THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of current year taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$263.00 for support of the Concord Hospital. (At request of the Hospital.)

5. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum not to exceed \$1,500.00 from General Funds for the purpose of renovating the Fire Station. (At request of the Fire Department.)

6. To see if the Town will vote to join the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and appropriate the sum of \$457.30 as the Town share for the studies and operation of this Commission. (At request of Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.)

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1,317.00 as the Town share of the cost of hiring two men to operate the Center Barnstead Ambulance during day time hours only. (At request of the Center Barnstead Fire Dept.)

8. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum not to exceed \$1,500.00 from General Funds to Capital Reserve Funds toward purchase of a replacement Town Grader.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls will be open until 6:00 P.M.

All articles except No. 1 above will be taken up beginning at 7:00 P.M.

REPORT OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

During the year 1969 the department answered twelve calls for assistance. These calls are broken down as follows, two chimney fires, two grass fires, two buildings, one truck and four calls for out of town assistance.

During the year one of our members, Lieut. Frank Hall, built and presented to the department a 1963 GMC fire truck. This truck is equipped with pump, tank, hose and has compartments to carry tools and equipment. This truck has been designated as engine three and has already seen service during the year. This vehicle is small, light and is ideal to respond where a larger pumper isn't required. To buy and equip this truck would cost the town between five and six thousand dollars.

On behalf of the town and fire department I wish to express our thanks to Frank Hall for this fire truck.

One of our projects for 1970 will be to renovate the fire station to house all our equipment. At the present time one of our trucks is kept under the town hall. This project will not require any addition to the station but will require interior alterations.

I would further like to call the voters attention to the need for financial assistance to the Center Barnstead Ambulance fund. The town of Chichester has been privileged to use this ambulance service for the past ten years tax free.

However, due to the demand for full time service, volunteer operation cannot be assured, and financial assistance is requested of the participating towns to hire two men to be on duty during the daytime. I strongly urge the voters of Chichester to support this request.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF

Less fortunate than our northern towns, we had too many fires. Carelessness in burning trash and discarding smoking material and children playing with fire caused most of the fires. Your Forest Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires. A synopsis of these laws follows:

Fire Permit

A *fire permit* is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning. Such burning is restricted by regulation to be *prior to 9:00 a.m. and after 5:00 p.m.*

Exceptions

Commercial or industrial burning is allowed anytime under normal conditions with permission of the District Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

Penalties

1. For kindling a fire without a permit. Maximum of \$200.00 fine; or imprisonment for not more than 60 days.

2. For kindling a fire by any means wilfully or recklessly that shall endanger woodlands the maximum fine is \$500.00 or one year's imprisonment.
3. For failure to totally extinguish a camp or cooking fire before leaving it the same penalties as in (1) above.
4. For dropping inflammable material in or near woodland, maximum fine is \$25.00.

Fire prevention is a personal matter and a good habit. Keep our town free from smokes in 1970.

REPORT OF CHICHESTER SCHOOL BOARD**1969-70**

Rarely do so many major changes take place within a school system in one year. After many years and numerous "studies", Chichester has voted to become part of an Area School with Pembroke, Allenstown and Epsom. This is a long-range plan, designed to guarantee the education of our high school students indefinitely. All students are to attend Pembroke Academy unless they have been released by the Pembroke School Board. Pembroke is moving ahead promptly with plans to enlarge and improve their facilities to fulfill their obligation as the receiving school. For the first time, Chichester knows where their students will receive their secondary education for years to come.

The Department of Education has moved Chichester into Supervisory Union No. 53. The effective date will be July 1, 1970. This move seemed advisable to more efficiently co-ordinate the primary studies in our school with the other towns in the Area School complex. We will now be part of a larger union, with more personnel to serve us, at very little increase in cost. We regretfully leave our former union where we have enjoyed a pleasant and helpful relationship.

Because of the amount of work involved in keeping the school facilities in the proper state of cleanliness, we now employ a full-time custodian. It is hoped this arrangement will make the position more attractive and enable us to hire and keep a man on a more permanent basis.

During the summer of 1969, a water softening system was installed at the school. As time passed, increasing problems were being encountered involving the plumbing fixtures and the dishwasher, because of the hardness of the water. An improvement is already evident.

For the first time in the history of Chichester, all the School District Officers will be elected by non-partisan ballot. During the 1969 session of the General Court, legislation was passed and became effective Sept. 1, 1969 to provide for elections in this manner. RSA-59 was amended by inserting after section 77 a new section 59:77. Arrangements are being made to make this transition as smooth as possible.

Unless there is a sudden surge in enrollment we will continue to "get by" with the present classroom space. One more room is badly needed at the present time, but with various manipulations we are "making do." Each year construction can be avoided enables us to retire more of our present debt load. At the same time, building costs are continuing to rise at a rapid rate. The census figures are closely studied as an indication of future needs.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Chichester:

The Chichester principal and teachers are sincerely interested in the educational welfare of children, and they are working effectively to provide the type of instruction necessary to prepare pupils for admission to secondary schools in the area.

A part time teacher is now employed by the school district in order to provide time for the principal to assist pupils and teachers, or to meet with parents as the need arises. This seems to be effective in providing better service to the pupils and to the community, and results in more effective operation of the school.

The enrollment of the school has not increased appreciably over last year, indicating that present school facilities may remain adequate for longer than was previously expected.

School costs continue to rise, however, due to price increases and the climbing costs of all types of services.

We are very fortunate to have a dedicated and experienced teaching staff to carry on the instructional program of the school. It has been a pleasure to work with them and with the Chichester School Board in providing a good educational program for the children of Chichester.
