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Warrant for Annual Town Meeting.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

{ L. S. } *To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town, on the second Tuesday in March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town or act thereon.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of "An Act to Provide for State Aid and for the Permanent Improvement of Main Highways Throughout the State." Approved April 10, 1909. Or act thereon.

Eleventh. To determine the division of the school money.

Twelfth. To hear the report of the Auditors and the Town School Board.

Thirteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground or act thereon.

Fourteenth. To see if the town will vote to have one or more liquor agents for the year ensuing to sell spirituous and malt liquors for medicinal and other purposes as provided in Sec. 6, Chap. 71, Session Laws of 1899, and raise money therefor.

Fifteenth. To see if the town will approve of the Selectmen's purchasing the J. S. Mason land adjoining Glenwood Cemetery as an addition thereto.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to buy the piece of land on Howe street adjoining the Town Hall lot, owned by W. S. Carter, and raise money therefor.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to cause to be compiled and printed in suitable form for distribution to the taxpayers, within sixty days, an attested copy of taxes, exclusive of poll taxes, assessed at the regular spring assessment of 1910, and also a report of the reappraisal of September, 1910, made by the Selectmen and two special assessors elected to co-operate with them at the last annual town meeting, or act thereon.

Eighteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to provide memorial tablets with the names of revolutionary soldiers thereon, to be placed in the Soldiers' Memorial Building, or act thereon.

Nineteenth. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation Hotel Rogers and its appurtenances for the term of ten years, from March 31st, 1912, agreeably to an act of the General Court approved July 4th, 1872, or act thereon.

Twentieth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the observance of the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the incorporation of the town, or act thereon.

Twenty-first. To see what action the town will take in regard to town ordinances, or act thereon.

Twenty-second. To see if the town will vote to make alterations in the Town Hall, or act thereon.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

Aside from scarlet fever, the town has been remarkably free from contagious diseases.

The first part of the year there were about 20 cases of the disease in the same mild form. Then from May until November nothing was seen of it, but since then 16 cases have occurred up to the present time. In the eastern half of the town, including Lebanon village, there have been 4 cases of typhoid fever, only one case of which had access to the precinct water. Sewers have been constructed in the most needful places in Lebanon village during the past year, so now there are but a few scattered houses to which the public sewer is not readily accessible.

Two cases of typhoid fever, two of whooping cough and two of measles have occurred in the west part of the town during the year ending Feb. 15, 1911. The two cases of measles were reported and quarantined on the 14th of February, 1911.

There is urgent need of a sewer on Elm St., in West Lebanon, which, we expect, will be constructed during the present year. This will much improve the sanitary condition, as well as the general appearance of the banks on the east side of the B. & M. Railroad, where private sewers now discharge upon the surface of the banks.

The private sewer discharging into the culvert on South Main St. should be discontinued, and connection be made with the public sewer.

Better sanitary conditions could and ought to be maintained in relation to depositing or leaving waste

material in or near the brook and land east of the buildings on Main St., from Dana St. to the culvert on Main St.; also along the banks of the brook from the culvert to the Connecticut river.

A sewer has been suggested for the improvement of this locality. But a sewer of ordinary capacity cannot and will not perform the duty of a dump cart. More care taken NOT to deposit or leave waste material in this locality will clean up and improve the sanitary conditions complained of and make them much better for all concerned.

We believe that these suggestions, carefully put into practice, will improve a few other localities in town, not mentioned in this report, but well known by those desiring better sanitary conditions.

The Board of Health appreciates the effort of citizens to help them in their work by cleaning up unsanitary places, and by reporting to them conditions beyond their personal control.

Also for reporting contagious diseases and cases of sickness where they have reason to suspect that the disease *may* be contagious.

By continuing this effort the citizens can do much to aid in maintaining healthful and better surroundings for all.
