TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 12th Day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all articles except Article 1 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges, the same being: Town Officers' Salaries and Expenses, Election-Registration Expenses, Expense of Town Hall and for other town buildings, and make appropriation for the same. To set the salary of the Tax Collector-Town Clerk, Selectmen, Treasurer, Overseer, Auditors, Moderator, Ballot Clerks, Supervisors and Health Officer.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for the Police Department for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire protection for the ensuing year.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$110.00 for the Pine Blister Rust Control.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for Insurance for the ensuing year.

Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the protection of health, including Health Officer's salary and expenses, and a sum of money to be equally divided between the Littleton Hospital and the Woodsville Hospital.

Article 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.

Article 10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to plow the Town roads, and if so, to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500.00 to light the streets in the Town of Lisbon under the same conditions as they were heretofore lighted.

Article 13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to oil roads in the Town as are already oiled, and to raise and appropriate \$4,000.00 for the same.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the observance of the Bicentennial Celebration in August, 1963.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,300.00 for the Lisbon Public Library.

Article 16. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Town Poor.

Article 17. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Article 19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the community Skating Rink.

Article 20. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the cemeteries in the Town of Lisbon.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$289.26 for the purpose of uniting with the 45 other towns in the White Mountains Region Association in the cooperative development and promotion of the North Country's economy.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300.00 to defray the Town's share of the Federal Social Security Act.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as they deem necessary in anticipation of taxes and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,020.00 for interest on short and long term notes.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$ 800.00.

Article 25. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,480.00 for the payment on the bridge bonds, - comprising the interest which will be due August 1, 1963; and the bond payment of \$5,000.00 and the interest which will be due February 1, 1964.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to engage the State Tax Commission to revalue the Real Estate in the Town of Lisbon and to authorize them to expend \$3,500.00 from surplus funds for this purpose.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new Town Dump, the location and purchase price to be left to their discretion and the funds to come from surplus funds.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to purchase the balance of the "Boston & Maine" property on the North Side of the Track in Lisbon Village. The above property being that formerly occupied by the "B & M" freight station and milk station. The foundation of the milk station to be removed and the whole area made suitable for parking and maintained in that condition by the town.

Except that the town shall not necessarily be responsible for snow plowing or snow removal. The Town to pay the "Lisbon Development Company", now the owner of above property, the sum of two thousand dollars, (\$2,000.00). Payable one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) by December first 1963 and the remainder by December first 1964 without interest.

Article 29 To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law.

Article 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE WAR MEMORIAL COMMITTEE

At the Annual Town Meeting held in March, 1961 it was voted that the Moderator should appoint a Committee to consider some memorial to the men and women who have served in the armed forces of our Country in times of war, and to report its recommendations at the annual Town Meeting to be held on March 12, 1962. At this 1962 Annual Town Meeting the Committee recommendations were accepted by the voters and the Moderator was again instructed to appoint a committee to carry them out, viz: To purchase an aluminum flag pole, a fifty star flag and a suitably inscribed bronze plaque, to have the same erected previous to May 30, 1962 in the little park between the Town Building and the Ammonoosuc River and on that day appropriate dedicatory exercises to be held as a part of the day's observances.

At a previous Town Meeting fifteen hundred dollars had been voted and raised for this or some similar purpose. The Moderator, George E. Clark, appointed the same committee to carry out its recommendations with instructions not to exceed the appropriated sum of fifteen hundred dollars.

The Committee, accordingly, has fulfilled its commitments.

The Committee wishes to thank First Selectman Earl White, Sr. for his ever-willing and ready cooperation in this project. With his approval, a certain amount of landscaping was done in the park, in the fall of 1962. At the request of the Civic Committee of the Friends in Council the park tables and benches were repaired and painted. At the appropriate time this Civic Committee plans to have set out shrubs and flowers to enhance the beauties of this area.

An itemized account of the expenses incurred appears in another part of this Town Report.

These unlocked doors were found in twenty-four places of business. One place of business we secured the doors ninety-one times for a total of 202.

The year of 1962 has been a full one for the Lisbon library. Early in the year the trustees installed attractive draperies to go with the fresh paint on walls, in both reading rooms.

Library Week was celebrated in the Spring with book exhibits and two films, one for children, the other for adults. A story hour for children was also held.

Also in the Spring Lisbon was host to the Cooperative Book Buying Group, comprised of neighborhood towns which meet quarterly for librarians and trustees to have the opportunity to examine recent publications displayed by the New Hampshire State Library.

This Cooperative Book Group has also been using money awarded to it by the Shieling Trust Fund. This fund is for the purchase of expensive non-fiction, of reference value. These books will be divided among the libraries within the group with an inter-library loan system set up. The library was visited periodically by the state book-mobile which loaned the library many books to augment Lisbon's collection. In addition the State Library itself has provided many loans upon request of the library users.

In November our librarian of fourteen years resigned. Mrs. Edith Hawes was appointed in August, 1948 and served the library most faithfully from then until December of 1962. Appointed in her place was Carolyn K. Allbright, who assumed her duties on December first.

There were nearly 300 books purchased in 1962. A new encyclopedia, "The World Book", was purchased and is now in use in the reference room.

Preventing Forest Fires Is Our Responsibility

Costs of suppressing carelessly set outdoor fires in New Hampshire in 1962 cost the persons responsible \$5,545.00. In the same period, the cost to the cities and towns for control of such fires for which no responsibility could be placed cost another \$24,634.00. What utter waste of tax money and what shameful and needless loss of timber and esthetic values in the 2200 acres burned. Residences, farms, and other business places were threatened with possible total destruction.

Carelessly set man-caused fires can be prevented if every citizen remembers his responsibility in regard to any source of fires in the open. We can help to keep our fire loss low by remembering these simple rules:

1. Dispose of burnable waste at the town dump.
2. If waste or brush is to be burned on the premises, obtain a permit from the forest fire warden. Seasonal permits may be issued for approved incinerators and sites.
3. Burn safely by picking a clean site, avoiding dry windy weather and preferably burning late in the day.
4. Have something to keep the fire under control - pails of water, garden hose, sprinkling can, broom for grass fires or shovel will help.
5. Be sure your fire is dead out before you leave it.
6. If the fire gets out of control or if you see a fire out of control, report promptly to your warden or fire department. Continue to fight it until help arrives.

There is a potential danger when matches fall into the hands of children. It is never too early for parents to instill in the child's mind a respect for fire.

Keep our town safe from fire. In 1962 we had 0 fires.
