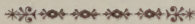

The undersigned, School Board, would respectfully submit their annual report of the schools in said District for the year 1895.

The whole amount of school money appropriated for the year is :

We have run three schools of three terms each and three schools of two terms each, aggregating one hundred forty weeks in the whole, and have expended the sum assigned the schools as follows, to wit :

No. 1. The summer term of 9 weeks was taught by C. W. Stanley; the fall term of 10 weeks and the winter term of 7 weeks were taught by Miss Cejia Stewart. Number of weeks for this school, 26; amount expended, \$229.97.

No. 2. The summer term of 10 weeks was taught by Miss Mary O. Irish; the fall term of 8 weeks was taught by Mr. W. S. Milliken; the winter term of 4 weeks was taught by Miss Mary O. Irish. Number of weeks for this school, 22; amount expended, \$175.25.

No. 3. The summer term of 10 weeks and the fall and winter terms of 16 weeks were taught by Miss Millie Pitman. Number of weeks for this school, 26; amount expended, \$151.00.

No. 4. The summer term of 10 weeks and the fall and winter terms of 16 weeks were taught by Miss Bessie Wheeler. Number of weeks for this school, 26; amount expended, \$175.20.

No. 5. The summer term of 10 weeks was taught by Miss Clara L. Thompson; the fall term consisted of 14 weeks, five and three-fifths weeks being taught by Miss Clara L. Thompson and eight and two-fifths weeks by Miss Ella M. Milliken. Number of weeks for this school, 24; amount expended, \$125.60.

No. 6. The summer term of 9 weeks was taught by Miss Maud Morton and the fall term of 13 weeks was taught by Mrs. Anna E. Robin. Number of weeks for this school, 22; amount expended, \$66.00.
