TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Belmont, in the County of Belknap, in the State of N. H. qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall, first floor, in said Belmont on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- (1) To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- (2) To choose one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Public Library for three years, one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years.
- (3) To see what action the Town will take upon the budget as recommended by the Budget Committee.
- (4) To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes paid within thirty days of presentation of tax bills.
- (5) To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$40,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.
- (6) To see what the Town will vote to do with the income from the John M. Sargent fund.
- (7) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to refinance and/or renew any loans which may become due during the current municipal year.
- (8) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$185.00 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- (9) To see if the Town will vote to accept the following private road in the Winnisquam section of Town.
"The, so called Leon Small road, starting at Charles Leveck's in a southerly direction to Leon Small's residence, also branch easterly to Fortin and Paquette residence."

- (10) To see if the Town will vote to adopt building regulations as authorized under Sections 18-21 inclusive, Chapter 176, Revised Laws of New Hampshire 1942.
- (11) To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
- (12) To see if the town will vote to have the State Tax Commission reassess the town and raise the sum of \$2,700.00 for the same.

It is believed they serve a good purpose in reminding local citizens of the danger from such fires and how they can help prevent them. The following is offered with the respectful request for publication in your town report.

Forest Fire Prevention is Everybody's Business

Carelessness is responsible for 97 percent of all our forest fires. This is a serious indictment of our interest in our own welfare and that of our neighbors. In too many instances this carelessness results in the destruction, not of the careless one's own property, but of someone not even known to him.

Thoughtlessly thrown lighted cigars, cigarettes and matches from moving vehicles by hikers, hunters and fishermen; the careless burning of debris during hazardous periods, high winds or in dangerous locations; improperly extinguished camp or cook fires—all add up to the CARELESSNESS that means serious loss of property, disruption of industry and farm work and unnecessary expenditure of town and state funds.

It points to the need of eliminating CARELESSNESS so far as it concerns fire from our daily life. The rules are simple—your cooperation is earnestly solicited.

1. Be careful with fire in or near woodlands.
2. Be sure that all lighted material—cigars, cigarettes and matches—is completely out before discarding it. Use ash trays in autos.
3. Secure the required written permission to burn from your local

forest fire warden when the ground is not completely covered with snow.

4. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
5. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.

Let's remember that FOREST FIRE PREVENTION is EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS and our MOST IMPORTANT undertaking!

REPORT OF STATE NURSE

Report of the Health Work which has been done in your community by the Division of Maternity, Infancy & Child Hygiene of the New Hampshire State Board of Health cooperating with the local agencies as represented through the Child Health Conference Committee, namely the Friendly Club and Red Cross.

Three Clinics were held, 71 children receiving toxoid & vaccine immunizing against Diphtheria, Tetanus, Whooping Cough and Small Pox. The Salk Poliomyelitis Trial Vaccine clinics were held, children in the 1st, 2nd & 3rd grades receiving the Vaccine. It will be recalled that Strafford and Belknap Counties were selected for the trial in the Spring of 1954 by the State Territorial Health Officer and the National Foundation of Infantile Paralysis.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Belmont qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Hall in said district on the fifth day of March, 1955, at two o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agent, Auditors and Committees in relation to any embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
9. To see if the district will vote to build and equip a new elementary school on the land now available near the present schools.
10. To see what sum the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction, equipment and furnishing of such new elementary school, including architect's fees; and whether the district will vote to raise such sum through the issuance of serial notes or bonds

upon the credit of the district for all or any portion of the sum so raised and appropriated; and to authorize the school board to determine the terms and conditions upon which the notes or bonds shall be issued including their sale and the time and place of payment of principal and interest, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bonds Statute, N. H. Revised Laws, Chapter 72, and any amendments thereto.

11. To see if the school district will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the school district the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old-Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1951 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$46.80 to defray the school district's share of the cost thereof.

12. If the foregoing article is adopted to see if the school district will authorize the School Board to execute on behalf of the school district the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the school district will designate the School District Treasurer as the officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

13. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.
