

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The year 1980 has been a "looking over" year, aimed toward more efficiency in our town. The secretary for the selectmen has been a great aid in correspondence, filing, and overview of line items. We were able to collect a sizeable rebate from insurance inaccuracies through investigation into new policies and companies. Our highway department has been keeping a log and started a bookkeeping roster for more thorough information concerning expenses than has ever been available. Budgetary changes encouraged through attendance at N.H.M.A. seminars have brought about the creation of a file of available past expenses from all town departments, as well as requests and reasons for changes to be used in future budgeting years.

Our membership in New Hampshire Municipal Association gives the selectmen a marvelous tool. They helped us stave off an additional town meeting, as in June we were one of the towns hit by a very poor legislative edict relative to new forms which arrived too late to be properly functional, and were the red tape issue of "legal or not legal?" budget questions. N.H.M.A. accepted our case and those of some 70 towns before the legislature and we were voted a new bill that mandated the form used one year later. Cost in legal fees--zero. The selectmen have contacted this organization for legal assistance in road legalities, fee disputes, workmen's compensation plans, zoning procedures and many other items. The number by phone is an eight hundred and the assistance is pleasant, free and always helpful. We have nothing but praise for our membership.

Tax abatements were the major trouble of the year and the target for improvement in 1981. The use of state procedure is long and costs extra to the tax payer. The present assessing method is not working as well as could be. If the town were reevaluated in the future, the selectmen would ask to handle some of these proceedings and save taxpayers time and money. Until such time, if you feel unfair taxation has been made, a form can be made out through the selectmen's office and mailed with a fee to the State of N. H. for a review and hearing on your situation. Since the assessor is at present hired, he alone can do the assessing and alterations; not the selectmen.

Energy conservation is going to have to be a number one priority within our town buildings. We ask the library, town hall and fire department users to please keep heat minimal, lights off when not needed and doors and windows closed during use of heat. We appreciate all hard work and effort at our fire department to insulate and improve insulation at that building. For any information on State Municipal Building grants and ideas, contact the selectmen. Our bills for heat and electric and fuel in our municipal buildings have climbed. We are investigating street light replacement and removal of less efficient lamps within the town. Also the placement of more efficient lamps at some intersections not presently covered. Any suggestions we gladly receive during business meetings the second Monday of each month. Call 352-3075.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT, Continued

Inventories of property have been sent. The year 1980 demonstrated few errors and few missing and fined. The problem most prevalent is the land owner filling out his inventory as if it were a permanent record of exemption. By reading the inventory one learns that you must file on a PERMANENT RECORD CARD at the Selectmen's office or on OFFICIAL APPLICATION--for the exemptions for Veteran, elderly or Current Use. If there is no application or record file at the office, there is no exemption or current use acceptance. Once filed, however, then each year on the inventory one renews that filing.

Census on the inventory is necessary for residence lists, which are used to tax. Without Residence Tax one cannot get a Motor Vehicle Permit. So fill this section out accurately--rentors, etc.

This year the Boards in the town, Selectmen, Planning, Zoning, Budget--have been working more closely. One member from each board, relative to buildings, went on an April 1st tour of the town assessing new owners, problems, and generally discussing the town together. We hope to see this type of coordination continue, for it makes for strong, more thorough town government.

Repairs, replacements and requests seem to be the issues in all the departments this year as we look over the warrant and budget. The town hall has a new roof and replaced chimney this year, all paid by trust funds. Next year the plan is to paint and perhaps work on insulating the large building, again through trust monies. The library is seeking improvements of plumbing problems--long a subject of costly repairs and thawing, etc. The fire department asked for the replacement of hose, repairs for the trucks, and the addition of a dump valve and generator (one of which was not budgeted for). The police department has received the Government Patrol again and with that addition to its budget, it will ask for a monitor, schooling, and increased mileage. A cruiser has been suggested, using matching funds, but that will have to be brought up on discussion, with more information. The Recreation Department seeks five hundred dollars for use for suppers, Surry Day and the implementation of a Summer Youth Program. This year they earned with the monies of last year, the new chairs and dolly for the town hall and the clocks for town hall and the library. The Highway Department requests a tractor/loader to eliminate the need of rental of such at ever spiralling costs.

Relative to the Highway Department we, the selectmen, have nothing but praise for our employee, Gerald Clark, after his first year as worker. Donald Abrams and Fred Breton have been managing and carrying out his program quite well. Hours have been spent in inquiry, search and checking so that your dollars can be used wisely and for the two road committee members, at no reimbursement. So if you are pleased as this board, please comment to these men.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT, Continued

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We received the Soil Map Surveys and all the informative booklets and guides that explain this valuable tool. The planning board has the bulk of the maps and charts stored at the selectmen office. Any committee or board wishing to help implement and use these is widely encouraged. Only through use will they be truly valuable. The Historic Survey that SWRPC gave us last year is still just sitting there. A small core group through Volunteers at the school are doing a little to perpetuate the town history, but little else has been accomplished. Please contact Maureen Bigelow or Peg Goodrich if at all interested in working on town history.

The year ahead should prove full of change and new vigor in this town. The crunch of the outside world prices and problems have been felt by us. Our 52 Town Hall bell rings showing we share in the nation's watching and waiting for solutions to problems. But the one good feeling that we hope will always prevail: that we're glad we live here in Surry.

To the inhabitants of the town of Surry, in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Surry on Tuesday, the Tenth of March, 1981, at 2:00 PM in the afternoon to act upon the following:

THE POLLS WILL BE OPEN FROM 2:00 to 7:00 PM

ON MARCH 10, 1981, TO CHOOSE THE TOWN OFFICERS AS LISTED ON THE OFFICIAL BALLOT;

ON THURSDAY, MARCH 12, 1981, FOR THE BUSINESS MEETING AT THE TOWN HALL AT 7:30 PM, TO ACT ON THE FOLLOWING ARTICLES OR IN RELATION THERETO.

1. To hear the reports of the Town Officers and Committees.

2. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen and the Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

3. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds that have been received by the Town during the past year.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to administer and dispose of and deed any real estate acquired by the town by tax collector's deed, after being advertised, during the year 1981. (RSA: 80:42)

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the state, federal or another governmental unit, or private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in RSA 31:95-b.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eleven thousand, eight hundred, thirty-three dollars and no cents (\$11,833.00) for a 1980 model 545 Ford tractor with loader and authorize the withdrawal of \$4988.04 for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to issue and sell bonds or notes in the name of and on the credit of the town, under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act Chapter 33 RSA for a period of two (2) years and to delegate the board of selectmen authority to fix the time and place of a payment of such bonds, or notes and the determined rate of interest thereon and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds, or notes, as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Surry or take action in relation thereto.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$11,833.00 for a 1980 Model 545 Ford tractor with Loader and authorize the withdrawal of \$4988.04 for this purpose, from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the balance to be raised by taxes.

8. To see if the Town wishes the Selectmen and Tax Collector to prepare information relative to Semi-Annual Billing of taxes with cost variations and information on money saved, for the purpose of a vote at the 1982 Town Meeting, to institute the procedure.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Budget for the Calendar Year of 1981.

10. BY PETITION: To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in property taxes to five percent and to limit the annual increase in spending by the state or any city, town, or other governmental unit of the state to five percent.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

ROAD COMMITTEE REPORT 1980

This past year was the first that the Surry Road Committee had full control over the expenditures for the town road maintenance and the planning and use of these funds. We feel that the continued year round work on the roads has left them in better overall condition then they have been in several years. Major programs completed during the year were:

- 1. A major rebuilding and construction on the Upper Mine Ledge Road.
- 2. Extensive repairs were done on the Old Walpole, East Surry and Dam roads.
- 3. Tarring and stoneing was done on the East Surry and Dam roads and on Haywood drive.

The other town roads were worked upon and maintained on a regular basis. The advantages of a town employee using town equipment has proved its worth. More work has been done for the available money then in past years.

This year the Road Committee plans include general maintenance and improvement work to be done on all the roads. The gravel roads will be surfaced and leveled and the tar roads will be repaired and patched as needed. Tarring and stoneing is planned for the upper sections of the Old Walpole Road. We feel that using the large stone when tarring gives us the most durable and cost effective for the town.

In the next several years the Road Committee is planning the following work: 1982 Resurfacing the Pond Road 1983 Resurfacing the Joslin Road

The Road Committee would like to recommend the following:

- 1. The purchase of a Tractor/Loader to be used with the truck and by itself on road maintenance.
- 2. The use of a gravel pit on Federal Land. The Selectmen have already applied for this permission.
- 3. Assumption of the care and maintenance of the Town Cemetaries. This would be done by the Road Department using available manpower and equipment as much as possible. Substantial savings to the town are anticipated.
- 4. Realigning the section for road maintenance of the town budget. This has been done as can be seen in the proposed budget. This will allow the Road Committee to watch expenses better and to better control and forecast costs and expenditures.

The past year has been a very busy year for the Surry Volunteer Fire Department. A concentrated effort was put on training. Fourteen members took a driving test for heavy commercial licenses and all passed. The heavy commercial license is required to drive the tanker (30-M1). Four members completed a grueling 88 hour certified firefighter course that was put on by the State of New Hampshire Fire Service Training. The classes were held at Keene State College and the practical work was done at the Keene and the Meadowood drill yards. The objective of the course was to teach basic firefighting skills.

Those completing the course were: Chief Donald Johnson, Captain Dean Tasker, Lieutenant Roger Bienvenu and Secretary Ainslee Phillips. The annual Spring and Fall firefighting schools attracted several of our members. Some of the members have been working towards Emergency Medical Technician Certification, CPR and First Aid.

In addition to the training, work was done at the station. A new well ws installed for drinking water, insulation was placed on the two overhead doors and a door was installed at the bottom of the stairs. Some finishing touches were done on the tanker and a fresh coat of paint added.

In closing the Fire Engineers would like to remind people that fire prevention should be practiced all year long. Be sure that your chimney is kept clean and that all woodstoves are properly installed. Any questions concerning fire safety should be directed to the Fire Engineers.

At this time we would like to thank all the people who have helped and supported the Fire Department during the past year.

Also included in the day was a puppet show contest, and the library exhibit "Bowls, Baubles, Bangles and Bibelots".

John Denis was "crowned" and presented with some "Priceless" prizes as Mr. Surry, during the evening program. He was chosen by a money-raising vote process, from a selection of photos of six or seven participants. Thirty dollars was thus added to other profits toward the Summer Youth Program.

MONADNOCK FAMILY AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE

Monadnock Family & Mental Health Service requests your support for the continuation of our Keene District Office services. During the past few years, the agency has been gradually expanding its services in outlying areas and has been able to offer increasing services to special groups, such as the elderly and children. This makes it increasingly important that we maintain support from all local sources. We hope that your support will continue and that you will incorporate this request into your town's budget.

We are aware that local towns face ongoing budgeting problems; therefore, we are not increasing our request for support. For the seventh year, we are using the formula of 50° per capita. This will be based on population figures from the 1980 census. For the town of Surry the amount is \$331.00.

Financing from towns in your area is used directly to support the Outpatient services of the Keene District Office. This program provides individual, marital, family, and group treatment services to people of all ages. During the past year, the Keene District Office served 1,788 children, adults and elderly people.

In addition to the Keene District Office program, many other services are available to your residents. They include 24-hour emergency service, day treatment and inpatient service provided in cooperation with Cheshire Hospital, specialized services to patients returning from long-term hospitalization, as well as consultation and education services. These services are primarily supported with state and federal monies which, combined with local support and fees, make it possible for the agency to provide comprehensive mental health services to southwestern New Hampshire.

REPORT OF SOUTHWEST REGION PLANNING COMMISSION

A real sense of accomplishment!

This is and has been the key phrase regarding the work effort of the Southwest Region Planning Commission in 1980. A number of programs were undertaken in region economic development, land uses, public transportation, energy uses, inventory, historic surveys, housing assistance plan--a basic document in support of applications for many federal funding programs, and establishment of a circuit rider program to help town selectmen and other officials.

In a continuing program of technical assistance, the Commission assisted in the completion of 7 community comprehensive plans (and there are 19 in various stages of completion), and subdivision regulations and zoning ordinances. Region Planning Commission staff are considered staff of the member communities and answer numerous questions regarding planning legislation, review of difficult subdivision proposals, and assistance in completing funding applications and other research matters.

The Commission's staff also responds to numerous public and private inquiries concerning region economics and demographics.

In 1980, there were 31 member towns, a good indication that in southwest New Hampshire regional planning has come a long way since its start with 10 member communities by their votes at March, 1971, town meetings.

In 1980 the Surry Planning Board began work on the comprehensive plan. This year-long project will involve a study of the town, its histroy and present state. Later, citizens will be called upon to review these studies and to provide assistance in developing guidelines for the town's future.

The Commission's executive committee currently includes Frank Dierauf, Jr. of Greenfield, chairman; William Robertson of Nelson, vice chairman; John von Adler of Sharon, secretary; Timothy N. Robertson of Keene, treasurer; and two members-at-large, Peter Poanessa of Swanzey and Mary Jane Grasty of New Ipswich.

The eight-member professional staff is headed by Executive Director Catherine M. Larson. They work from offices at 28 Mechanic Street in Keene, telephone 1-603-357-0557.
