THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.



*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified
to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of "An

Act to Provide for State Aid and for the permanent Improvement of Main Highways throughout the State." Approved April 10, 1909, or act thereon.

Eleventh. To determine the division of the school money.

Twelfth. To hear the report of the Auditors and the Town School Board.

Thirteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a play ground, or act thereon.

Fourteenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Fifteenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association.

Sixteenth. To bring in your votes for four delegates to the Constitutional Convention, to be holden at Concord on the first Wednesday of June, 1912.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to adopt the provisions of Chapter 124 of the Public Statutes of New Hampshire. (As amended by Chapter 76, Session Laws of 1905). (As amended by Chapter 73, Session Laws of 1907), relating to dealers in old metals.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

During the past year, the following contagious diseases have been reported:

Scarlet Fever, 46 cases in 27 houses; Diphtheria, 4 cases in 3 houses, one case fatal; Typhoid Fever, 9 cases in 8 houses; Measles, 20 cases; one fatal from late complication.

Whooping cough has been very prevalent with 1 fatality, due to pneumonia, developing in the course of the disease.

This bears out what is observed nearly every year: namely, that more fatalities occur from the so-called mild contagious disease Measles and Whooping Cough than from the much dreaded ones like Scarlet and Typhoid Fevers and Diphtheria. Tubercular patients are beginning to take advantage of the State Sanatoria much to their benefit. Successful treatment of this disease lies wholly in its early recognition. Then waste no time experimenting with the many "Consumption cures," but at once begin the out-of-doors treatment, at a sanatorium if possible; if not, at home under expert guidance.

Many nuisances have been investigated and corrected. However, some still remain to be remedied.

Sewers have been constructed on Elm and the north end of Maple streets at West Lebanon, where there was urgent need demanding them. This addition to the sewer system has greatly improved the many unsanitary places referred to in the report of 1911.

Co-operation and help by the selectmen and the citizens to make good the sanitary conditions of the town is appreciated and acknowledged.

While it is the duty of the Board of Health to see that the sanitary laws and regulations are complied with, this does not, in any way, conflict with the duty of the individual citizen to keep his premises cleaned up and free of waste refuse material, his duty to prevent soiled, or waste paper of every kind from being placed or left for the wind to distribute to his own or to his neighbor's premises, or his duty to ask the Board of Health to take charge of unsanitary conditions beyond his personal control. Refuse substances attract flies, which are known to be carriers of disease producing germs. We commend the general efforts now being made to suppress the house-fly- nuisance. Feed and protect the family, *don't feed the flies.*
