TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 8th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all articles except 1, to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriation for the same as set forth in the following budget.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State, or other assistance as may be available in the construction of a sewerage disposal system, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to have two full time police officers; and raise and appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 for the operation of the Police Department for the ensuing year. (By Petition)

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase a new police cruiser and expend the sum from surplus funds.

Article 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase from Public Service Company of New Hampshire for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) said Company's Lisbon dam and canal; the land owned by said Company at either end of said dam and between said canal and the Ammonoosuc River; and the flowage, riparian and other rights associated with said dam.

Article 9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to expend from surplus funds the sum of One Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$1,720.00) and pay such sum into the Aeronautical Fund and transfer such monies from the Aeronautical Fund to the New Hampshire Aeronautics Commission, said sum to be expended by said New Hampshire Aeronautics Commission, on the Whitefield Regional Airport, so-called, in connection with the expansion of said airport facilities.

Article 10. To see if the Town will accept firefighting help and render assistance requested under the Mutual Aid Program.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT TO YOU...

With the calling to order of the Annual Town Meeting, we, the Selectmen, complete our work for the year. There is, however, the obligation that we stand ready and willing to explain and defend our official acts and to outline our plans for the coming year.

Since the 1963 property revaluation by the State Tax Commission, the assessed valuation totaled \$5,019,590.00 and the Town and County tax rate was \$1.50. In 1964 and 1965 our assessed valuation dropped a quarter of a million dollars to \$4,765,210.00, our Town and County tax rate still \$1.50.

This year inasmuch as we have encountered some new expenses such as County poor, a new bridge that had to be built on Breezy Hill and the belief that the people would like a two man permanent Police Force, we will have to go up in the tax rate.

We have bought two trucks, one with a snowplow and one snowplow to purchase that will total \$10,200. We had the town's large loader completely overhauled and also the grader at an expense of approximately \$5,000 total. The money earned by renting the bulldozer was more than enough to keep it in nearly first class condition. With the exception of two old trucks, all our equipment is in first class condition excepting the possibility of small repairs.

The small bridge deck going over Salmon Hole Brook has been completely refurbished with large H-beams and new plank capable of withstanding over 20 ton loads. This job cost us less than \$600.00. The Breezy Hill Bridge was demolished and a new one built. The total cost will be about \$6200.00. It will also be capable of withstanding 20 ton loads.

Our Town Road Aid Construction jobs should be finished this spring, completing the Bishop Road. The town voted to borrow \$28,000.00 in 1964 for this accelerated road program and as yet we have not had to borrow a cent for it.

The town only borrowed \$25,000 this year. This reduced our interest payments. Furthermore, we now realize twice as much return on our invested idle cash as we have to pay out in interest, etc. Our local bank has been very cooperative in this venture.

In October 1965, Pearl Lake which is our water department's source of drinking water was processed with copper sulphate to cut down the Algae taste and we feel it was a good job at no cost to the water department. We hope that our Sewage program can get off to a good start this year and have the final plans ready for the voters, so that Lisbon can have its section of Ammonoosuc River cleaned up and therefore making it a better town in which to live.

It is our sincere hope that the Furniture Corporation of Lisbon and the New England Wire Co. will go ahead with their anticipated expansion programs.

Our surplus now being \$14,220.64 reflects that the Town is in a healthy condition regardless of emergency expenses which may come along.

Printed and distributed over 180,000 folders and booklets promoting the White Mountains Region.

Received 6,987 inquiries in the office which were answered promptly with a kit of folders or by personal letters.

Sent over 22,471 letters and 38,317 individual folders by mail. The balance were distributed by freight or by automobile.

Wrote 25 news releases for use in the local media and four news letters to our members. Wrote one article for N. H. Profiles on "Industrial Conway" and helped prepare other articles for use outside of the region.

Supported the 4-H awards program to encourage the role of agriculture and awarded Mrs. George Clement of Lisbon the "Outstanding Farm Wife of the year."

Have sent a weekly bulletin of lodging inquiries to member innkeepers who subscribed for them and a monthly real estate bulletin to the member real estate dealers.

Sent out a packet of ski area and lodging folders in response to inquiries on skiing.

Presently we are revising our White Mountains Map which lists nearly 200 points of interest in our region, which was designed to keep the tourists with us a little longer. Information booth people tell us it is very popular with tourists. The new edition will be printed this winter.

Worked in cooperation and attended meetings with the White Mountains Recreation Association, Coos County Rural Areas Development Committee, Coos County Planning Committee, Carroll County Rural Areas Development Committee, N. H. Ski Areas Operators Association, White Mountains Region Industrial Council, the Coos, Carroll and Grafton Counties Community Action Program. The association with these many groups has been mutually helpful in developing new projects and programs in the north country.

In the year 1965 the Lisbon Public Library had an increase of 2,296 volumes circulated: 880 were adult and 1,416 were juvenile. The state bookmobile made several visits to the library loaning books to be used and enjoyed by library patrons. Many book needs were fulfilled by the loan of material direct from the state library.

The book stock was increased by two hundred and ninety-nine books. The library received some gift books and several were given in memoriam.

Work started in 1964 to remodel the basement, was completed. The library now has an excellent Historical Room which is maintained by the Lisbon Historical Society. Also now available is a fine meeting room seating approximately fifty people. It is furnished and has motion picture facilities. These rooms have already been put to valuable use.

Several library meetings throughout the state were attended by both the librarian and the assistant librarian. The Lisbon library is now an active member of the Statewide Library Development System with a delegate in the North Country District.
