





# Report of School Board.

To the citizens of the town of Warren:

Your school board during the past year have done their best to make the schools a success.

We have been fortunate in securing good teachers, as a rule the attendance has been good and both pupils and teachers have shown marked interest in their work.

Each school in town has been kept the full number of weeks required by law and a winter school has been maintained in the village and in District No. 1.

Sickness on the part of both teachers and pupils made it advisable to close the village grammar school and the school in District No. 1 before the winter term was completed.

A few of the most needed repairs on school houses have been made during the past year and this coming year there will be more work necessary.

The coming year your board will advise and carry out the plan of having longer terms of school in the spring and fall. This will do away with keeping schools during the extreme cold weather.

The school houses are not in condition and cannot be put in shape without the expenditure of much money to render them comfortable for teachers and pupils to remain there day after day in winter.

Neither can the teachers nor pupils do justice to their school work under such conditions.

We were fortunate in having the state aid the past year, however there is no assurance given we shall have that aid another year. We urge the citizens of the town to appropriate at least as much money for the coming year as they did for this. To appropriate any less would spoil our chances of getting the state aid and would not be enough to give anything like proper support to the schools.

We are also glad to note an increased interest in the schools

on the part of the citizens.

# Board of Health Report.

During the year ending December 31st, 1904, the Board of Health has had a number of calls to visit different parts of the town to abate unsanitary conditions.

In July, diphtheria broke out on Ore Hill in the family of Frank Sorrell; four members of the family had the disease; two weeks later the disease broke out in the family of Ezra Ruell and five of his children had the disease. As strict quarantine was kept as was possible under the circumstances. The disease did not spread and no other cases occurred. The contagious diseases are always expensive to families and the town.

The Board of Health think the selectmen should provide some place outside the village where garbage can be put without troubling anyone.

The board also think the town should own an instrument for disinfecting buildings where contagious diseases have occurred. Such an instrument will cost about \$15.00.
