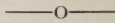

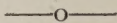

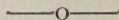

There has been no application to the town for aid from the overseer of poor for the year ending February 15, 1912.

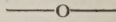
At the present time the town has no individual poor for which it is chargeable.

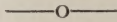

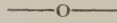

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the inhabitants of the town of Roxbury, in the  
County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote  
in Town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Roxbury on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1.—To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

2.—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3.—To choose a Delegate or Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

4.—To hear report of Selectmen or Officers hereto chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

5.—To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges.

6.—To see if town will vote to establish a town Library and raise money therefor.

7.—To see if town will apply for state aid and raise such sum of Money required by law for Permanent Improvements in Main Highways.

8.—To see if town will vote to Repair No. 3 School House and raise Money therefore.

9.—To see if the town will observe Old Home Day.

10.—To transact any other Business that may legally come before said meeting.
