

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitant's of the Town of Temple in the County of Hillsboro in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, in said Temple, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alterations and amendments of the constitution proposed by the constitutional convention shall be approved.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of library.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of schools for the year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Memorial Day.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs of public buildings.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of highways and bridges.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray expenses of observing Old Home Week.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to take any action with regard to vacant schoolhouses in town.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Most of the balance in the treasury will be required for new books ordered and for binding magazines.

Feb. 1, 1903, there are in the library 3,001 volumes. Two hundred and twenty-four have been added during the year, twenty-five of which were government reports; sixty-two were sent by Hon. B. B. Kingsbury, and among them were fifty-four volumes of "Harper's Family Library," which formerly belonged to the old "Columbian Library" of this town. Mr. Fisher gave nineteen books; Mrs. Bemis, six; Hon. A. S. Tatten, two; Mr. M. H. Fisk, four; Mr. Amory Heald, four; Mrs. Clarence Newman, one; Rev. W. Bancroft Hill, thirty-two; among them twenty volumes of "Alden's Encyclopædia of Universal Literature"; Frank Colburn, some periodicals, and Mr. Thomas Lawson, a copy of his book, "The Lawson History of the American Cup." Miss Katharine Miles has sent us another box full of the most popular magazines of the day in complete sets. Ten volumes of these we have had bound during the last year and hope to have the others soon. About the same number of books were taken out last year as the year before, and this fact shows that the interest of our citizens in this important institution still continues. The trustees are gratified at the general neat and orderly appearance of the library.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

The School Board are able to report that the school work for the last year has been very gratifying. School has been kept in two houses, and pupils from a distance have been carried at district expense with results pleasing to almost all concerned.

The spring term in No. 5 was taught by Miss Taft with good results. Fall and winter by Miss Holden with such good success that parents and pupils wish her to return to them.

The work done by Miss Bryan at No. 1 we believe could only be accomplished by a trained teacher of experience and ability.

In the last year we have bought from school funds geographies costing \$27.28 and readers costing \$20.41 and dictionary \$4.00, total \$51.69, which gives good supply of text books, except histories which are old and badly worn, but may be renewed at no very large expense.
