THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon, County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, at twelve of the clock noon until six p.m.. Regular business meeting will be held at seven p.m.

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$42,000.00, from:

a. Filing Fees and Permits	600
b. Interest on Taxes and Deposits	5,000
c. Dog Licenses	400
d. Motor Vehicle Permits	30,000
e. State of NH Grant	4,000

To defray Town Charges estimated to be \$125,297.00.  
Town Charges to include, but not limited to:

a. Town Officer's Salaries	5,000
b. Town Officer's Expenses	10,000
c. Election and Registration	700
d. Police Department	8,500
e. Damage by Dogs	500
f. Legal Services	2,500
g. Ambulance	4,262
h. Fire Department	7,000
i. Insurance	32,000
j. Planning and Zoning	1,000
k. Town Poor	2,000
l. Cemeteries	1,500
m. Interest -Tax Anticipation	8,000
n. Solid Waste	27,500
o. Maintenance of Town Hall and other Buildings	9,000

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100,000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish approximately \$34,490.00 in State Aid. The Town will raise the balance. (Approximately \$65,510.00).

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3500.00 for the Capital Expense of the Fire Department.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for renovations to the Town Hall.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 for the Capital Expense of the Police Department.

Article 7. To see if the Town will establish semi-annual tax billing as per RSA 76:15A and 15B.

Article 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for the purchase of a riding lawn mower for use in the Town Cemeteries and for the Town Hall and other Town Buildings.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the abandonment of the following right of way, the said section of road, which is or formerly known as part of the original Cheshire Turnpike, located as follows: beginning north from the intersection of the east end of Cold River Road and terminating at the present Cheshire Turnpike, opposite the west end of Melish Road, this portion of road, being only a few hundred feet in distance. The said section of road has not been maintained for some twenty-five years, since being replaced by the new section of road beginning at the intersection of NH Route 123 at the Cold River Bridge. By abandoning this portion of the (Old) Cheshire Turnpike, the east end of Cold River Road can be regraded in elevation. Presently this end of Cold River Road is the most hazardous and unsafe right-of-way in this area. The abutters are in agreement for the abandonment action.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the Veteran Exemption from the present \$50.00 to \$100.00.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds for the perpetual care of the Cemetary Lots.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 15. To allow accounts.

LIST OF APPROPRIATIONS -- TOWN MEETING 1991

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by the moderator, who led off with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence in respect for those serving in Operation Desert Storm. The moderator introduced all town officers. Article 1 was completed during the voting portion of the town meeting. Prior to Article 2, a motion was made and seconded and voted in the affirmative to dispense with the reading of the Town Warrant twice.

ARTICLE 2: Motion made and seconded and unanimous vote to authorize the Selectmen to use the income to defray Town charges as written for Article #2.

ARTICLE 3: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100,000 for the maintenance of Highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish approximately \$32,466 in State Aid. The Town to furnish the balance (Approx. \$67,534) A voter asked for specific explanations, which were given by Selectman, Lou Beam. This is to be a moderate increase due to the necessity of work to be done on the Crane. (Motion made/Seconded/Vote Yes)

ARTICLE 4: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for the Capital Expense of the Fire Department. No Discussion. Motion/Second/Vote Yes.

ARTICLE 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for renovations to the Town Hall. (Discussion) To do trim work, repair the entryway, work on the wiring. (Motion/Second/Vote: Yes)

ARTICLE 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the Capital Expense of the Police Department. (Discussion) This will pay for ammo to keep our part-time officers qualified, which they need to do twice yearly and to obtain another portable radio. (Motion/Second/Vote Yes)

ARTICLE 7: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for the purchase of highway equipment. (Discussion) Residents questioned if this has been \$5,000 in the past, and what we do with it, and if it should be raised. The answer is that we use this as a buffer. Motion/Second/Vote Yes to amend this article to read ...the sum of \$10,000 for the Capital Reserve... (Motion/Second/Vote Yes on the Amendment)

ARTICLE 8: To see if the Town will vote to amend the exemption provisions of the expanded Elderly Exemption which now is: "Expanded exemption of real estate which provides for a resident of 65 years of age up to 75, a \$5,000 exemption; a resident 75 years of age up to 80, a \$10,000 exemption; a resident 80 years old or older, a \$20,000 exemption. Provided that resident owns the real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has been living for at least 5 years as man and wife; said resident has a net income of less than \$10,000 or combined income with spouse of less than \$15,000 and owns assets of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bona fide encumbrances, not in excess of \$100,000, to read: to see if the Town will vote to amend the exemption portion of the expanded Elderly Exemption which now is "expanded exemptions of real estate which provides for a resident 65 years of age up to 75, a \$15,000 exemption; a resident 75 up to 80 years of age a \$30,000 exemption; a resident 80 years or older a \$60,000 exemption....." Motion on Amendment/Vote Yes; Vote on Article: Yes

ARTICLE 9: To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds for the perpetual care of the cemetery lots. No discussion. (Motion/Second/Vote Yes)

ARTICLE 10: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. (Motion/Second/Vote Yes)

ARTICLE 11: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by tax collector's deed. (Discussion) A resident asked if there was any property already in mind. The answer to this question was no. (Motion/ Second/Vote Yes)

ARTICLE 12: To transact any other business that may come before said meeting: Charlie Grout made a motion to raise the Veteran's Tax Exemption from \$50 to \$100 and Disabled from \$700 to \$1,400. Motion/Second/Vote Yes.

Ben Porter made a motion to include all names of service members from Langdon who served in Operation Desert Storm as a part of the official minutes of the meeting. Vote: Yes. Those names being Robert L. Davis and Everett Adams.

Keith Short asked for an update on the highway garage. The Selectmen explained this was put on hold because of the worsening economy. Pete Goodnough asked that the wood for the garage be cut by George Woodell's sawmill.

The Quilt Raffle sponsored by the Community Club was won by Bob Kasprzak of Ct. River Bank.

ARTICLE 13: To allow accounts. Vote: Yes.

Meeting adjourned at 7:45 P.M.

This year was busy with emergency calls, routine maintenance, and drills.

A used booster reel was mounted on 17MI and some protective clothing was purchased for the department.

I am happy to report we have had new members join the department, and their willingness to help is a big boost to both the Fire Department and Rescue Squad in additional manpower.

An area we have to address this year is our self-contained breathing apparatus. These are worn in an environment where the natural air is not safe to breathe by personnel. We have 8 of these units now, 7 of which are in service but no longer pass safety and performance standards.

The capital expense money we are asking for this year is to initiate a program of either repair or replacement, whichever is deemed most feasible.

Again this year I would like to thank our many supporters, and the men and women of the department who have volunteered to help the town.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND  
STATE FOREST RANGER

in Langdon we had only two minor wild fire incidents this year. Thank you for your diligence. Please continue to use the fire permits as required, your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Robert Cunniff stepped down as Deputy on December 31, 1991. Much thanks to Bob for his service.

Following is the State Forest Fire report:

1991 was a very dry and busy year for the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service as well as local fire departments due to our increase in the number of fires. Our three major causes of fires in 1991 were non-permit, children and smoking materials. 450 wildland fires in New Hampshire burned approximately 150 acres for an average fire size of one-third acre.

Primarily, the local fire department is responsible for extinguishing these fires. Keeping the average fire size this small is a tribute to early detection by citizens, our fire tower lookout system, and the quick response of our trained local fire departments.

In every municipality, there is a Forest Fire Warden and several Deputy Wardens that are responsible for directing suppression action on wildland fires, working with other fire department members under the direction of the N.H. Forest Fire Service to make sure that all fire department members are properly trained and equipped for suppressing wildland fires. Forest Fire Wardens and Deputy Wardens receive specialized training each year, presented by the N.H. Forest Fire Service, to keep their skill level and knowledge of forest fire laws up to date.

The local Warden and selected Deputy Wardens are also responsible for issuing burning permits for any open burning that is to be done in their community. In New Hampshire, any open burning, except when the ground is completely covered with snow, requires a written fire permit prior to lighting the fire.

The town of Langdon has seen a 25% increase in police calls and a 187% increase in patrol related activities resultin in a number of motr vehicle violation arrests and convictions.

During the months of March and April of '91, we had 12 burglaries that involved either vandalism or stolen items. With this, we decided to increase the number of patrols and the length of night patrols. From April to February of this year we had only 8 of this same type burglaries.

The Police Department has joined the Mutual Aid System for dispatching. As a result, to get Police, Fire or Rescue, all you have to do is call one number for all three. This number is 352-1100. This will hopefully cut down on confusion and increase response time.
