Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100,000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish approximately \$43,800.00 in State Aid. The Town will raise the balance. (Approximately \$56,200.00).

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to support the continued leasing of the Caterpillar Motorgrader (the lease cost to come from the monies voted in Article 4).

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3500.00 for the Capital Expense of the Fire Department.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for installation of a new incinerating toilet at the Town Hall.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,500.00 for the purchase of the new police vehicle.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 for the Capital Expense of the Police Department. (To be passed over if article 7 & 8 passes.)

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000 for a salt shed and highway garage. (By Petition) *That 60,000 for highway garage*

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund under the provision of RSA 35:1 for the purpose of building a salt shed and highway garage and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 to be placed in this fund. (By Petition)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds for the perpetual care of the Cemetary Lots.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen to sell Town property.

LIST OF APPROPRIATIONS -- TOWN MEETING 1992

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Don Malcolm at 7:00 p.m. Polls were opened for a few minutes to allow the first 17 voters an opportunity to vote on School Board candidates, as they were inadvertently not given ballots during earlier voting. When the polls closed, the Pledge of Allegiance was said and the moderator introduced town officials. The Moderator entertained a motion not to repeat the Town Warrant. Motion made, seconded and voted in the affirmative. The meeting continued with articles as follows:

Article 1: To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year. This was accomplished earlier in the day and concluded as follows:

Article 2: To see if the Town will appropriate and authorize the Selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$42,000.00 from:

a. Filing Fees and Permits	600
b. Interest on Taxes and Deposits	5,000
c. Dog Licenses	400

Article 3: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100,000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish approximately \$34,490.00 in State Aid. The Town will raise the balance. (Approximately \$65,510.00) VOTE - YES

Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3500.00 for the Capital Expense of the Fire Department. VOTE - YES

Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 for renovations to the Town Hall. VOTE - YES

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 for the Capital Expense of the Police Department. VOTE - YES

Article 7: To see if the Town will establish semi-annual tax billing as per RSA 76:15A and 15B. VOTE - NO

Article 8: To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for the purchase of a riding lawn mower for use in the Town Cemeteries and for the Town Hall and other Town Buildings. No discussion. VOTE - YES

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the abandonment of the following right of way, the said section of road, which is or formerly known as part of the original Cheshire Turnpike, located as follows: beginning north from the intersection of the east end of Cold River Road and terminating as the present Cheshire Turnpike, opposite the West end of Mellish Road, this portion of road, being only a few hundred feet in distance. The said section of road has not been maintained for some twenty-five years, since being replaced by the new section of road beginning as the intersection of NH Route 123 at the Cold River Bridge. By abandoning this portion of the (Old) Cheshire Turnpike, the east end of Cold River Road can be regraded in elevation. Presently this end of Cold River Road is the most hazardous and unsafe right-of-way in this area. The abutters are in agreement for the abandonment action. This will allow Walpole to improve the road. VOTE - YES

Article 10: To see if the Town will vote to raise the Veteran Exemption from the present \$50.00 to \$100.00. Fred Roentsch asked why this was on the warrant, since we voted last year to do this. Lou Beam explained it needed to be a warrant article. VOTE - YES

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to accept Trust Funds for the perpetual care of the Cemetary Lots. No discussion. VOTE - YES

Article 12: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. VOTE - YES

Article 13: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed. VOTE - YES

Article 14: To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Carroll Goodnow brought up the annual district meeting and asked about the 92-93, 93-94 and 94-95 salary issues. Charlie Grout asked who paid if a resident didn't pay his ambulance expenses (town does). Bob Cunniff explained what was going on at the dump, and asked residents to recycle. Several residents mentioned not receiving service at the dump when they were there.

Article 15: To allow accounts. Selectmen, 600 each (700) for chairman. Moderator, \$150.00 VOTE - YES

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND  
STATE FOREST RANGER

Thank You! We had a very quiet year in regards to wild fires. The Fire Department assisted at a "controlled burn" of old grass growth off Edgarton Road.

Once again, thanks for your cooperation in using the written fire permits as required by the state.

Following is the State Forest Fire report:

1992 was below average for wildfires reported in our state. Our largest fire was in May in Rumney where a suspicious origin fire burned approximately 150 acres with a total cost of approximately \$30,000. The N.N. Division of Forests and Lands assisted many other communities in wildland fire suppression as well.

Our fire lookout towers reported 289 fires, burning a total of 136 acres. Our major causes of fires were fires finkled without a permit, unknown causes, and children.

Please help yor town and state forest fire officials with fire prevention. New Hampshire State Law requires that, "No person, firm or corporation shall kindle or cause to be kindled any fire or burn or cause to be burned any material in the open, except when the ground is covered with snow, without first obtaining a written fire permit from the Forest Fire Warden of the town where the burning is to be done." Violation of this statute is a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 and/or a year in jail and you are liable for all fire suppression costs.

Local fire departments are responsible for suppressing fires. The small average fire size of .47 acre/fire is a tribute to early detection by the public or our fire tower system and the quick response of our trained local fire departments. Please help your Warden and fire department by requesting and obtaining a fire permit before kindling an open fire.

The N.H. Division of Forests and Lands assisted 28 towns with a total for \$20,000 in 50/50 cost share grants for fire fighter safety items and wildland suppression equipment in 1992.
