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Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

{ L. S. } *To the inhabitants of the town of Lebanon, qualified to vote in town affairs :—*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Second. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Third. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Seventh. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Eleventh. To see that sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Twelfth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of, "An act to provide for State Aid and for the permanent improvement of main highways throughout the State." Approved April 10, 1909, or act thereon.

Thirteenth. To determine the division of the school money.

Fourteenth. To hear the report of the Auditors and the Town school Board.

Fifteenth. To see if the town will instruct and authorize the selectmen to issue bonds of the town under the Municipal Bonds Act of 1895 to the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars to meet the indebtedness of the town.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground, or act thereon.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the highway that intersects the highway leading from Arthur E. Gray's to Henry A. Ford's (about thirty rods south of said Gray's house) to the Plainfield line, or act thereon.

Eighteenth. To see if the town will vote to use the sum of fifty dollars now in the treasury, which sum was voted at the March meeting of 1904 for the marking of the individual graves of the Revolutionary soldiers buried in town, for the erection of one substantial marker to be set upon or nearby Colburn

Park, said work to be left in the hands of an authorized committee appointed at this meeting.

Nineteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise a sufficient sum of money to buy or lease land in a suitable location and to erect thereon a public horse shed or sheds, with two closets and electric lights, the same when complete to be placed in care of the Humane Society to keep in sanitary condition and repair at the expense of the town.

Report of Board of Health.

The year just passed has been an exceptional one in the great number of cases of contagious diseases which have been present.

A few cases of whooping cough occurred at West Lebanon.

There have been 8 cases of typhoid fever, 6 of which were directly attributable to drinking river water in one of the factories.

During June, July and August there were not far from 300 cases of measles, with no bad results in any case.

With the exception of a little more than 3 months during the summer, scarlet fever has been in town the entire year. And some during the months when it did not appear on the surface there is little doubt but it was

present, for when it was next discovered children were found attending school while in an advanced stage of the disease.

This carelessness on the part of some parents, together with the extremely mild type of the disease which has prevailed, accounts in large part for the widespread epidemic.

There were during the year 78 cases in 39 families, with no fatality, and no case that even appeared dangerous. These many cases, largely among the laboring people, has, of necessity, been a great expense to this town, for, while the Board has tried to manage as economically as possible, yet in many cases the wage earner has had to be quarantined with the family, and the law makes it plain that in such cases it becomes the duty of the Board of Health to help such families to the necessities of life. A quarantine is for the protection of the public, the burden of which must be borne in part by the town, and not wholly by the individual.

It is to be hoped that in the future the people will take a more intelligent view of the matter and report to their physician any case which is at all suspicious, and, if in quarantine, to cooperate with the officials in an endeavor to rid the town of the disease.

There have been a few deaths from tuberculosis, though that disease appears less frequently than formerly, probably on account of the public becoming educated to see the need of better ventilation and fresh air in their homes.

A few cesspools and outhouses still remain a menace to the health of the people, which we expect to see remedied the coming summer season.
