HANCOCK 1983

In 1983 there was a lot of weather. Some people thought there was too much of it; for example the orchardist whose apples were pocked by the June 24 hailstorm. Also the people who had to drive to work or to shopping after the first December snow storms which each had a coda of sleet that turned the roads into iceways. Others had opinions about the rain — too much at planting time, not enough later on. But the Queen of England, speaking in San Francisco at the end of a rainy tour of our country, explained that the English had exported many of their traditions to America and, apparently, also their weather.

The Queen did not come to Hancock, but in August a covey of princesses drifted down Main Street and won a prize in the Old Home Day parade.

Like the moon, town projects waxed and waned. The Common Commission landscaped the neglected area in front of the Elementary School. The Hancock Woman's Club put on a first-ever discussion evening for the candidates for office of selectman. Earnest people worked hours and hours on problems such as zoning and bringing our town water system up to date.

In 1983 there were lots of volunteers. Any gardener knows the thrill of a volunteer: a plant for which he did not have to prepare a bed, nor select choice seed, nor worry about fertilizer and water, a plant which is suddenly there all on its own producing fine blossoms or fruit. Hancock volunteers enhance our community all year long. They bring meals to the housebound, tidy up the roadside debris left by thoughtless ones, mow grass and rake leaves, repair broken mechanical systems, make music to gladden the soul, plant flowers in the window boxes of the Post Office, arrange swimming and tennis and baseball and other happy occasions for the young, make our town library a model of service for both casual reader and researcher, lead weekly walks in our Monadnock countryside and so on and on.

In 1983 there were joys and arguments and dreams and frustrations, births and deaths, new families arriving, children grown enough to go off to college, and children grown enough to go into business on their own. By the time this account of 1983 (which is being written in a January snowstorm) is read in the Town Report, we will be looking at the sky and talking about spring rains or a late snow or poor man's fertilizer.

SUMMARY OF 1983 TOWN MEETING MINUTES

Article 1: Harry Casler and Parker Starratt were elected as auditors for the ensuing year. Donald Lancy was elected sexton for the ensuing year.

Article 2: The Town voted to accept the budget in the amount of \$373,765 for estimated Town expenses, and the necessary sums for County tax, deduct the revenues and credits and raise the balance by taxation.

Article 3: Ballot vote — Yes-337; No-33.

Article 4: Ballot vote — Yes-327; No-42

Article 5: Ballot vote — Yes-344; No-26

Article 6: Ballot vote — Yes-332; No-38

Article 7: Ballot vote — Yes-334; No-37

Article 8: The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$1,115.63 to be supplemented by \$7,437.53 from the State for Town Road Aid Program.

Article 9: The Town voted to accept and appropriate the sum of \$8,599.51 in increased Municipal Highway Subsidy Funds to be expended on the Old Dublin Road and the Old Antrim Road.

Article 10: The Town voted to raise and appropriate \$3,551.04 for the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse.

Article 11: The Town voted to raise \$594.50 for the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.

Article 12: The Town voted \$200 for the support of the Grand Monadnock Arts Council.

Article 13: The Town voted against joining the Monadnock Region Association.

Article 14: The Town voted \$3,800 to landscape the Common in front of the Elementary School.

Article 15: The Town voted to disband the 1979 Bicentennial Committee and allocate the proceeds of the sale of Bicentennial memorabilia to establish and support a fund to repair the Hancock Meetinghouse steeple clocks.

Article 16: The Town voted \$1,000 for the Library Improvement Reserve Fund.

Article 17: The Town voted \$382.48 for use by the Conservation Commission.

Article 18: The Town voted \$300 for the Monadnock Community Day Care Center.

Article 19: The Town voted to authorize the withdrawal of \$7,936.80 from the Revenue Sharing Fund to be used as partial setoffs against the interest on the Fire Station Note and the Highway Department Building Note.

Article 20: The Town voted to become a member of the proposed Contoocook Valley Solid Waste Management District.

Article 21: The Town voted to establish a Town Recreation Repair and Replacement Fund.

Article 22: The Town voted to go on record in support of immediate actions by the Federal Government to control and reduce acid rain.

Article 23: The Town authorized the selectmen to transfer tax liens and convey property acquired by the town by tax collector's deed.

Article 24: The Town authorized the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 25: The Town voted to accept \$1,000 in cemetery trust funds and \$4,431 for various Library funds.

Article 26: The Town voted to accept the reports of the auditors and committees as printed in the Town Report.

Article 27: There was no other business. Adjourned at 3:05 p.m.

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the TOWN HALL in said Hancock on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next at 10 of the clock in the forenoon for ballot voting of Town Officers and all other matters requiring ballot vote; and, to meet at said TOWN HALL in said Hancock on Saturday, the seventeenth day of March next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. Are you in favor of the adoption of Amendment to the Hancock Building Ordinance as proposed by the planning board, to include specific references to the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations? This amendment is required so that Hancock citizens may obtain subsidized flood insurance.
4. To see if the Town will accept and appropriate \$1,082.31 as the balance in the Town of Hancock Town Road Aid Funds to be expended as part of the Road Rehabilitation Program; or take any other action relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for use as a setoff against the following debt service.

6. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway bridge described as follows: the iron bridge on Cavender Road, over the Contoocook River, which goes from Hancock to Greenfield; as allowed by RSA 231:43; or take any other action relating thereto.
7. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Class VI road which runs from the end of the Longview Road to Depot Road, as shown on tax map R-15; or take any other action relating thereto.
8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) for the purchase of a new sander for the highway department; or take any other action relating thereto.
9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the Library Improvement Reserve and Building Fund. This sum to be allowed to accumulate from year to year, or to be expended by the Library Trustees, or to be added to by gifts of money; or take any other action relating thereto.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the support of the Monadnock Community Day Care Center, a non-profit agency; or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition)
11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand five hundred fifty-one dollars and four cents (\$3,551.04) to the Monadnock Community Visiting Nurse Association to support the continuance of health services now being provided through an agreement with Home Health Care and Community Services, Inc. This local request for financial support is based on a \$2.87 per capita formula; or take any other action relating thereto.
12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred ninety-one dollars and seventy-five cents (\$891.75) to support the Mental Health Program of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service; or take any other action relating thereto.
13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) to augment the Senior Program of St. Joseph Community Services, Inc.; or take any other action relating thereto.
14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the support of the Grand Monadnock Arts Council; or take any other action relating thereto.
15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate up to four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) to cover the cost of repairs to the Town Clock and steeple; or take any other action relating thereto.
16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) to widen and reconstruct Depot Road from the northern boundary of Lot 12, Map U-8 (Kassarjian's) to a point where Lot 13D, Map R-10 (Bleicken's) intersects the road; to authorize the Selectmen to raise this appropriation by borrowing or otherwise; and to accept and expend any State or other money which may become available for this project; or take any other action relating thereto.
17. To see if the Town of Hancock shall call upon the Governor and Executive Council, its State Representative(s) and State Senator to promptly convene a Special Session of the Legislature for the sole purpose of preventing the imposition of huge cost increases in electric rates resulting from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant on the citizens, businesses, schools and agencies in the Town of Hancock, and to direct the Selectmen to promptly notify our above listed elected officials of the Town's desire; or take any other action relating thereto. (By petition)
18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to transfer tax liens and convey property acquired by the Town by tax collector's deed by public auction (or advertised sealed bid) or in such other manner as determined by the selectmen as justice may require; or take any other action relating thereto.
19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes; or take any other action relating thereto.
20. To see if the Town will accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the Town; or take any other action relating thereto.

21. To hear the reports of auditors and committees heretofore chosen; or take any other action relating thereto.
22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

In 1983 Hancock saw the beginning of a number of projects which will have a long-term impact on our town. We joined with Peterborough and Sharon to form the Contoocook Valley Solid Waste District, as required by the State, and expanded and refined our recycling operation in order to extend the life of our landfill as long as possible. In the next year we hope to add newspapers and magazines to the items recycled.

The highway department successfully began the road renovation program approved at town meeting. It is anticipated that the entire project will span six years or more, and may need to be accompanied by a similar program for bridges.

Crowded parking conditions during some summer weekends along the road to Nubanusit continued to pose the possibility of a problem for passage of emergency vehicles. We expect that strict enforcement of parking regulations (one side only) and an increased fine for illegal parking will alleviate the problem.

What to do with the town water system has been a topic of much discussion and will no doubt continue to be one in the year to come. The water commissioners have collected information on the legal requirements and the alternatives available to the town and will be presenting their findings to the town in the year ahead.

After much discussion with several people about the need for a building code and revisions to some aspects of the job of building inspector, the selectmen appointed a Building Committee to study the situation and come up with some recommendations in time for consideration by the townspeople at the 1985 town meeting.

Such a committee is yet another example of the cooperation and volunteerism which makes Hancock such a nice place to live. The selectmen would like once again to extend their heartfelt appreciation to all those dedicated souls who participate in running the town by serving on the various committees, by working in town jobs, and by running for elected positions.

COMMON COMMISSION REPORT

It has been a busy year for your Common Commissioners, beginning in early May when the town fountain at the foot of Norway Hill was assembled and turned on and ending in late fall when that antique and ornamental mechanism was dismantled to be stored away for another winter.

Our most important project was authorized at the 1983 town meeting; there Hancock voters approved our recommendation for improving the unsightly oval common which lies between the school and the meetinghouse. The transformation of what had been a mud-pie parking arena began in mid-May and will — we hope — finally become a reality when the carefully nurtured grass begins to take hold in the spring. The cooperation of Hancock residents and schoolchildren during this delicate period is greatly appreciated by us.

Along with the oval common, the triangle (or bandstand) common came in for its customary mowing and trimming, thanks to Mert Knowles' dedicated maintenance of our equipment. We also continued our care and repair of the bandstand although extensive vandalism in early August required us to hire some professional help.

In an effort to contribute something to Old Home Days, your Common Commissioners designed and sponsored a unique challenge race for teenagers — the *Triple Threat*. This team event included bicycling, running and canoeing, and was won in exactly 18 minutes by our 1983 Champions — Rodney Hixson and Paul Garcia!

And finally, your Common Commissioners wish to publicly thank all those who work so hard every year to beautify Hancock. Their efforts are a sufficient reward for our own.

TOWN LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

State aid to New Hampshire libraries was further cut by the cancellation of the Van program, thus significantly reducing the number of books formerly available from that source. This has forced us to increase our budget for the rental and purchase of new books in order to maintain the service we feel that the people of Hancock expect. However, because of anticipated increases in our Trust Fund Income and current donations from good friends, the town was only asked to contribute 35% of our annual budget for 1984.

The balance of the Library Improvement Reserve and Building Fund, which was transferred last year to the Trustees of Trust Funds for their investment, is now in the neighborhood of \$50,000, thanks to both the continued support of loyal contributors and what has sometimes been called "the magic of compound interest." This fund cannot be utilized for any other purpose than "the alteration and/or improvement of the Hancock Town Library Building." Continued town contributions to this fund are especially valuable, as they serve to assure potential donors that their proposed gifts are being matched by support from the townspeople.

Again we extend our sincere gratitude to those volunteers who, by their efforts, have made a major contribution to the operation of your library. Some may be seen behind the check-out desk; others, less visible, may be there during closed hours and week-ends, working with the children, helping with clerical work, cataloguing, moving books, etc. If you think that you would enjoy such work in the library atmosphere, please let the library staff know of your interest.

An April 1983 article in the Keene Sentinel quoted a N.H. State Library report saying that the Hancock Town Library had the highest per capita circulation rate in the Monadnock area. Though it will be some time before comparative figures are in for the current year, Hancock readership is always near the top.

The interest of townspeople in the Library also shows in other ways: more than half a dozen volunteers donate many hours every week to help the Librarians process circulating books; throughout the year citizens make gifts of books and records and magazines to our collection; others make generous bequests to our building fund and general budget.

Two extracurricular events this year were a Library-sponsored show by the Little Red Wagon drama group in July and the inauguration of evening film shows in the Library with films supplied by the Grand Monadnock Arts Council.

The annual book sale was held in July and was as popular as ever. In August the Library displayed books written by more than 30 authors who live, or have lived, in Hancock. And all year long there are monthly art exhibits displaying the work of local artists.

In September when the State Library closed out the Van Service (formerly Bookmobile) Hancock "inherited" about 400 not-so-new books. As time allows those with long-term value are being catalogued and added to our permanent collection.

The Library continues to subscribe to the McNaughton book rental service for newly-published books. We also continue to participate in the Nubanusit Library Cooperative which, among other advantages, allows us to buy library supplies at a discount rate.

HANCOCK FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Hancock Fire Department responded to 72 calls in 1983, down about 10 per cent from last year. The calls were for 30 medical emergencies, 12 chimney fires, 13 mutual aid calls, 2 search parties, 2 car fires, 2 grass fires, and 11 false alarms and misc. calls.

During the up coming year the fire department will be looking at many styles of new fire trucks. At the town meeting next year we will propose an article to purchase a new pumper that we feel will best suit our needs, and the town needs.

The new pumper will be to replace the 1945 Mack which only carries 150 gallons of water and has a 500gpm. pump on it. We now feel that a new truck with a much larger water carrying capacity would be a tremendous help to us and to the town.

Also in 1983 we put our new custom designed and built rescue boat into service. It is a 16 foot open alum. boat with a 25 H.P. motor on it. Many of you have seen it Old Home Day or at Nubi. when we were having training drills with it. This was purchased with funds that were raised by the firemen.

**REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN
AND STATE FOREST RANGER**

Once again, our cooperative town and state forest fire prevention and control program leads the nation in least acres burned per forest fires. Less than one-half acre per fire statewide average.

At the town level, your Forest Fire Warden is responsible for the prevention and control of all grass and woods fires when the ground is not snow covered.

Forest fire prevention is achieved at the town level by issuing a written permit for every fire that is to be kindled on the ground out of doors when the ground is not covered with snow. Each person wishing to have an outside fire must obtain this written permit from the town Fire Warden before kindling the fire. Any person that does not obtain a fire permit, when one is required, is violating our forest fire permit law and is subject to a court appearance and could be fined up to \$1,000 and receive a jail sentence of up to one year.

No fire permit will be issued between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. unless it is raining. The reason for this is twofold: the fire danger increases steadily between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., then subsides to a safe level between 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. This happens because the sun dries out the fine fuels that are easily ignited and dries the air which permits rapid fire spread. Also during this part of the day fire fighters are not readily available in most communities so an escaped fire could burn longer and cause greater damage before being suppressed.

Your cooperation in burning only when conditions are safe is greatly appreciated.
