#### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Belmont in the County of Belknap, in the State of N. H. qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Community Hall, first floor, in said Belmont on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- (1) To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- (2) To choose one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of the Public Library for three years, one Trustee of the Trust Funds for three years.
- (3) To see what action the Town will take upon the budget as recommended by the Budget Committee.
- (4) To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all taxes paid within thirty days of presentation of tax bills.
- (5) To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate 40,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.
- (6) To see what the Town will vote to do with the income from the John M. Sargent fund.
- (7) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to refinance and/or renew any loans which may become due during the current municipal year.
- (8) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$219.00 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- (9) To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$2,000.00 to resurface tar road, straighten and widen shaker road, beginning at top of Judkins Hill to cross road of South road and to widen and tar South road. Beginning Akleys Corner and con-

- tinuing in westerly direction to property of Calvin Brown on the South road, a distance of approximately two (2) miles.
- (10) To see what action the Town will take after the completion of Ladd Hill Road that Plummer Hill Road be widened, repaired and such other work as necessary be performed to make it a road that will be passable the year round by being properly surfaced. By "surfaced" meaning to be graveled and oiled with state aid, so-called TRA.
- (11) To see if the Town will vote to establish a municipal Court in the Town of Belmont and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for Justice salary.
- (12) To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
- (13) To see if the Town will vote to change the time of the Town meeting on the budget and articles in the warrant until seven p.m. in the evening.

It is believed they serve a good purpose in reminding local citizens of the danger from such fires and how they can help prevent them. The following is offered with the respectful request for publication in your town report.

### BE A GOOD CITIZEN — COOPERATE

Smoking and debris burning caused more than 50 percent of the forest fires occurring in the state of New Hampshire in 1955—235 fires out of a total of 463 originated from these two sources. Lighted smoking material and matches thrown from moving vehicles along the highway or dropped by fishermen, hunters, hikers, berry and flower pickers accounted for 26 percent; debris burning in the wrong place or at the wrong time by those who failed to heed all pleas for safety or refused to recognize the logical, sensible rules and regulations set up under legislative authority governing the use of fire in or near woodlands accounted for more than 24 percent. This is inexcusable.

Everything possible is being done officially to remedy the situation. Since 1909 there has been a statute on our law books which requires everyone to secure written permission from the local forest fire warden before starting a fire in or near woodlands or where fire can be communicated to woodlands, unless the ground is covered with snow. A never ending program of educational work is being carried on by your local warden and state officials to inform the general public both of the value and necessity of securing the required permit for such burning. Much progress has been made, but there are still many who fail or refuse to cooperate. The value of our permit system was definitely proven in this district during the 1955 calendar year. Local wardens issued 3,864 permits for debris burning fires. That's a lot of permits. The records show only 2 permit fires got out of control. This proves several things-while wardens were liberal in the issuance of fire permits, accommodating every applicant so far as possible, they were cautious, following closely directives outlining overall policy governing the issuance of burning permits and thoroughly instructing

permit users. The latter, too, fully appreciating their responsibility in using their permits, governed themselves accordingly. Result? Much burning done legally and safe.

But what of the smokers? Despite all the efforts of those officially charged with the responsibility of preventing fires, too many were careless or thoughtless in disposing of smoking material and matches. Why? It is difficult to say. Autos are now equipped with ash trays. Why not use them? The crushing out of a cigar, cigarette and the complete extinguishment of matches before being discarded is an easy chore.

If the costly habits of the careless and indifferent smoker and debris burner could be overcome, more than half of our annual forest fires would be eliminated. Will YOU do YOUR share to bring this about?

### REMEMBER

- Get a written permit from your local warden before starting your debris burning or camp fire. The law requires it.
- 2. Make certain they are dead out before leaving them.
- 3. Become a safe smoker by extinguishing smoking material and matches before discarding them.

To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the total sum of seven thousand, four hundred dollars (\$7400) to be made available to the district treasurer on or before June 1, 1956 and added to the budget for the 1956-1957 school year; said total sum to represent a deficiency appropriation of five thousand dollars (\$5000) for Principal of debt and twenty four hundred dollars (\$2400) for Interest on debt for the New Elementary School.
- 10. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make applications for and to accept in the name of the School District for District purposes, including the construction of any elementary school authorized by the District, such funds or grants in aid as may be obtainable from the State, Federal Government or other agency or department.
- 11. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Members of the School Board and Citizens of the Belmont School District:

### NEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

The people of Belmont demonstrated that they wanted good schools by voting 161 to 6 to appropriate \$100,000 for the construction of a new elementary school at the annual district meeting. This was one of the heaviest votes for school construction in New Hampshire.

This meeting had been preceded by many meetings of the Belmont Building Committee to study the school needs, and several educational meetings in various parts of the town. The real problem was to secure space for elementary classrooms to take two grades out of needed space in the high school and to provide rooms so that the heavy and impossible teaching loads could be reduced to the advantage of children.

The Building Committee was as follows, chosen mostly by town organizations: Mrs. John Stevens, Mrs. Peter Merrill, Mr. Robert Knapp, Mr. James Rhodes, Mr. Oakley Swain, Mrs. Arthur Bouchard, Mr. Calvin Brown, Mr. Armand LaFlam, Mr. Maurice Lacroix, Mr. James Stearns, Mr. Thomas Roach, the late Mr. Joseph Boutin, Mr. Richard E. Moulton, Mrs. John N. Heath, and the three School Board members, Mrs. Suzanne Roberts, Chairman of the Committee, Mr. Roland S. Kimball, Chairman of Building Construction, and Mr. Robert Bordeau

Architects were interviewed and Mr. Irving W. Hersey Associates, Durham, N. H., a firm with tremendous experience in school construction, was engaged. Many meetings of the Building Committee were held and the building plans were approved by the entire committee.

The School Board was very active concerning securing the lowest possible interest rates and worked closely with the Boston finance people to sell the bonds at the best market time. The rate secured was two and four tenths per cent, a rate very surprisingly low for school bonds. The School Board deserves a great deal of credit for this economical move that will save money for the town over the next twenty years.

The building was put out to bid with the following awards:

General Construction-David W. Davison, Manchester, N. H.

Heating and Plumbing—Northern Heating and Plumbing, Laconia, N. H.

Electrical—Carter Electric Company, Newmarket, N. H.

Roofing-A. W. Therrien Company, Manchester, N. H.

There were many sub-contracts and special jobs which were all awarded on competitive bids.

The building of this school represents one of the greatest achievements in the history of Belmont, and again shows clearly that people will support a civic improvements when they clearly understand the reasons for the investment.

### HIGH SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

The School Board recommended a program of high school improvements to meet the requirements of the State Education Department and to better the curriculum and equipments. The voters accepted these suggestions unanimously. They involve a new science laboratory, improvement of library facilities, additional science equipment, a complete commercial course, and a complete high school curriculum. Belmont High School pupils may take a four year course in college academic preparation and four year courses in commerce, home econmics and shop. Pupils may take four years of science and mathematics, and three years of history.

Incidentally, the latest report from the University of New Hampshire shows clearly that graduates of small high schools do just as good work at the University scholastically as the graduates of the large city schools.

### Helping Teacher:

Miss Esma Ford of Laconia was elected Helping Teacher by the Supervisory Union. Her chief duties will be to help teachers of the entire Union on problems in Curriculum, Methods, Discipline, Morale, and Public Relations. She will have charge of the teaching program in all schools. She will work on special teaching aids for teachers, visual aid programs, and professional teachers meetings. The State of New Hampshire pays \$2500 annually towards the salary of the Helping Teacher.

### Additional Nurse:

Mrs. Marjorie Wheeler, former U. S. Navy Nurse and experienced in health work with the Veterans Administration, was employed by the Supervisory Union. She does the health work in the towns of Belmont, Gilford and Gilmanton. The increase in pupil population from 1,208 in 1944 to 1,643 in 1955 made it impossible for one nurse to do the work. Her office will be in the new elementary school at Belmont.

The Belmont School Board has held many meetings with the members of the Building Committee during the educational campaign to explain the need of school construction to the people, and many meetings with them and the Architect before final approval was given for plans. These meetings were in addition to regular board meetings and Supervisory Union meetings. The Board has secured bids on everything possible during the year and has worked in the interests of a dollar of goods or services for every dollar appropriated by the taxpayers.

May I extend my personal appreciation to the School Board, Principals, Teachers, Parent-Teacher Association, and Custodian for the cooperation and assistance received during the past year. The people of Belmont have cooperated one hundred per cent with the general policies of the School Board which have all been directed towards making the Belmont Schools one of the outstanding systems of New Hampshire.
