REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD.

The Goss Corner school was closed at the end of the spring term, 1914, and a consolidation with the Ambrose school effected. The district is now maintaining five schools.

It is probable that the Nick Road school will be reopened in the near future as there are a number of children in that vicinity nearing school age who must be provided for. At the Ambrose school the old style desks and benches have been replaced by the newer style desks that have been taken from the Richardson school. Repairs have been made on the wood shed and a suitable out building constructed. The wood shed should be shingled and the school room should be sheathed or plastered and the underpinning of the building straightened up and the building painted. We recommend that an appropriation be made for this purpose.

It is not likely that the Red Hill school house will be again used for school purposes. We suggest that action be taken by the district as to its disposal.

The average attendance at our schools this year has not been satisfactory. For very trivial reasons children have been absent, at frequent intervals, for a day or two and in some cases a week. This not only retards the progress of the absent scholars but it places an uncalled for burden on the teacher and interferes with the discipline of the school. We earnestly ask the aid of every parent and guardian of school children in securing a better attendance this coming year.
