TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Belmont in the county of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall, First Floor, in said Belmont on Tuesday, the 9th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forecon to act upon the following subjects:

- (1) To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- (2) To choose one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Public Libary for three years, one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years.
- (3) To see what action the Town will take upon the budget as recommended by the Budget Committee.
- (4) To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes paid within thirty days of the presentation of tax bills.
- (5) To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$40,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.
- (6) To see what the Town will vote to do with the income from the John M. Sargent fund.
- (7) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to refinance and/or renew any loans which may become due during the current municipal year.
- (8) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$179.00 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

- (9) To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be used for the purchase of street signs for various part of the Town.
- (10) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any tax deeded property which has been purchased by the Town in lieu of payment of taxes; manner of sale to be left to the discretion of the Selectmen, same to remain in force until rescinded by the voters of the Town.
- (11) To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new grader for the Highway Department. Also to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum not to exceed its purchase price, and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid over a period not to exceed seven years.
- (12) To see if the Town will vote to discontinue what is known as the Swallow Road from the Durrell Mountain Road to the Gilford Town Line, subject to gates and bars.
- (13) To see if the Town will vote to close the Brown Road leading from present fence to entrance of driveway of Silas Axtell.
- (14) To see if the Town will vote to require persons to obtain building permits from the Selectmen for the purposes of maintaining standards of health and fire protection in accordance with State and local laws and regulations and in conformity to safe and sanitary construction practice.
- (15) To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

It is our desire to bring to your attention some of the activities of the past year, most of which are covered by reports from various departments on the following pages of the town report.

TAX RATE

It appeared to be the concensus of opinion when the appropriations were known after the town meeting that the tax rate would be more than that of the previous year. However, we were pleased to find that new property and careful appraisal had contributed in making the tax rate \$6.00 instead of \$63.00, the 1952 rate. We wish further to state that all assessments are approved by the entire board, and not by any one selectman. We endeavor to perform our duty without prejudice or partiality, and to the best of our ability.

TOWN HALL

There were one thousand dollars appropriated to paint the Town Hall. Due to the fact that the amount was inadequate to complete the work in its entirety, the amount was not spent. There is a recommendation by the Budget Committee for twenty-two hundred dollars for improvements to the outside of the building during 1954.

HIGHWAYS

The highways in general show improvements. Jamestown Road has been tarred from Four Comers, Route 140, to the power house bridge in Lochmere. Burleigh Hill will be tarred and completed this summer.

T. RA.

The Ladd Hill project will be started this summer. Bushes have been cut on the Horne Road, and Seavey Road from Ackleys Corner to the Northfield line.

SIDEWALKS

The sidewalk from Ralph Bryant's corner to the Baptist Church has been completed. Fuller, Sargent and High streets, and around the Town Hall have been newly tarred, a much needed improvement.

CIVIL DEFENSE

David Riccard, Jr., is doing nice work in organizing a group of local citizens for this worthy cause. He deserves the cooperation of every citizen.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

PEOPLE PLAY A VITAL PART IN OUR FOREST FIRE PROBLEMS

A preview of the 1953 fire season proves the vital part people play in the never ending battle to prevent forest fires.

In this fire district there 133 fires in 26 of the district's 30 towns; 409 acres were burned over and it cost \$9499.97 to extinguish them. This figure was reduced somewhat through payment of fire costs by persons responsible for illegal fires, fires which escaped from control, and fires caused by their carelessness. Costs were abnormally high this year due to protracted periods of dry weather which increased the difficulty of extinguishing fires.

Eighty-eight percent of the 133 fires were man-caused and could have been prevented. They tell a story which needs to be carefully studied. Some people were careless in disposing of smoking material and camp fires; others burned without the required warden permit—disregarding weather, forest conditions, and the normal safeguads recognized and considered by the warden in issuing permits. Other fires resulted from children playing with matches, carelessly handled fireworks, faulty railroad and truck equipment, etc.

These fires cost a lot to extinguish, most of which could have been avoided—this affects taxes; local business was interrupted by men leaving their jobs to extinguish the fires; trees that might otherwise have built houses, repaired bridges, and supplied raw materials for local industries were destroyed; seedling growth—the future timber crop was wiped out.

This picture can, however, be reversed, if people who offend could be impressed with the importance of observing the simple but essential common sense safeguards that will prevent forest fires. They are:

- 1. Care in disposing of lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches in and near woodlands.
- 2. Care in selecting camp fire sites and completely extinguishing all fires.
- 3. Consultation with the local forest fire warden before burning to secure the required permit.

People play a vital part in our forest fire problem.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Members of the School Board and Citizens of the Belmont School District:

The school enrollment problem led to a survey by Paul Farnum of the State Education Department concerning the relocation of grades and departments for the best interests of the school. His recommendations were as follows: (1) Home Economics at the Gale School (2) Industrial Arts at the Town Hall (3) two grade rooms at the high school. The School Board followed his recommendations and completed all renovations and installations within the school budget.

The Board of Fire Underwriters have inspected the two schools regularly and have found all existing conditions to be excellent, since the School Board has completed every recommendation made by them.

The addition of one elementary teacher has greatly improved conditions for the first six grades. The high school faces a serious problem in September 1954 with a large group entering Grade 7 and only a small class graduating.

The schools have been kept in repair with a fine maintenance program conducted by Mr. Roland Kimball and approved by the entire Board.

All supplies have been purchased and all installations made after public bids were requested and the low bidder received the award in all cases.
