THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the town of Monroe qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1st. To choose all necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.

2nd. To hear reports of officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

3rd. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges, and support the poor for the ensuing year.

4th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise in addition to what the law requires for school purposes for the ensuing year.

5th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to apply on debt of said town.

6th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library in addition to what the law requires.

7th. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for memorial purposes.
