000 letters per year from people interested in a vacation in the North Country. The value of this single service cannot be over-emphasized. Recent surveys have shown that the tourists attracted by this mailing service have spent many hundreds of thousands of dollars in the Region. The Association sponsors the annual fall foliage tours, and represents the Region at national travel shows.

Through its board of directors, it is able to speak for the Region's needs at state and national hearings and at important meetings within the Region. It maintains a news release service to local newspapers to help inform the citizens of the North Country of worth-while activities and economic trends.

This winter the Association is running a cooperative ad program with the chambers of commerce in the ski areas to promote skiing in the White Mountains. It cooperates with private promotional groups, local chambers of commerce, and with the state promotional agencies. It promotes the sale of real estate through the mailing of real-estate purchase bulletins to real estate brokers. It conducts labor surveys for groups interested in industrial development, maintains an award program for the 4-H Clubs, and promotes agriculture within the Region.

In uninterrupted service since 1938, it has helped establish the White Mountains Region as a vacation center as fine as any in the world and contributed in many other ways to the economic betterment of all forty-six communities in Northern New Hampshire.
