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Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

{ L. S. } *To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs: -*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library and the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Eleventh. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of, "An act to provide for State Aid and for the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State." Approved February 24, 1905, or act thereon.

Twelfth. To determine the division of the school money.

Thirteenth. To hear the report of the Auditors and the Town School Board.

Fourteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground, or act thereon.

Fifteenth. To see if the town will vote to construct a sewer on Ela Street this year, or act thereon.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway that intersects the highway leading from Arthur E. Gray's to Henry A. Ford's (about thirty rods south of said Gray's house), to the Plainfield line, or act thereon.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to concrete the sidewalk from Lamphere's block on Mechanic Street, westerly to the point where the sidewalk ends, or act thereon.

Report of Board of Health.

The town on the whole has been in a healthy condition during the past year. The only thing out of the ordinary occurring was the rather widespread outbreak of scarlet fever. During the year and up to the present time about 30 cases have been reported. It was of a mild type, which may account for the difficulty in completely stamping it out, as in all probability some extremely mild cases have occurred which were not attended by a physician. No case has been fatal. Only two cases of typhoid have been reported—one at Lebanon and one at West Lebanon.

Diphtheria, one at West Lebanon.

Small-pox, or Varioloid, two cases at West Lebanon.

Whooping Cough has been very prevalent. Probably there have been about 200 cases in the village of Lebanon and surrounding country. Many nuisances have been looked after and corrected, when possible. There are still some houses which ought to be connected with the sewer, though they are growing fewer each year.

The Board has met with an irreparable loss in the death of Dr. M. S. Woodman. He did his work energetically, and his willingness to give his time for the healthfulness of the town is worthy of praise. His business ability linked with his knowledge of sanitation, made him an invaluable member of the Board.
