#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of current year taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$436.00 for support of the Concord Hospital. (At request of the hospital)
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the N.H. Forestry and Recreation Commission for opening and maintaining of Trails and Old Roads for Forest Fire protection; the N.H. Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to have the Town reappraised, \$2,000.00 to be raised by current year taxes and the remaining \$3,000.00 payable in equal installments of \$1,500.00 in the years 1968 and 1969.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$325.00 for the Town Library. (At request of the Library Trustees.)
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to close the Pound Road from the Town Hall to Center Road.
- 9. To transact any business that may legally come before said meeting. Polls will be open until 6:00 P.M.

All articles except No. 1 above will be taken up at 7:00 P.M.

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### REPORT OF THE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

In submitting the annual report for the Chichester Volunteer Fire Department I would like to suggest that everyone be more conscious of fire prevention.

During the year 1965 the department answered a total of seven calls while during the year 1966 we answered twenty-four calls for assistance. This is certainly a large increase in fires over the previous year. Of these twenty-four calls seven were for building fires, five chimney fires, five for out-of-town assistance and six miscellaneous calls. Although the property loss in dollars in ratio to the number of fires has been low, the number of fires has been much greater than last year. It is largely due to the training of the men and adequate equipment that these losses have been kept low.

The 1966 budget appropriated \$2,000 for an alert system to be used by the department. With this money it was possible to purchase a base transmitter and seventeen receivers for the firemen's homes. This alert system has been in operation about six months and has been used for several fires. It has paid for itself by speeding the alarm and response of the men to the fire scene, thereby bringing the fires under control with a minimum of damage.

The volunteer firemen have purchased a 1957 tank truck with a capacity of 1000 gallons of water and is being readied to be put in service this spring. This piece of equipment will help to increase the amount of water available at fires.

We have completed the addition to the fire station in the last year and now have adequate room to house three full size fire trucks and a small piece of equipment to be used for forest fires. In conclusion let me urge everyone to become a committee of one to practice fire prevention in the future.

#### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT — 1966

To climb is "to ascend with effort," which well describes the upward climbing journey of our library. Circulation figures for 1966 were as follows: books and magazines for adult reading — 2,715; books for youth and juvenile reading — 3,412; a total of 6,136 books which is 449 more than went out in the previous year.

But no library can prosper unless its trustees are unprejudiced, eager to know their responsibilities and do their utmost to fulfill them. You may rejoice that your trustees have made it possible for the librarians as well as the trustees to join the New Hampshire Library Trustees Association and take advantage of the meetings which are a superior source of information and guidance. No librarian could have received from her trustees more whole-hearted support.

The Friends of the Library Association continues its valuable assistance. Nine members served as library aids and entirely staff the evening hours. The "Friends" collected and sold used books during the summer and were thus able to give adequate, new lighting fixtures to the library. They also gave us books, sponsored the children's summer reading program and helped with the games and provided the refreshments at the concluding party for the children, and gave moving-picture parties with refreshments for the school children. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 15th day of April 1967, at two o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

#### REPORT OF CHICHESTER SCHOOL BOARD 1966-1967

The past year has been a challenge for your school board. As in the past, every effort has been made to provide the best possible education for your children at the lowest possible cost. The effects of inflation have been noted and expenses constantly rise. The ever increasing enrollment means more books, more supplies, and higher transportation costs. Tuition rates increase each year. An effort is being made to bring the teachers pay more in line with surrounding areas. It is important to hold as many teachers as possible from year to year.

The teaching staff is doing an excellent job. The quality of instruction is improving each year. Superintendent Raymond Morton and Principal Richard Fowler work closely with your school board and attend all meetings. Due to the rapid growth of the first grade, a full time teacher has been engaged to assist Mrs. Hill. Your board is studying ways to provide space to split this class of 39. Modern math is now being taught in all grades and new reading books are now in use in grades three, five and six. Team teaching in the 7th and 8th grades has been continued. Special instruction in penmanship is available for the 2nd year. Efforts to engage a music instructor have been unsuccessful. Mrs. Moody has instructed chorus in the upper grades.

An additional TV set has been purchased and a stand built for it by Mr. Elliott. With the improved reception, the teachers can more effectively utilize the fine educational programs available.

In the late summer, some of the playground equipment was re-located. The area behind the school was graded to drain water away from the rear entrance door. 4,000 square feet of hot top was put down to help

keep some of the dirt out of the school. The area will be painted with lines to be used for group games.

Two utility lights were installed at the rear and side of the school. This was necessary to prevent vandalism. Your school custodian, Mr. Harry Elliott, continues to save the town money by doing a wide variety of repairs.

Your school lunch program has been operating very successfully. In May, two new stoves were purchased for the kitchen, a conventional 4-burner range with oven and a modern, efficient, high speed oven. It was with deep regret the resignation of Mrs. Harris Griffiths was accepted. She administered the program efficiently and devotedly for several years. Fortunately, it was possible to hire an excellent local replacement. Mrs. Donald Welch has continued to serve the same high quality hot lunches to an increasing number of children. Mrs. Mabel Stevens has continued as assistant.

After more than 25 years of faithful service to the town of Chichester, Miss Ruth Whitcomb retired as school nurse. We wish her much happiness in her retirement. Mrs. William Ackley is presently employed as school nurse. She spends half a day at the school each week.

A Remedial Reading Program was carried out last summer. Mrs. Plumb instructed eight students for one hour per day for six weeks. The program was very beneficial to those participating. The School Board plans to apply for a seimilar program this summer.

It would be remiss not to mention the outstanding job the Planning Board is doing. Mr. Floyd Blackman, Mr. John Sweet, and Mr. Roger Nelson have given a great deal of time in helping lay the groundwork for your school of tomorrow. We are indeed fortunate to have these dedicated men working to make the best

possible arrangements for a cooperative school with our neighboring towns. There is every indication Chichester will be part of a Cooperative District in the near future. While some may mourn the passing of the small educational units, our children will enjoy many advantages we cannot afford alone.

Additional classroom space must be provided by September 1967. If the cooperative is not voted before the annual school district meeting, an article concerning school building plans will be posted as a part of the official warrant. The district meeting will be held in April this year, in order to permit further action on cooperative planning.

# REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Chichester:

Our school enrollment continues to increase, and at this writing has reached a total of 200. This again indicates that the School Board and Planning Committee correctly anticipated the needs of the district.

The willingness of the voters to accept this assessment of our educational needs, and to provide additional space, places the School District in a favorable position for the moment.

It should be noted, however, that our first grade is rather large. Some provision should be made for additional instructional help in this area. The Board is greatly concerned about this problem. The members all realize the need for each beginning pupil to receive a thorough preparation in the basic skills.

Large numbers in grade one make it impossible to give each pupil the amount of individual attention so necessary at this grade level.

If our first grade enrollment continues to increase, this problem will become more critical and may lead again to the need for additional classroom space.

We are very fortunate to have a dedicated and experienced teaching staff to carry on the instructional program of the school. It has been a pleasure to work with them, and with the principal and School Board in continuing a good educational program for the children of Chichester.
