As I look back on Fiscal Year 1988, I see a very busy and productive year in the Town of Derry.

The Mayor and Council approved many zoning amendments to assure a better quality of life in our town, to include: restrictions on location of duplex homes, water conservation zones, revisions to the flood plain ordinance, amendments to the BOCA codes, adoption of a housing maintenance code, earth removal ordinance, water supply regulations, and water testing to inlcude radon and twelve other contaminates.

It was agreed to transfer railroad corridor land to Pioneer Development Corp, in exchange for construction of a park at the arches, off South Avenue on Beaver Brook.

Donations of land for open space were accepted from Windonderry Estates and the Gunter family on Damren Road.

In August the Council became aware of a big problem with radon contamination in the Scobie Pond Road area. Ouick action was taken and by Christmas of 1987 Manchester water was turned on in the area. By spring water was up the By-Pass to service Daniel and Datillo Roads.

A town-wide water study has been undertaken to look at water quality and supply for the entire Town.

The Town's election dates have become a major issue and meetings are being held with the state officials in an attempt to correct the problem of November annual elections.

In September, land was swapped who Parkiand Medical Center to correct the location of the water tower on Zappa by the Mayor and Council.

water supply to Scobie Pond Area, 1988 roadway management program and upsizing of mains with Manchester Water Works for Bodwell Road.

On January 1, 1988, May Casten replaced Richard Buckley as Councilor for District #1. Richard will be missed for his open-minded thinking and fairness as a Councilor.

January saw the adoption of underground utilities as an ordinance for all new development.

Scott Gerrish was again elected President of the Town Council. Michael Compos was elected representative to the Planning Board and Fred Tompkins his alternate.

The Council voted to open 2100 feet of Jackman Road, from Drew Road toward the railroad bed, at the request of the abutters.

In April the Mayor and Council voted to abolish the residence tax for 1989 and voted for the new tax lien procedures which do not allow tax sales to outside bidders.

The budget for fiscal year 1989 was adopted, as well as the six year capital improvement plan. In this town report can be found a copy of this six year plan and an update of previous years' accomplishments.

In all FY 88 has been a very busy and rewarding year.

Only with the help of the Council, Town Administrator, Department Heads, loyal workers and interested citizens paid he projects and programs for the last three years be possible and I thank each and every one of them.

# ACHIEVEMENT TO DATE OF MY ADMINISTRATION

To best explain changes to the FY 1989 Capital Improvement Plan, it seems necessary to first give a status report on previous years FY '87 and FY '88.

I have supplied you with a printout of those year. Starting at the top, BOWER'S ROAD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT has begun and shall be completed in the spring. Guardrails will be completed with the replacement.

ROAD IMPROVEMENTS - EAST BROADWAY -Rebuilt drainage, widened paved surface, installed 2" base. Granite curbs, sidewalks and top course of bituminous to be complete by June. FOLSOM ROAD - Top course of bituminous to be installed in the Spring. KENDALL POND ROAD (Fordway to Londonderry town line) - Drainage installed, road straightened, regraveled, subsurface of 2" installed, and widened to 24 ft. paved surface, guardrails on corners. Top course and final grade to be installed in the Spring. MILL ROAD - Widened, straightened, drainage installed, elevation raised with crushed stone and gravel, an old granite culvert replaced with two 36" concrete culverts, and guardrails installed.

OVERLAY PROGRAM - KENDALL POND ROAD (Shute's Corner to Fordway) widened, guardrails installed by brool, Taila . 6/kh/a// w/mstel. a. 1 WEST EROADWAY (Londonderry Line to Crystal Ave.) shimmed and 2" overlay

completed. CRYSTAL AVE - shimmed, overlayed and striped. ELM STREET (Broadway to Maple) shimmed, overlayed and several new fire hydrants installed. Several improvements and repairs were made on water and sewer systems, in conjunction with the road program. A 22" Sewer Main was installed which is an integral part of the Horne Brook Interceptor to service Rainbow Lake and the Route 28 Industrial Parl. A 12" Water Main which was installed in the 1970's and never used, was tapped and now services the homes, businesses and side streets in the Folsom Road area. These improvements/repairs will extend the useful life of these systems for several decades.

LAND ACOUISITION FOR COMPLEX - Completed purchase of 24 acres.

ADAM'S MEMORIAL BUILDING REPAIRS Completed Architect's study, currently building handicapped lift, completed resetting of front steps, and replacing condemned electrical wiring.

REPLACE WALL AT HOOD PARK TENNIS COURTS Ouotes received for work. Parking lot paved.

GALLIEN'S BEACH - Raft purchased, changing booths, dock and picpic tables installed, and building improvements 

AVE., ANGEL AVE., AND KELLY AVE. reclaimed existing pavement and completed resurfaced.

ALTERNATE SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL SITES -Engineering by Roy F. Weston in process.

PLANNING DEPARTMENT MAPPING PROJECT -Over 50% complete. Will be completed by Sewall Company by late Spring.

BIRCH STREET BRIDGE - Engineering commenced, culverts sized for Beaver Brook, and construction to be coordinated with reconstruction of Birch Street.

LANDFILL CLOSURE - Leveled, filled with 18" of clay, lined with plastic, filled with 1 foot of sand and 6 inches of loam, seeded, and encircled with 8 ft. high chain link fence. Air vents and pipes installed throughout.

BIRCH STREET 12" WATER MAIN LOOP - Installed loop along Oak Street and Birch Street to service Parkland Hospital and Rockingham Road.

REVALUATION - Bids awarded, fieldwork commencing, additional appropriation in FY 89 C.I.P.

AMBULANCE - 1987 Ford diesel in service December 1987, to replace 1981 Ford Van.

SUNSET ACRES INTERCEPTOR - Bid process completed, engineering ongoing, State approvals for Windham Road received, and Connection fees being developed.

BEAVER BROOK II INTERCEPTOR - Bid process completed and construction to start mid February.

SCOBIE POND WATER MAINS - Emergency water main extension 80% complete, water to Southern New Hampshire Water Company connected February 1988. Several homes on Wentworth Lane serviced prior to Christmas 1987. Scobie Pond Road and Manchester Road to be reconstructed in conjunction with the 1988 Roadway Management Program.

SEPTAGE RECEIVING FACILITY - Engineering completed, State approval forthcoming, anticipate construction to begin shortly. GUARDRAILS - Installed on Walnut Hill Road, Damron Road, Drew Road, North Shore Road, Island Pond Road, Folsom Road, Gulf Road, Forway at Beaver Brook, Goodhue Road, Kilrea Road, and Adam's Pond Road.

ADAM'S POND BRIDGE - Culvert installed and bridge rebuilt.

DOG POUND - Design completed for building, survey of land ongoing. Additional appropriation included in FY89 Capital Improvement Plan.

BALLFIELD ENGINEERING AND CONSTRUCTION -Eric Mitchell Associates has finished a Boundary Survey of the Scobie Pond Road property, and conceptuals with topography showing where various activities could be placed. Gerry Cox has held a meeting with residents as to what activities they would like to see there.

NEW LANDFILL - Negotiating with State for approvals.

SOUTH MAIN STREET WATER MAIN REPLACE-MENT - Engineering and bidding complete.

HOOD AND GRINNELL WATER LOOP - Work to be completed this Spring. Bidding completed.

BUILDING BANDSTAND - Architectual work completed, bid requests being prepared.

POLICE RADIOS - Survey completed regarding the needs of the Police Department, and specifications prepared. Relicenses as necessary to facilitate a repeater type system. Bids received, soon to be forwarded for authorization to purchase.

REPLACE MADDEN HILL BRIDGE - Culverts installed, roadway rough-graded and widened, site distance improved. Final pavement, guardrails, loam and seed to be completed this Spring.

LAGOONS AL1 & AL2 - Sewerage treatment plant built and on line ahead of schedule. Increased capacity to 4.2 million gallons per day. New capacity will allow service to expand to Sunset Acres, Beaver Lake, Barkland Acres and further expansion through the year 2010.

#### **FY 1989 Capital Improvement Program**

REPLACE BRIDGE MAPLE STREET/HORNE BROOK-Replacing of bridge is in compliance with the Bridge Report from the State of N.H. The Horne Brook Interceptor will be constructed in this fiscal year and thus the bridge and interceptor should be done at the same time.

ENGINEERING DESIGN MAPLE STREET BRIDGE/HORNE BROOK - Must be done before construction of bridge and interceptor.

FIRE HOUSE ADDITION - Fire Department personnel are badly cramped for space. As a stop gap, a portable trailer is being budgeted for this year.

FIRE TRUCK-LADDER WITH BUCKET - This truck will enable the Fire Department to fight fires from an aerial platform and to evacuate people from upper floors of higher buildings. Liabilities to firefighters and citizens are greatly reduced.

REEVALUATION - As mentioned in FY 88, update bids came in over amount budgeted. Lowest bid was \$280,000, with \$250,000 budgeted. DOG POUND - Cost of surveying existing town land, designing building and construction require additional \$36,000.

SCOBIE POND RECREATION - In FY 88 Budget we have \$100,000 for surveying, conceptuals, and some construction of facilities. This FY 89 amount will carry on the program to allow for more recreation in the Scobie Pond Road area.

WATER MAINS TO PINGREE HILL ROAD -Normandeau Associates has computed the cost for water mains, laterals and a tank for this area. If the Bentley and Ball subdivisions decide not to use town water, this amount will be reduced greatly, as we will not need the tank of such magnitude.

MAPPING PROGRAM OVERLAY FROM SEWALL -Water and Sewer lines, wetlands, zoning districts, tax map layers (showing tax map numbers, street numbers, fire districts), underground utilities, roads, property boundaries, flood plane, ponds, lakes, and other bodies of water, soils maps, community facilities, Historic districts, road classes, and route numbers are possible overlays.

WATER MAINS TO FOREST AND MIRRA AVE -Residents of this area near BYP 28 have shown an interest in having town water due to the presence of radon.

ROADWAY MANAGEMENT AND WARNER HILL ROAD - The original program called for \$525,000 for FY 89 because we used our FY 88 money for Scobie Pond Road, we would like to appropriate the \$1,700,000 for Warner Hill Road at this time.

SIGNALS & MAJOR RECONSTRUCTION OF SHUTE'S CORNER - This money would be used for Shute's Corner and Birch Street to Parkland. Ambulance access requires a two phase reconstruction.

CEMETERY ROAD IMPROVEMENTS - This continues the program that has been going on for a few years to upgrade all of the existing roads at our town cemetery.

CEMETERY UPDATE PLOT PLANS - We hope to start

a plot plan of the entire cemetery showing who owns lots and who is buried where. There are times when people from both this town and out of state cannot find their deceased relatives.

LIBRARY - Details of a new library will be forthcoming. I am working on what I feel will be the most acceptable solution for the public.

UPPER VILLAGE HALL REPAIRS - This money plus money in FY 88 budget will be required to repair all of the trim and clapboards, and paint the entire exterior. We spent some of the appropriation to do emergency roofing on this building.

It should be stated at this time that without the complete cooperation of the Town Councilors and all of my department heads these numerous projects could not have been accomplished. I look forward to working with all of these people and Rodney Bartlett in the months ahead to finish the projects ongoing.

We have examined the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Derry as of and for the year ended June 30, 1987, as listed in the table of contents. As described in Note 1B, the general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the General Fixed Asset Group of Accounts, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles. The amount that should be recorded in the General Fixed Assets Account Group is not known.

In our opinion, except that omission of the General Fixed Asset Group of Accounts results in an incomplete presentation, as explained in the above paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Town of Derry at June 30, 1987, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole. # **Derry Police Department Report**

In the past year, the Derry Police Department responded to over 13,000 requests for service, 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year, in a courteous and compassionate manner. These requests for a police response parallel the rapid growth of a community demanding levels and types of service unprecedented in the history of this vital and energetic community.

For newly arrived residents reading the Town Report for the first time, and for those long-time residents who have reviewed many of these reports, 1 ask you to look closely at the summary for the Police Department budget. It is important for you to understand how your Police Department operates, and how essential these appropriations are to allow the Derry Police Department to provide a crucial service to the Town of Derry. As the Town has developed and become increasingly complex to police, these monies permit the Police Department to meet these challenges.

In striving to provide an efficient and professional service, the Derry Police Department is organized into a Patrol Division and a Services Division, consisting of forty-five sworn police officers, as well as ten unsworn support personnel. The Patrol Division offers the community a highly trained uniformed officer available for immediate response during an emergency by dialing 9-1-1, or during a non-emergency by dialing 432-6111. The Services Division offers the community qualified and skilled police officers in the areas of criminal investigations, training, records management, juvenile counseling and intervention, criminal intelligence, and research and development. Together, the Patrol Division and the Services Division provide a professional group of men and women dedicated to providing the highest level of law enforcement to the neighborhoods of Derry.

Involvement in the many schools of Derry remains a priority, and I look forward to the continued support of the community in increasing our participation in the numerous safety programs for our children -- the future leaders and participants in community affairs. Of concern to all law enforcement leaders in southern New Hampshire is the continuing substance abuse problem, and the Derry Police Department continues to address this problem in an aggressive and unrelenting manner on two fronts -- education and enforcement.

With your support, the Derry Police Department will continue to be a community-oriented organization pledging its resources to make the Town of Derry a safe and enjoyable community.

# **Derry Fire Department Report**

The Derry Fire Department, now having better than a year's background and experience in its restructured system, can report this system has afforded the department and the town a more efficient operation.

The dual deputy positions, as well as the 7 platoon system, have allowed for extensive and intensive evaluation of the overall policies and procedures. The result has been a more streamlined operation, thus a more productive use of the community's tax dollar.

The emphasis this year has been on the training aspect. Currently the department has better than half its manpower compliment certified at the firefighter II and III levels, which represents 2 levels higher than state requirements. Eighty eight percent (88%) of the personnel are driver-operator certified. Sixty four percent (64%) of the fire officer corps has been certified as fire officer I and II graduates, which gives the Derry Fire Department the singular honor, currently, of having the greatest number of graduate fire officers in the State of New Hampshire.

The fire prevention/fire inspection division has realized a twelve percent (12%) increase in productivity both in terms of inspection and public education which is the real key to lowering the fire suppression effort. Increased activity in this area has the real result of preservation of taxable base to the town and certainly the mitigation of personal tragedy to the citizens of the community.

The "radio fire alarm boxes" installed in areas outside our "hardwired" system have proved both efficient and cost effective. These systems can be installed at approximately one third (1/3) the cost of "hard wired boxes" allowing for a more productive use of the fire alarm maintenance dollar.

The fire dispatch area has been upgraded in that all our dispatchers are C.P.R. and priority dispatch trained. This additional capability allows us to better evaluate the nature of any emergency at the time of the incoming call with the net result of getting the proper equipment and support units on the road in the shortest possible time frame. This expanded service is provided to the community 365 days a year on a 24hour basis.

This year the department has undertaken an equipment refurbishing program for its older pieces in an effort to minimize the "down time" of its rolling equipment and maximize the utilization of same in a continuing effort to provide the best possible service to the community.

The goal of the Derry Fire Department has been, and will continue to be the serious reduction of fire loss, both in dollar amounts and human anguish through fire prevention, public education, and the continued upgrading in the quality of service to the community. With us all working together, I know this goal will be achieved.

# **Emergency Medical Services Report**

In the seventeen years of our existence we have continually strived to keep pace with not only the rapid growth in our area, but have constantly looked at ways to improve our quality of care. In July 1987, the department made a commitment to have on duty a minimum number of Paramedics to staff the two Advanced Life Support Ambulances currently in service. This program was designed to meet the medical needs of the residents of Derry, Londonderry and Chester in providing Paramedic Service in the event that the first ambulances in on a call.

This scenario occurs on a somewhat regular basis as the statistics of last year reflects an increase of over 5% from the previous year. We are extremely pleased to be able to provide this level of staffing though admittedly it has not come about without an increase in cost.

A career ladder has also been implemented to provide an incentive in order to retain Paramedics within the department. The position of Senior Paramedic expands the role of Paramedics to one of providing assistance to the EMS Supervisor in areas of Quality Control, in-house education and administration. The Senior Paramedics role become a very important function in the training of new EMT's and Paramedics into our system.

In the area of continuing education, 5 EMT's were state certified at the Advanced Airway Management level (E.O.A.). This allows them to provide unconscious or nonbreathing patient with a manageable airway by inserting a tube 15" long into the esophagus and ventilating the patient with 100% oxygen. Sixteen firefighters were also recertified at the level of E.M.T. The 24 hour recertification was completed on duty this past spring by Senior Paramedic, James Richardson, our State Certified Instructor.

In closing, we appreciate the support you have shown us this past year. We encourage your input and we welcome your comments. In hearing from you, our services to the community can only improve.

# **Derry Public Library Report**

In the mid 1970's, the Peterborough Town Library conducted a space reorganization program called "Project Shoehorn". I like that name for its apt description of how some libraries must cram a lot of books and services into a tiny space. It reminds me of Cinderella's nasty stepsisters forcing their size 9's into the glass slipper. Fortunately, Peterborough's tight fit was brief: voters supported the library's request for a bond issue soon after I joined the staff as Assistant Director in 1977. The library doubled its building with an attractive addition.

Faced with an even greater space deficit than Peterborough ever imagined, the Derry Public Library wielded its own shochorn last year. Both floors were rearranged to make room for book stacks and provide more work space for our employees. Moving my office to a back corner freed an area for shelves near the front door. We were able to get books off the floor and the window sills.

In the process, we built an entry to the children's room that allows us to comfortably use the area adjacent to the door. We painted the children's room and corrected a water seepage problem. We moved the circulation desks on both floors to streamline traffic flow and derive maximum use of all floor space. I feel that these changes make the building more habitable for the staff and improve access to the collection.

On the other hand, patron seating is more congested. There is no quiet or private study area. After school, we have more teenagers — and more noise — per square foot than before. Space for children's programming is reduced, making it impossible to isolate the program from the other activity in the children's room. Constant distraction and interruption during storyhours diminishes enjoyment for the storyteller and his audience. We have several hundred books sitting unused in storage because they cannot be housed in the public stacks. And, since only so much juggling was possible, we will soon have books on the floor again as our collection continues to grow in response to demand.

During the reorganization, we kept business going with the high level of service you have come to expect. Despite 3 months of road construction and severe winter weather, our circulation rose 5.25 percent. Storyhour sessions were filled in two hours of preregistration. Most afternoons found us with at least double the occupancy recommended by the Derry Fire Department.

A successful fall informational program on radon was followed by a four-part boating series, with 22 participants earning safety certificates from the state. This series, which we'd like to repeat in the future, was organized by our new Assistant Director Tedine Roos.

The hiring of Carl Cushman as Children's Librarian brought the talents of a professional storyteller to our staff. His repertoire of native American and traditional tales enthralls his weekly audiences. He continues the variety of programs and services for which our children's room has become known.

I twice visited Hood Memorial Junior High for "booktalks". The first, "Reading Gives Me the Creeps," featured ghost and horror stories. The second, "Moms, Dads, and other Strangers", featured books about families. J. Roy Jones and Susan Wereska of the Hood faculty assisted with these visits, which were intended to attract teens into the library for recreational reading.

We are also cooperating with the Derry School District in disseminating AIDS information. A bibliography of our AIDS materials was distributed at a Hood PTA program. We also offer brochures detailing the services of local "helping" agencies, including the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, the Rockingham Hospice, and the Rockingham County Extension Service.

The library has been the grateful recipient of many donations of gifts, money, and time this year. Continental Cablevision and the Arts and Entertianment Network hosted a wine and cheese reception her in February to unveil their generous gift of a VCR and monitor. The equipment was accompanied by several made-for-cable videocassettes which are available for loan. The Friends of the Library donated a table for the equipment. Derry was one of only two libraries statewide to receive this gift.

The Friends of the Library have done so much for us this year! Their Craft Fair/Book Sale and softball tourney raised funds for a sign that advertises library hours and events. They purchased a book truck, several video cassettes, and a coffee pot. They sponsored their annual kindergarten information night and photo opportunity with Santa Claus. It is impossible for me to thank them enough for their time and effort expended on behalf of the library.

We are also indebted to the Derry Lions Club for moving furniture during our reorganization and to the Nutfield Community Alliance for their financial assistance that allows us to continue our pass program to the Boston Museum of Science.

We are blessed with a crew of dediated volunteers who file, process books, prepare program materials, and do other clerical tasks. One volunteer "serves drinks to the plants," and another creates our monthly calendar of events.

Speaking of volunteers, don't forget our Board of Trustees who, though elected officials, service without compensation. Without their willingness to wrestle with the concerns of the libary, there would be no library.

I am grateful every day to the fine staff who work with me. Their good humor, willingness to go the extra mile, and daily patience in dealing with the library's limitations bring many compliments from our patrons.

The coming year will have two highlights. First, we will be visited by a review team of other librarians which will evaluate our application for membership in the New Hampshire Statewide Library Development Program. With the addition of more staff hours and other improvements such as our outside sign, we now comply with minimum standards for public libraries serving 18,000 to 30,000 people. This ensures that we'll continue to receive interlibrary loan and film services through the State Library, as well as a share of any available state aid and federal money for library construction.

The second event will be the inauguration of an automated circulation system. All our new books are being barcoded as they are cataloged. We've begun the systematic process of barcoding our older volumes and converting their catalog records to computer data. Early in 1989, we will initiate reregistration of patrons with barcoded library cards and we'll have the hardware in place and running, 1 hope, by next summer.

We are entering another fiscal year still without a commitment from the town for more library space. The campaign that began in 1984 with space needs assessment has not moved toward fruition, a fact that continues to trouble me and the Board of Trustees.

Unless the Town Council responds favorably to our latest proposal for a 15,000 sq. ft. addition to this library and parking on the present site of the Masonic Temple, we will be forced to look at auxiliary space, such as an outside portable office or another building from which to offer some of our services. Continued postponement of the space issue is not possible. There's only so much you can do with a shoehorn.

It is my fervent hope that when I report to the townspeople next year, I will be able to say that plans for an expanded library are complete and groundbreaking is imminent. I believe without a doubt that a better library, with a full range of services for all the people of Derry, is an idea that's time has come.

# **Taylor Library Report**

Fiscal year 1988 has been a good year for Taylor Library. It hs been a year in which trustees and staff have achieved some goals and set others; a year in which we have witnessed much growth and received numerous gifts and recognition for which we are grateful. The visibility of the little library in East Derry has been realized.

We continue to strive to reach associate level certification in the Statewide Development System. The trustees adopted a collection management policy, updated its users' policy, and continue to work on personnel policy. A set of encyclopedias and an unabridged dictionary were purchased to update the reference collection. A non-resident user fee was established as were billing fees and processing charges for lost or destroyed materials. Although fourteen hours was added to our summer schedule, making the library open thirty hours a week year round, excessive temperatures inside the library forced early closing of the library on several occasions this summer.

Programs · continue to increase library visibility as registration for each story hour session attracts new library users. The popularity of preschool story hour prompted me to offer two classes weekly for one of the seven-week sessions in order to meet the demand. Story hour participants and parents enjoyed field trips to Mooschill Apple Orchard, the East Derry Post Office, and to Alvirne High School Farm. Thirty-three library programs were held, serving 544 persons, an increase in both programs and participants. In addition to the regular weekly preschool story hours, I was guest storyteller at Derry's Headstart, at South Range School for the third graders, and at Hood Park's summer recreation program.

The Derry Flute Choir presented a concert of Christmas music at the library, hosted by our trustee board who served refreshments. This was our first adult program. It is hoped that we can sponsor offsite adult programs where space will not limit our program or audience.

Recorded daily statistics indicate that our circulation continues to surpass that of the previous year and that juvenile circulation continues in the lead. Interlibrary loan records suggest that the dramatic decline of items requested from other libraries and the slight increase of items loaned to other libraries may be due in part to Taylor Library's growing diversified collection in areas requested by library users.

A new collection of large print books was made available through the cooperative efforts of the Derry Lions Club and the Bureau of Library Services to the Handicapped and Institutions. The number of videocassettes on loan to Taylor Library from Merri Hill Rock, the area library cooperative, was doubled this year. Users have expressed their appreciation as the collection grows in such diversity.

A book sale and the sale of stuffed animal puppets were two successful fund raisers, the latter income used for a cataloging project. The library has benefited not only from these fund raisers but from other substantial gifts and recognition.

The generosity of the Derry Lions Club made the library eligible to apply for the matching grant program funded by the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation. In June the library was awarded the grant which made it possible for us to acquire a sixty-volume set of American classics from the Library of America collection.

At the spring conference of New Hampshire Library Friends of the Library, I was awarded a scholarship which will allow me to complete the Public Library Techniques program in which I have been enrolled for four years.

The library was the recipient of memorial gifts from family and friends of the late Hazel Geissenhainer of East Derry.

Reference users are grateful to the following donors of local histories and historical items: Frances Davis, Bob and Priscilla Fleeson, Grant Hirst, Marion Pounder and Lois Richardson, and Dena Spoffard.

In the spring the Internal Revenue Service recognized Taylor Library for its cooperation with the I.R.S. by serving as a distribution center for its I.R.S. forms.

In March the library became a member of the Greater Manchester Integrated Library Cooperative System, a first step in serving our community with new technology. The New Hampshire State Library has divided the state into local areas or nodes. Each node will have a processing center that will provide card catalog service to that node. A minicomputer will be located at each node which will contain the Union Catalog information for that particular node. Through sophisticated telecommunications linking, each node's minicomputer will be connected to the other nodes, thus providing statewide catalog capabilities.

To comply with legislation Chapter 89 (HB 11), an act related to the number of library trustees, passed May 6, 1987 and effective July 6, 1987, Taylor trustees voted to change the membership of its board from one of six members to one of five members.

Necessary repairs and improvements to the building made this year include the replacement of loose roof tiles, installation of some new copper drainspouts, painting of exterior trim, and scraping, caulking, reputtying and painting all window sash.

Numerous individuals and groups have contributed to the library's successful year. Appreciation is extended to the following: Derry Junior Women's Club, Nutfield Community Alliance, and Derry Lions Club for their financial contributions: the East Derry Improvement Society for their assistance in conducting our book sale and for seasonal yard cleanup; the Derry News for publicizing our library events; Junior volunteers Tiffany Deacon, Jennifer Dearth, and Nadia Karas; Crystal Karas for her help with the fund raiser and story hour; Arthur Bryant for his service to the library as treasurer; Bill Olesen who has served the library thirty years as janitor; Library trustees for their time and efforts year round in helping to plan and provide Derry with improved library service; Elaine Medwid for her creative efforts in making a felt board and numerous story figures for use in children's program; and library staff Ruth Cabbe, Ann Hastings, and Charlotte Smith.

At his request, Town Administrator Rodney Bartlett attended the January board meeting of library trustees. Shared concerns were voiced, and Mr. Bartlett has acted as liaison between the library and various departments to accomplish various tasks on our behalf. Increased cooperation of town departments has been evident. This year we have called upon the service and had the cooperation of other town departments: MacGregor Library, Derry Parks Department, Public Works, Derry Recreation Department, Derry Police, and the East Derry Fire Department. To all, thanks.

It is my privilege to serve as librarian of Taylor Library. The accomplishments this year have been many, and 1 look forward with anticipation to another year in which individuals and groups share the results of cooperative planning and effort.

This Department is in a constant state of change. We are growing all the time with more facilities and more people participating in an ever expanding variety of activities for both young and old. We have increased the program for Senior Citizens as they are increasing in numbers. Additional space has been obtained in the Scobie Pond area for proposed Recreation use. The plans are still incomplete, but should provide us with some much needed space for future generations.

Even with our facility expansion we still need to use school facilities for most of our sports programs. With the addition of the East Derry Memorial School we have been able to increase the space available accordingly. It takes the cooperation of the School Board, the Superintendent, Teachers, the School Secretaries and of course the custodial people to make it work. For that cooperation, we are grateful.

Hood Park is still our busiest piece of real estate. With as many as 1500 people utilizing this facility on its best days (800-1000 on average days) the pond with swimming and the playground activities attract a growing number of participants.

At Alexander/Carr Playground (ski area) some of the insurance problems were solved by using a new Insurance Company. We still could not ski downhill, but we were allowed to cross country ski and slide. This made for a more dynamic winter playground. A new pool table was added to the lodge equipment.

Gallien's Town Beach is growing in popularity. The Townowned resident-only facility had its first full season of operation with a new aluminum dock and raft system, a new gazebo and new changing booths, along with peddle boats and canoes to rent. It is fast becoming the most up-to-date area we have. As long as water quality at Beaver Lake stays good we look forward to the sewer line helping us out there.

Then we can plan to redesign building placement to give us more beach area. Security is another concern we will have to deal with in the future.

As we promised, line dancing was added to the programs for Senior Citizen's i.e. Day Trips, Walking, Swimming, Exercises etc. We expect even more programs to be added next year for our fastest growing section of participants. Volunteers are our life blood. Without them we could not offer the variety and quality of those programs provided for the children and adults. There are literally hundreds of people who help us with coaching, officiating, scoring and time keeping. They are too numerous to mention, but we do need them and we want to thank them for the tremendous job they do for us.

We are still offering sports clinics for coaches in all sports and those clinics provide those who take the clinics with coaching instructions as well as some first aid and some insight into youth sports psychology. They are then certified as National Youth Sports Coaches.

Youth baseball, grasshoppers, T-ball, softball, Thursday night Fun Run, Hershey Track tryouts as well as Basketball were made possible by the cooperation of Pinkerton Academy, its Trustees and School Personnel. Their cooperation is center point of the Town allowing the Academy to utilize town facilities at Veteran's Field and the Tennis courts for inter-scholastic play as well as practice.

We are interested in finding out from the public what their needs and concerns are relative to Recreation in the Town of Derry. Hopefully we can follow those pursuits as outlined in the 1986 Master Plan. The two main concerns of that survey were an indoor swimming pool and an indoor ice rink.

Please call us with your constructive criticism and we will try to respond positively.

# **Code Enforcement Report**

#### July 1, 1987 to June 30, 1988

1987/88 saw a decline in permits issued for the second straight year. This is partly attributable to a new Zoning Ordinance, which went into effect in October 1987, limiting duplexes to the multi-family zone.

Also in October, the updated building permit fees were approved. As a result, there was a substantial increase in revenues (over \$23,000) even though we issued 630 fewer permits than in 1986/87.

In August of 1987 the Health Department became the town focal point in assisting the residents of the northwest section in dealing with an extensive radon problem. The Town was able to obtain (donated) bottled drinking water from various sources (Coca-Cola, Shaw's Market, and Turner's Dairy) for the area residents, while at the same time, aggressively working to provide Town water to the affected areas. The Scobie Pond Road/Old Manchester Road watermain was completed and the first service was installed on Christmas Eve.

As in the past we have continued to prosecute Building & Zoning Violations in both District and Superior Courts, with one case going all the way to the State Supreme Court which rules in the Towns' favor.

I would like to acknowledge the Code Enforcement Staff; James Doolin, Building Inspector/Electrical Inspector, Robert Mackey, Building Inspector/Plumbing Inspector, Gloria Chesson, Assistant Code Enforcement Officer/Health Officer, Virginia Rioux, Receptionist/Clerk, who all make my iob easier.

# **1988 Conservation Commission Report**

The Commission spearheaded the passage of Derry's first Comprehensive Wetland Protection Ordinance. This much needed ordinance was written jointly by the Commission and Planning Board with input from interested citizens. In the few short months since its enactment, subdivision plans being submitted to the Planning Board now protect and preserve our precious wetlands.

Speaking of subdivisions, the Commission is willing to transplant endangered wild flowers that would otherwise fall to the developers bulldozers.

The Commission again funded water quality studies of Beaver Lake and Island Pond. This study provides a baseline data as part of a long term program designed to document the present condition of, and predict probable changes in lake waterquality. The Beaver Lake Association has done a fine job in coordinating the collection of this valuable data.

Commissioners were kept busy visiting the sites of the 38 Dredge and Fill applications submitted to us, before making our recommendations to the State Wetland Board. We also, at our twice monthly meetings, reviewed 26 site plans.

In order to increase our knowledge of proper land use, Commission members attended the N.E. Environmental Conference at Tufts University and workshops given by the State Association of Conservation Commissions as well as other workshops. We have recently appointed a sub-committee to identify those land types and specific areas of Derry that are the most essential for permanent conservation, recreation, and natural resource management. Once selected, we will apply for matching funding from the States Land Conservation Investment program.

The commission is seeking alternatives to serve. If you are interested in preserving Derry's character for future generations, concerned about the quality and quantity of our water, worried about diminishing farmlands and wildlife habitat, and eager to protect open space and conservation land, please apply.

# Derry Housing and Redevelopment Authority Report

Nineteen hundred and eighty-eight commemorates ten years of full time operation for the agency. In 1979 we received our first Community Development Block Grant which allowed us to start Derry's first low interest housing rehabilitation program. The funds were specifically targeted to conserve the older homes centered around the downtown business area. The first grant also included funds to purchase and raze several severely deteriorated and unused buildings in the downtown area. This was followed by a second grant in 1980 which continued our older housing rehabilitation work and allowed us to complete the acquisition and razing of the remaining buildings in the Sargeant Block area, and thus complete the removal of Derry's most prominent eyesore. We were again fortunate to receive additional Community Development Block Grant funding in 1981 and 1982. The former resulted in the creation of a forty-car public parking area on Abbott Court and placement of several hundred feet of a new storm sewer system from West Broadway. The latter established a mobile home rehabilitation loan program resulting in substantial repairs to over sixty mobile homes.

The mobile home rehabilitation program was the first ever funded in New England and one of the few so specifically designated, in this country.

The sites were acquired in 1979 and 1980 became the future home for two buildings with fifty subsidized elderly units and a new branch bank. The three new buildings represent over two million dollars in new construction, the biggest improvement Derry has seen in the downtown area in very many years.

Our involvement in housing continues through the management of Section 8 rental housing and we have just received additional Federal funding for eighteen more elderly and family units.

Our success over the years has been possible only because of the cooperation and support of our Town government for which we are grateful.

# **Town Welfare Budget Report**

The Town Welfare Office is here to assist families on a temporary basis when an emergency situation exists and the family is without funds. Eligibility for Town Welfare Assistance is based on basic needs versus income. The verification of necessary information is required and other sources of financial assistance must be applied for based on the individual circumstances, i.e. State Welfare Assistance, Social Security, Workman's Comp., Unemployment Comp., Veteran's Benefits, etc.

The welfare caseload is running about even with last year in terms of persons serviced and the amount of assistance rendered. As there was a surplus in the Welfare Budget for this past Fiscal Year, the amount of \$45,000 was requested for 1988-1989. Money requested for the coming Fiscal Year is based on the previous years expenditures plus a little extra thrown in for any unexpected crisis.

This past year I have seen an increase in clients coming in and requesting assistance with their rent due to evictions. Due to the southern tier of New Hampshire being a sought after area for housing, the rents for apartments in Derry are very high. Families on a small fixed income are finding it increasingly difficult to pay the high rents requested by landlords. Although there is subsidized housing, the waiting lists can be up to 12 mos. long. I would like to take this opportunity to thank St. Thomas Aquinas Church and the West Side Community Center Clothes Closet for the help they have given to my clients. Also, the landlords who have worked with me to help prevent the eviction of a family from their apartment, and those who have donated furniture and household items when necessary. Lastly, to anyone else whom I haven't mentioned that has helped me to accomplish what was necessary, and have made my job a litte easier. .. THANK YOU.

# **Rockingham County Nutrition Program**

Rockingham County Nutrition Program's Report to the Town of Derry:

1. Types of Services provided quarterly and year to dateperiod of October 1, 1987 to June 30, 1988.

Group Meals - are well balanced, hot and delicious noon meals that meet 1/3 of the daily caloric and nutritional needs of the older person. The meals are served at Westside Community Center, Monday-Friday, to those who are 60 or over and their spouses.

Homebound Meals - these meals are the same as the group meals, but they are served to the elderly and handicapped in their homes. Drivers go to each person's house, deliver the meals, do small home tasks for them, and report any noticeable change to the site manager. The meals are low sodium and we are able to provide diabetic substitutions, weekend meals (canned or frozen), night meals, frozen holiday meals as well as canned meals to be used during the winter when the driver cannot deliver the meals due to inclement weather.

Transportation Services - this service is provided by RCNP with a van which it owns and operates. The van takes the seniors to and from the Westside Community Center for meals, to doctor's appointments and grocery shopping. The van allows the elderly, who no longer can drive, mobility.

Information - this refers to the information that is given to the clients via a RCNP employee. The homebound and congregate clients receive a menu each month with nutrition and other health information on it. The homebound, also have a newsletter delivered to them on a quarterly basis. This newsletter is written by a RCNP staff member and it deals with information regarding the Nutrition Program as well as health and other issues that concern the older person. The newsletter is enlarged and printed on ledger size paper for easy reading.

Referrals - are made to the Visiting Nurse Association, Adult Medical and Social Day Cares, Community Action Program, the Division of Elderly and Adult Services, etc. Referrals are made to help mobilize resources to aid in the independent living of the client.

Outreach - refers to the efforts made to inform the community about our services. This is done in a variety of ways: inviting the press to lunch, speaking to corporations, informing social service agencies of our program, and putting up posters around town to inform seniors about our program and site location.

Activities - are the "extras" that are done for the clients. These extras include bringing speakers in to speak on topics such as Medicare and Medicaid, having entertainment, giving small gifts to the homebound and the like.

Service Time - refers to the visits that the site manager makes to a client's home. All homebound clients receive home visits. Site managers do home visits for a variety of reasons: a) to do an intake on a new client, b) to do a redetermination on a client already receiving meals, c) to check up on a sick client, etc.

Escort Services - this basically is calculated each time a staff person helps a client to a doctor's appointment. This person

would not be able to go alone so the staff person goes with the client.

2. Services delivered to indigent residents quarterly and year to date.

By law, RCNP is only able to certify income for clients who participate in the meals on wheels portion of the homebound program. It is a violation of our grant for the other programs to do means testing. The number of unduplicated client's on the meals on wheels portion of the home delivered program is 18. This does not show the true number of indigent clients as some clients who qualify for the meals on wheels portion of the program refuse to fill out the paperwork because they don't understand it, do not know all the information requested, or because they don't want to receive "welfare". For those clients, we put them on the home delivered program in order to serve them. The requirements for the meals on wheels program are very specific and some people, who are indigent, fall through the cracks. RCNP did a survey three years ago that estimated the per cent of indigent clients as high as 93. This is an approximation and to give a real number to this would be an educated guess to say the least.

4. Cost of services rendered to indigent residents - quarterly and year to date.

The cost of services provided to indigent clients is very difficult to calculate as mentioned in item number two. Using the estimate of 93%, the cost of services to indigent clients is \$77,849.76.

5. Explanation of how requested funds have been spent (direct service costs, indirect costs, etc.)

Town funds are used to help pay for the transportation services that RCNP provides as well as the meals that the elderly and homebound receive. This quarter the amount of Town funds applied to the van service and the meal cost is 33,500. This money helps RCNP serve those people who need the meals in their homes and who enjoy the meals at the Westside Community Center.

# **Derry Planning Board Report**

During the course of this past year the Planning Board has responded to the continuing substantial demands of residential, commercial and industrial development and has attempted to balance those demands with the need to protect and preserve the natural environment. During the year the Planning Board scheduled more than 50 public hearings which were devoted to the review of plans, provided a forum for public input in the planning process, and which were used by the Board to develop proposed ordinances and regulations.

The plans reviewed by the Planning Board consisted of 33 preliminary subdivision plans, 81 final subdivision plans and 50 site plans. After considering the materials provided by applicants, together with relevant information provided by abuttors and the public at large, the Planning Board approved plans which, in aggregate, included 435 lots, 56 multifamily dwelling units and 189 planned residential development units.

In addition to plan review, the Planning Board adopted a number of new regulations and approved and forwarded to the Town Council a number of proposed ordinances. Regulations adopted included Community Water Systems Standards, as proposed by the Department of Public Works, Underground Utilities, As-Built Drawings, and Field Inspections, which inspections are to be provided by an independent engineering firm under the direction of the Department of Public Works. Ordinances approved by the Board and adopted by the Town Council included a Housing Maintenance Code, Earth Removal Ordinance and Water Resources Conservation Zone (Wetlands) Ordinance.

Early in the fiscal year the Planning Board retained the services of an independent consulting engineering firm,

# Derry Historic District Commission Report

The Derry Historic District Commission was one of the towns in the state that took advantage of the Historic Preservation Fund grant-in-aid project through the C.L.G. (Certified Local Government) program.

Commission members and in-kind service volunteers contributed their time in matching fund hours, and with this matching grant it was used in research, training and educational materials for guidelines and ordinances. The Derry Historic District Commission contracted Lynne E. Monroe, a qualified consultant for advice who worked with the Commission on numerous drafts for the protection and maintenance of historical properties, in a series of public workshops. The reason that a Commission was formed under the State R.S.A. requirements was the result of the high interest shown on the Master Plan Survey for the preservation of historic sites and buildings.

I wish to thank all the Commissioners, volunteers and our Town Planner, George Sioras, for their time and efforts in this endeavor.

The engineer provides a written report for each plan that is reviewed, outlining any necessary modifications or corrections. Using the report as an element of its technical review, the Board has been able to devote more of its attention to broader planning issues and has substantially reduced the backlog of applications facing the Board. Late in the year the Board retained a second engineering firm, Kimball Chase Company, to review some of the plans. The taxpayers of Derry will be pleased to know that the cost of plan review is funded entirely from frees paid to the Planning Board by the applicants. The plan review procedcures and on-site field inspections by an independent engineer will substantially enhance the quality of all future development in the Town of Derry.

During the course of the year several changes in the Board membership took place. David Gomez replaced Rodney Bartlett, Mary Ann Edman (formerly an alternate) replaced Kathryn Aranda, Brenda Keith replaced Robert Pullman and Frank Scott was appointed as an alternate. We wish to thank all of those former members for their diligence and hard work as members of the Planning Board and we look forward to working with their very capable replacements.

The Town of Derry is indeed fortunate to have George Sioras as Town Planner and Jeanne Owen as Planning Board Clerk. These individuals provide the continuity which is so important to the planning process. Additionally, all of the members of the Board are to be commended for their many hours of dedicated service to the Town of Derry.

# **Public Works Department Report**

The 1988 fiscal year was an extremely busy and hectic time for the Public Works Department. Major personnel changes took place within the Department including the Public Works Director and Administrative staff. The impact of the loss of these key personnel was lessened by an outstanding effort from the rest of the Department. The housing boom of the last few years slowed, however, major capital improvement projects began to take up the slack in department activity.

Capital Projects construction included the first year of the Town's Roadway Management Program.

East Broadway and Folsom Road were reconstructed which included new sidewalks, curbing, new stormwater drainage systems and improvements within the water and sewer systems. Kendall Pond Road, W. Broadway, Crystal Avenue, Elm Street and James Street were resurfaced as part of the first construction season of the program. Planning and final design were completed for the FY89 Program which will include reconstruction of Pinekrton Street, Scobie Pond Road and Old Manchester Road.

The planning, coordination and construction effort for the Roadway Management Program has shown that the Department is a very effective and professional organization. Citizens should feel confident that the Roadway Management Program will continue to improve the Town's roadway system at the lowest possible costs.

The other major capital improvement during FY88 occured in the Water Division to answer the call of citizens from the Scobie Pond Road and Emerald Drive areas who experienced radon in their private or community well sources. The construction of a 4 mile long water system was completed in record time to provide safe drinking water for approximately 250 homes in the area. High praise should be given to the Administration, Mayor's Council, Public Works staff and Citizen's from the affected area for a monumental effort to complete the project.

The Highway Division continued with routine summer and winter maintenance, including snow and ice removal. It should be noted that during a particularly nasty January snowstorm the Highway Department performed in an. outstanding manner under "white-out" conditions. The efforts by these crews are often taken for granted.

The bridges at Bowers Road and Madden Hill were replaced and access for foot traffic and OHRV's provided.

Vehicle Maintenance has continued their good effort in maintaining the fleet. FY88 saw major improvement in qualified personnel maintaining the busy Public Works vehicles.

The Cemetery Division completed the resurfacing of several roadways within the cemetery to provide easier access to gravesites.

Business at the Transfer Station and Landfill continues to keep the department busy. A major effort was made to eliminate suspected illegal dumping from out-of-town residents and rubbish haulers. This resulted in a substantial reduction in rubbish dumped at the Transfer Station.

The Water Division continued with its new hydrant replacement and upgrading program by installing 25 new fire hydrants within the existing distribution system. This effort has improved fire protection in several areas within the Town. An important water main loop was completed near the Hood Junior High and Grinnell School. This work has improved fire protection and water service in the entire area.

The Wastewater Division began work on the first phase of the Beaver Lake and Sunset Acres sewer expansion projects by completing the Beaver Brook II Sewer Interceptor. The bidding process was completed in FY88 for the new Septage Receiving Facility. Work for this project will begin in the Fall of 1988.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the Town Departments for the cooperation given to me during the transition after Mr. Rodney Bartlett left the Town of Derry. Additionally, I would like to inform the residents of Derry that the Department will continue to strive towards the goal of providing an efficient and effective Public Works organization.

# **Animal Control Department Report**

This department has come a long, long way since this Animal Control Officer got her first glimpse of the animal shelter in May 1974. It was, to say the least, a shock! The job had always been part time, so there wasn't much thought given to the building, or the department as a whole. There were fewer people and dogs back then and I think the person who was the "Dog Officer" was an after thought. As the Town grew, so did the Animal Control Department out of necessity. The kennel building was repaired, cleaned up, heat added, and a phone was installed out back with the dogs, which is where my "office" was as well. Record keeping was brought up to date and on the whole the department became more efficient. In 1977 drainage was added to stop the flow of kennel discharge from going out on to the ground. In 1981 a new office was built onto the kennel, which enabled the animal control officer to conduct business in a more efficient. quieter and less "oderific" atmosphere. In July 1986 the assistant to the animal control officer. Marlene Bishop came on board as a full time deputy, and gave us two more legs to put on a par with the four-legged "people" we have to chase, from time to time. In 1986 the dog licenses went computerized in this department which makes the job of keeping track of unlicensed dogs easier. There are a few glitches left in the system, but it will be worked out. I might add at this time, the computer was not purchased with taxpayer money.

In July of 1987 a new van was purchased for this department which freed the animal control officer from having to use a personal car, which was less than efficient and fast becoming a rust bucket. The van has helped us cut down on trips back and forth to the same area because we can pick up more dogs at the same time now. It looks more professional and is easily recognized as an official vehicle.

At long last, this July 1988, a whole new kennel is now in progress, being built across the brook from where the old one now exists. It's been designed with efficiency, comfort and safety in mind, for both the dogs and the personnel. It surely won't be a palace, but it will be "thome" to any dog found to be off its property without its owner or a keeper present.

We also started night patrols, at random times and places, and it has proved to be quite effective in most areas. There will always be the irresponsible dog owner who lets their dog run loose, no matter what we do.

Now to the statistics for the year. We received 3,494 phone calls that we logged in the call book. Some of our calls are just for information only and are not logged in. We picked up 307 dogs, and of that number, 216 were returned to their owners, 43 were adopted, because their owners didn't call for them within the 7 days we are required by the state to hold them. and 40 were euthanized because they were unadoptable. We chased many, many dogs home and issued nuisance abatements with fines to the owners on the spot instead of picking them up. Cars ran over 34 of your dogs during the year, some survived, some did not. Loving household pets killed 6 ducks, 1 goose and 2 lambs during the year. We collected \$5,166.00 in kennel fees. We issued 87 warnings, 124 nuisance abatements, with fines, 175 license orders, and 19 summons to people who were in violation of the dog control laws. There were 28 dog bites reported, some of which were extremely serious.

We rescued a fat cat that was wedged in a tree and couldn't move. We received an assist from a contractor who was working in the arca with a ladder. We also rescued a cat trapped behind a cement stairway. Both cats survived and went on their merry way. The fat cat had to be treated by a vet first however.

We removed several raccoons from chimneys, dumpsters, attics and other various places. We rescued three baby skunks that had gone for a dip in neighborhood pools in the area. Fify two cruelty cases were investigated, and with the help of the newly reorganized volunteer Greater Derry Humane Society, they were resolved. Our adoption program has been very successful this year, and again we were assisted by the Humane Society.

The Londonderry Animal Control Department got an assist from this department in the capture of a young bull that had escaped its field. It was a three ring circus, but ended well with the tranquilized animal being returned to its owner intact, though a bit weary.

As always we take this opportunity to extend thanks to all of the other town departments who have helped us through the year. We especially thank all of the men and women in the Derry Police Department who are always there when we get in a jam.

We thank the many people of our town who have donated canned food and bedding for our impounded pets. Most of all thanks to the many people who call just to say "THANK YOU" to us. That means more to us than anything else. That's such a welcome thing to hear in the midst of all the complaining and screaming that we get from time to time.

We strive to help and do the best we can for everyone, but in this line of work not everyone is happy with us. We understand peoples' frustrations and will continue to do our very best. We are human and we do get "down", so a good word from those we serve is always welcome. We thank you all.

As most of you know the Town has under taken a Revaluation Project. Cole Layer Trumble Company of Dayton, Ohio and Vernon, Connecticut have been chosen for the task. Field work (the Data Collection process) began in earnest in the early spring months of 1988. As many as 9 company individuals were sent into the neighborhoods to inspect and measure the properties in Town. As of this writing (July 1988) approximately 40% of the field work for this project has been completed. The actual value setting process will not begin until early to late fall of this year.

Interior inspections of all structures should be performed. If a property owner is not at home during the Data Collectors first visit a second visit will be made. If no entry is gained on the second visit the company in conjunction with this office will forward a notice to the property owner requesting he/she call and schedule an appointment, if he/she desires. Please remember interior inspections should be done throughout the structure. No one can force you to allow us on the premises. Our aim is to collect as much pertinent data as possible to assist us in equitably establishing a fair and just value for all the property in Town. Just remember when you purchased your property, one of the first things you did was . . . schedule an appointment to see it. You are "the King/Oueen of your Castle" as far as we are concerned. If you have any questions you may call the "CLT" office at 432-2061, located in the basement of the Adams Memorial Building on West Broadway, You may also call this office at 432-6104, we will assist you as best we can.

Values according to state law will be based on market value (RSA 75:1 property "Shall" be appraised "at its full and true value in money . . . ") and by universally accepted appraisal methods. The project calls for complete computerization of these values, which is now in the beginning stages. 1 fully expect that the Town will be able to periodically update its values without the high cost of hiring an outside company once this project is behind us.

This project is the single most important project for this Department. Over the past few months it has consumed much of our time. It will continue to consume a good portion of our time in the months to come. The major reason for the project is to achieve equity in ASSESSMENTS throughout the Town. If we all cooperate, I believe this can be achieved in great degree.

The State Legislature has passed a bill which allows municipalities to change the exemption levels (amounts) for the Elderly Exemption (RSA 72-43-h). Due to the revaluation project I have recommended to the Mayor and Council that these levels increase. The Mayor and Council have held all hearings necessary to implement the new exemption amounts. These amounts will be effective for the April 1, 1989 tax year. Anyone who currently receives the elderly exemption will not have to re-apply. Those who have questions about qualifying for this or any other exemption may call our office or come by. The qualifications for the exemptions have not changed.

Current Use Accounts have kept us busy again as many of these have been assessed the current use change tax and those parcels are now developed or under development. There were no new applications received for Current Use as of April 15 1988. Over the years the total number of current use accounts has decreased; i.e. 1985 - 296 accounts, 1986 - 289 accounts, 1987 - 275 accounts, and for 1988 - 261 accounts.

Listed below are some office statistics covering the past 12 months with a comparison with previous years:

- Real estate transfers 1,602 for 1988, 1,980 for 1987, 1,844 for 1986, (1985 - 1,400)
- Mortgage deeds (all types) 3,532 for 1988, 4,445 for 1987, 3,433 for 1986, (1985 - 2,054).
- The sub-division plans are now processed and filed. Because of this we can use taxable account figure as a comparison - 9,724 for 1988, 9,430 for 1987, 8,747 for 1986, (1985-8, 186 and 1981-6,300).
- Resident tax accounts 18,551 for 1988, 18,016 for 1987, 16,725 for 1986, (1985-14,961). These figures reflect those billed on the original warrant issued in August of 1988.
- 5. For 1987 there are:
  - A. 1,255 qualified veterans exemptions (all categories).
  - B. 155 qualified elderly exemptions.
  - C. 9 qualified blind exemptions.

The Towns total net taxable value for 1987 was \$526,339,200 as reported to the State Department of Revenue Administration on their Summary Inventory of Valuation form MS-1. Total net taxable value to be reported to the State for 1988 is \$549,500,000 (reported in September some changes may yet occur). This is a \$23,106,080 or approximately a 4% net increase for 1988 over 1987 (87 over 86 was 8%).

In conclusion I would like to thank my staff for a job well done through another busy year. Also, thanks go to the various town departments and concerned citizens for their assistance and insights. Looking forward to a productive fiscal year 1988-89.

# THE DERRY TOWN CHARTER as Proposed by The Derry Charter Commission for the Consideration of the Voters at the Election of November 6, 1984

#### Article 1

#### Incorporation; Short Title; Power

#### Section 1-1 Incorporation

The inhabitants of the Town of Derry, New Hampshire, within the limits established by law, shall continue to be a body corporate and politic under the name "Town of Derry". Section 1-2 Short Title

This instrument shall be known, and may be cited as the Derry Town Charter.

#### Section 1-3 Form of Government

The administration of the fiscal, prudential, and municipal affairs of the town, with the government thereof; shall be vested in an executive branch, to consist of the Mayor, the Trustees of Trust Funds, the MacGregor Library Trustees, the Taylor Library Trustees, Supervisors of the Check List and the Moderator, and a Legislative Branch, to consist of the Town Council. No member of the Town Council, excepting the Mayor, nor any committee thereof, shall take any part in the conduct of the administrative business of the Town.

#### Section 1-4 Powers of the Municipality

Subject only to express limitations on the exercise of any power or function by a municipality in the constitution or the statutes of the State of New Hampshire, it is the intent and the purpose of the voters of Derry, through the adoption of the Charter to secure for the Town all powers it is possible to secure under the constitution and the statutes of the State of New Hampshire, as fully and as completely as though each such power were specifically and individually enumerated herein.

#### Section 1-5 Construction

The powers of the municipality under the Charter are to be construed liberally in favor of the Town, and the specific mention of particular powers is not intended to limit in any way the general powers of the municipality as stated in section 1-4.

#### Section 1-6 Intergovernmental Relations

Subject only to express limitations in the construction of the State Statutes, the Town may exercise any of its powers or perform any of its functions, and may participate in the financing thereof, jointly or in cooperation, by contract or otherwise, with the State of New Hampshire, or any political sub-division or agency thereof, or the United States Government or any agency thereof.

#### Article 2 Legislative Branch

#### Section 2-1 Composition; Eligibility; Election and Term

(a) Composition - There shall be a Town Council consisting of six members and the Mayor which shall exercise the legislative powers of the Town. There shall be four (4) districts. One Councillor shall be elected from each of these districts. The remaining two (2) Councillors shall be elected at large.

(b) Eligibility - Only voters who at all times during their term of office shall be and remain residents of the town, or district in the case of District Councillors, shall be eligible to hold the office of Councillor. To be eligible for election to the office of Councillor a candidate must be and have been a resident of the town for at least one calendar year before election, and if seeking the office of District Councillor a resident of the district which he wishes to represent. Anyone who is a candidate for the office of Councillor must indicate to the Town Clerk whether it is the At Large or District seat which is sought.

(c) Election and Term - The term of office of all members of the Town Council elected shall be for three (3) years, all beginning on the first day in January after their election and until their successors are qualified. This paragraph is subject to the provision of paragraph 10-7(b).

#### Section 2-2 Organization

After the Councillors elect have been sworn, the Town Council shall be called together by the Mayor who shall preside. The Town Council shall then elect, from among its members, a Council President to serve at the pleasure of the Town Council. The Mayor shall preside at all meetings of the Town Council, and perform such other functions as may be assigned by the Charter, by ordinance or by vote of the Town Council. The President of the Council shall act as chairperson of the Council during the absence or disability of the Mayor.

#### Section 2-3 Compensation: Expenses

The Town Council shall establish an annual salary and expense allowance for its members.

No increase in such salary or expense allowance shall be effective however, unless it shall have been adopted by a twothirds vote of the full council. The new salary and expense schedule is to become part of the next budget process. However no Councillor who was in office shall receive any benefit of the new schedule during their present term of office.

#### Section 2-4 General Powers and Duties

Except as otherwise provided by law or by the Charter, all legislative powers of the Town shall be vested in the Town Council which shall provide for their exercise and for the performance of all duties and obligations imposed on the Town by law.

#### Section 2-5 Prohibitions

Except as otherwise provided by law, the Councillors shall not, while holding office, hold any other town office or position. A former Councillor shall not hold any compensated appointive town office or town employment until one year after the expiration of his service.

#### Section 2-6 Filling of Vacancies

If a vacancy occurs in the office of Councillor whether by failure to elect or otherwise, the remaining Councillors shall, within twenty-one (21) days following the date such vacancy is declared to exist, act to fill the said vacancy. The Council shall choose from among the voters, an acting Councillor eligible to hold the office to serve until the next election. If such choice is not made within twenty-one (21) days, the choice shall be made by the Mayor. Any person so chosen shall be sworn and commence to serve forthwith. The Council shall declare a vacancy when a Councillor dies, resigns or ceases to be a resident of the town or his district. The Council may declare a vacancy when in its judgment a member is guilty of malfeasance, misfeasance or dereliction of duty of non attendance at council meetings.

#### Section 2-7 Exercise of Powers; Quorum; Rules of Procedure

(a) Exercise of Powers - Except as otherwise prohibited by law or the Charter, the legislative powers of the Town Council may be exercised in a manner determined by it.

(b) Quorum - The majority of the full Town Council shall constitute a quorum. The affirmative vote of a majority of the full Town Council shall be necessary to adopt any appropriation order. Except as otherwise provided by law or the Charter, any other motion or measure may be adopted by a majority vote of those present.

(c) Rules of Procedure - The Town Council shall from time to time establish rules for its proceedings. Regular meetings of the Town Council shall be held at a time and place fixed by ordinance but which shall be not less frequent than once monthly. Special meetings of the Town Council may be held on the call of the Mayor or on the call of any three or more members, by written notice delivered to the place or residence or business of each member at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the time set. Except as otherwise authorized by law all sessions of the Town Council shall be open to the public. Every matter coming before the Town Council for action shall be put to a vote, the result of which shall be duly recorded.

#### Section 2-8 Council Staff

(a) Clerk of the Council - The clerk of the council shall be the Town Clerk. The clerk of the council shall give notice of all meetings of the Town Council to its members and to the public, keep a record of its proceedings and perform such duties as may be assigned by the Charter, by ordinance, or by other vote of the Town Council.

# Section 2-9 Measures; Emergency Measures; Charter Objection

(a) In General - No measure shall be passed finally on the date on which it is introduced, except in cases of emergency involving the health or safety of the people or their property. Except as otherwise provided by the Charter, every adopted measure shall become effective at the expiration of thirty (30) days after adoption or at any later date specified therein. Measures not subject to referendum may become effective upon adoption. No ordinance shall be amended or repealed except by another ordinance adopted in accordance with the Charter, or as provided in the initiative and referendum procedures.

(b) Emergency Measures - An emergency measure shall be introduced in the form and manner prescribed for measures generally except that it shall be plainly designated as an emergency measure and shall contain statements after the enacting clause declaring that an emergency exists and describing its scope and nature in clear and specific terms. A preamble which declares and defines the emergency shall be separately voted on and shall require the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the full Town Council. An emergency measure shall be passed without amendment or rejected at the meeting at which it is introduced. No measure making a grant, renewal or extension, whatever its kind or nature, of any franchise or special privilege shall be passed as an emergency measure, and except as provided by law relating to utility lines, no such grant, renewal or extension shall be made otherwise than by ordinance. After its adoption, an emergency measure shall be published as prescribed for other adopted measures. It shall become effective upon adoption or at such time as it may specify.

(c) Charter. Objection - On the first occasion that the question on adoption of a measure is put to the Town Council, if a single member objects to the taking of the vote, the vote shall be postponed until the next meeting of the Town Council whether regular or special. If two (2) or more members shall join the member in objection, such postponement shall be until the next regular meeting. This procedure shall not be used more than once for any agenda item. Any item once postponed may not be further postponed under this section. The Charter objection privilege is not available when considering an emergency measure.

#### Section 2-10 Delegation of Powers

The Town Council may delegate to one or more town agencies, the powers vested in the Town Council by the laws of the State of New Hampshire to grant and issue licenses and permits, and may regulate the granting and issuing of licenses, and permits by any such town agency, and may in its discretion, rescind any such delegation without prejudice to any prior action which has been taken.

#### Section 2-11 Inquiries and Investigations

The Town Council may require any elected or appointed town officer or employee, official appointed or confirmed by the Council, or member of an elected town board or elected town commission to appear before it, and give such information as it may require in relation to his office, its function, and performance. The Town Council shall give at least forty-eight (48) hours written notice of the general scope of the inquiry which is to be made to any person it shall require to appear before it under this section.

The Town Council may make investigations into the affiars of the town and into the conduct of any town agency, and for this purpose may administer oaths and require the production of evidence.

#### Article 3 Executive Branch

#### Section 3-1 Executive Power

The executive power of the Town shall be vested in a Mayor.

#### Section 3-2 Election and Qualifications of Mayor

(a) Election - The Mayor shall be elected at the regular town election every three (3) years by direct vote of the people for a term of three (3) years to begin on the first day of January after his election but the incumbent Mayor shall continue until his successor has been elected and has taken office.

(b) **Qualifications** - In order to qualify for Mayor a voter must meet all provisions of Article 2, section 2-1(b).

#### Section 3-4 Authority and Duties

The Mayor shall be the Executive Officer of the Town and be responsible to the voters for the administration of all town affairs placed in his charge by or under this Charter. He shall have the following authorization and duties:

(a) He shall preside over the Council and attend Council meetings and take an active part in the meeting. He shall vote on all matters he deems necessary.

(b) Except as otherwise provided by this Charter, the Mayor shall appoint upon merit and fitness alone, and may remove, subject to the provisions of pertinent statutes where applicable, all board members and commission members.

(c) The Mayor shall appoint the following positions, subject to the approval of the Council:

1. Town Administrator

2. Town Clerk

(d) Vacancy of Office - The Council shall declare a vacancy when a Mayor dies, resigns, is convicted of a felony, ceases to be a resident of the Town or the provisions of section 3-4 (e) are met.

In case of a vacancy the Council President will assume the duties of the Mayor until a new Mayor is elected. Procedure for electing an interim Mayor will be:

 The Council will order the Town Clerk to hold a special election to elect a Mayor for the balance of the term which is vacant. Said election is to be held within ninety (90) days from date the vacancy was declared. If a regular town election is scheduled within one hundred-twenty (120) days of the vacancy declaration, then there will not be a special election.

(c) Absence or Disability - By letter filed with the Town Clerk the Mayor shall designate a Council Member to exercise the powers and perform the duties of Mayor, except that of presiding over the Council, during his temporary absence or disability. Upon his return to duty the Mayor shall so notify the Town Clerk and Council. If disability or absence continues unabated for sixty (60) days, the Council shall declare the office of Mayor vacant and invoke the provisions outlined in section 3-4(d).

(f) Compensation and Expenses - The Mayor's compensation and expenses shall be established in the same manner as provided for in section 2-3.

#### Section 3-5 Prohibitions

The Mayor shall not, while holding office, hold any other town office or position. A former Mayor shall not hold any compensated appointive town office or town employment until one (1) year after the expiration of his or her service.

#### Section 3-6 Town Administrator Appointment; Qualifications, Term

The Mayor shall appoint a Town Administrator subject to the approval of a majority of the full Council for a three (3) year term or less and fix his compensation. The Town Administrator shall be appointed solely on the basis of his qualifications. He shall be a person especially fitted by education, training, or previous experience in public or private administration which qualify him to perform the duties of the office. He need not be a resident of the Town or of the State of New Hampshire at the time of his appointment but he must establish residence within a period fixed by the Mayor. He shall devote full time to the office and shall not hold any other public office, elective or appointive, nor engage in any other business or occupation during his term unless approved by Mayor and Council.

Any vacany in the office of the Town Administrator shall be filled as soon as possible by the Mayor, and meanwhile he shall appoint a suitable person as Temporary Town Administrator to perform the duties of the office. Such temporary appointment may not exceed three (3) months but one additional renewal may be made by the Mayor not to exceed a second three (3) months. Compensation for such person shall be set by the Town Council.

#### Section 3-7 Authority and Duties

The Town Administrator shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of the Town and be responsible to the Mayor for the administration of all town affairs placed in his charge by or under this Charter. He shall have the following authority and duties:

(a) He shall supervise and direct the administration of all departments, commissions, board and offices, except the Town Council, Zoning Board of Appeals, the Planning Board, Trustees of the Trust Funds, MacGregor Library Trustees, Taylor Library Trustees, Town Clerk, Moderator and Supervisors of the Check List.

(b) Except as otherwise provided by this Charter, the Town Administrator shall appoint upon merit and fitness alone, and may remove subject to the provisions of pertinent/ statutes where applicable, all officers and employees of the Town. Officers and employees who report directly to the Town Administrator shall be confirmed by the Mayor.

(c) The Town Administrator shall fix the compensation of all town officers and employees appointed by him within the limits established by existing appropriations.

(d) He shall have full jurisdiction over the rental and use of all town facilities under his control. He shall be responsible for the maintenance and repair of all town property under his control.

(e) He shall keep a full and complete inventory of all property of the town, both real and personal.

(f) He shall be responsible for purchasing all supplies, material and equipment for all departments and activities of the town.

#### Section 3-8 Acting Town Administrator

(a) Whenever by reason of sickness, absence from the town or other unexpected cause, the Town Administrator shall be unable to perform the duties of his office for a period of three (3) successive working days or more, the Mayor shall appoint an Acting Town Administrator.

(b) Powers of Acting Town Administrator - The acting Town Administrator shall have all the powers of the Town Administrator except that he shall not make any permanent appointment nor removal to or from any office unless the disability of the Town Administrator shall have continued sixty (60) days or more without having resigned.

#### Section 3-9 Removal of Town Administrator

The Mayor may remove the Town Administrator from office at will.

#### Article 4 Financial Procedures

Section 4-1 Submission of Budget; Budget Message Not later than 120 days prior to the beginning of the succeeding fiscal year, the Mayor shall submit to the Clerk of the Council a proposed budget for the ensuing fiscal year which shall provide a complete financial plan of all town funds and activities for the ensuing fiscal year, and accompanying budget message, and supporting documents, including the estimated effect of the proposed budget on the tax rate.

The message of the Mayor shall explain the budget for all town agencies both in fiscal terms and in terms of work programs. It shall outline the proposed financial policies of the Town for the ensuing fiscal year, describe the important features of the budget, indicate any major changes from the current fiscal year in financial policies, expenditures and revenues together with the reasons for such changes; summarize the Town's debt position and include such other material as the Mayor deems desirable or the Town Council may reasonably require.

#### Section 4-2 Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Town shall begin July I and run through until the succeeding June 30.

#### Section 4-3 Action on the Budget

(a) Public Hearing - The Town Council shall publish in one or more newspapers of general circulation in the town the general summary of the proposed budget as submitted by the Mayor by a notice stating: (1) the times and places where copies of the proposed budget are available for inspection by the public, and (2) the date, time and place not less than two (2) weeks after such publication, when a public hearing on said proposed budget will be held by the Town Council.

(b) Appropriation of the Budget - The Town Council shall enact the budget, with or without amendments, within sixty (60) days following the date the budget is filed with the Clerk of the Council. In amending the budget, it may delete, decrease, increase or add any programs or amounts except it may not decrease expenditures required by law or for debt service.

If the Town Council fails to take action with respect to any item in the budget within sixty (60) days after receipt of the budget, such amount shall, without any action by the Town Council become a part of the budget for the year, and be available for the purposes specified.

### Section 4-4 Capital Improvement Program

(a) Submission - The Mayor shall prepare and submit annually to the Town Council a five-year capital improvement program at least thirty (30) days prior to the final date for submission of the operating budget.

(b) Contents - The capital improvement program shall include: (1) a clear summary of its contents; (2) a list of all capital improvements proposed to be undertaken during the next five (5) fiscal years with supporting data; (3) cost estimates, method of financing, and recommended time schedules; and (4) the estimated annual cost of operating and maintaining the facilities included. The above information shall be revised and estended each year.

(c) Public Hearing - The Town Council shall publish in one or more newspapers of general circulation in the town the general summary of the capital improvement program and a notice stating: (1) the times and places where copies of the capital improvements program are available for inspection by the public; and, (2) the date, time and place not less than two weeks after such publication, when a public hearing on said program will be held by the Town Council. (d) Adoption - After the public hearing and on or before sixty (60) days prior to the ensuing fiscal year, the Town Council shall be resolution adopt the capital improvement program with or without amendment, provided that each amendment must be voted separately and that any increase in the capital improvement progra as submitted must clearly identify the method of financing proposed to accomplish this increase.

# Section 4-5 Provision for Outside Audit and Audit Committee

At least annually an outside audit of the books and accounts shall be made. The Mayor shall provide for such an audit to be made by a public accountant, certified public accountant, or firm of such accountants, who have no personal interests, direct or indirect, in the fiscal affairs of the town government or of any of its affairs or employees.

#### Section 4-6 Chief Financial Officer Obtaining Three (3) Quotes from Banks

The Treasurer shall obtain not less than three (3) quotes on interest rates from separate corporate financial institutions when borrowing or investing town funds an shall file such records of transaction with the Town Council. This section does not pertain to bond issues.

#### Article 5 Judicial and Administrative Boards

#### Section 5-1 Administrative Boards

(a) Planning Board - There shall be a Planning Board appointed in accordance with RSA 673.

B) Housing and Redevelopment Authority - There shall be a Housing and Redevelopment Authority consisting of five (5) members appointed by the Mayor for terms of five (5) years.

(c) Conservation Commission - There shall be a Conservation Commission consisting of five (5) members appointed by the Mayor for terms of three (3) years.

(d) **Trustees of Trust Funds** - There shall be a board of three (3) Trustees of Trust Funds who shall be elected for terms of three (3) years. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment of the Mayor for the unexpired term.

(e) MacGregor Library Trustees - There shall be a board of six (6) Trustees of the MacGregor Library who shall be elected for terms of three (3) years. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment of the Mayor for the unexpired term.

(f) Taylor Library Trustees - There shall be a board of six (6) Trustees of the Taylor Library who shall be elected for terms of three (3) years. Vacancies shall be fiiled by appointment of the Mayor for the unexpired term.

(g) Other Administrative Boards and Committees - Other administrative boards and committees may be established by the Mayor for a period not to exceed one (1) year.

#### Section 5-2 Judicial Boards

(a) Zoning Board of Adjustment - There shall be a Zoning. Board of Adjustment consisting of five (5) members each serving a three (3) year term and three (3) alternates each serving a three (3) year term appointed by the Mayor subject to the approval of the Council.

#### Section 5-2 Judicial Boards

(a) Zoning Board of Adjustment - There shall be a Zoning Board of Adjustment consisting of five (5) members each serving a three (3) year term and three (3) alternates each serving a three (3) year term appointed by the Mayor subject to the approval of the Council.

(b) Personnel Review Board - The Personnel Review Board shall be appointed by the Mayor and approved by the Council. There shall be three (3) members holding no municipal employment or office, and each shall be appointed Town shall indemnify any such officer or member for expenses or damages incurred in the defense or settlement of a claim against him which arose while acting in good faith within the scope of his official duties or employment, but only to the extent and subject to the limitations imposed by law.

#### Section: 9-5 Prohibition

(a) No member of the executive or legislative branch shall appear as counsel before any agency of the Town of Derry.

(b) Financial Interest - Any Town officer or employee who has a substantial financial interest, direct or indirect or by reason of ownership of stock in any corporation, in any contract with the Town or in the sale of any land, material, supplies or services to the Town or to a contractor supplying the Town shall make known that interest and shall refrain from voting upon or otherwise participating in his capacity as a Town officer or employee in the making of such sale or in the making or performance of such contract. Any Town officer or employee who willfully conceals such a substantial financial interest or willfully violates the requirements of this section shall be guilty of malfeasance in office or position and shall forfeit his office or position. Violation of this section with the knowledge express or implied of the person or corporation contracting with or making a sale to the Town shall render the contract or sale voidable by the Mayor or the Town Council.

#### (c) Activities Prohibited

 No person shall be appointed to or removed from, or in any way favored or discriminated against with respect to any Town position or appointive Town administrative office because of race, sex, political or religious opinions or affiliations.

2. No person shall willfully make any false statement, certificate, mark, rating or report in regard to any test, certification or appointment under the provisions of this Charter or the rules and regulations made thereunder, or in any manner commit or attempt to commit any fraud preventing the impartial execution of such provisions, rules and regulations.

3. No person who seeks appointment or promotion with respect to any Town position or appointive Town administrative office shall directly or indirectly give, render or pay any money, service or other valuable thing to any person for or in connection with his test, appointment, proposed appointment, promotion or proposed promotion.

4. No person who runs for Town office shall orally, by letter or otherwise solicit or assist in soliciting any assessment, subscription or contribution for any political party or political purpose whatever from any person holding any compensated appointive Town position.

#### Section 9-6 Severability

If any provision of the Charter is held invalid, the other provisions of the Charter shall not be affected thereby. If the application of the Charter or any of its provisions to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the application of the Charter and its provisions to other persons and circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

#### Section 9-7 Specific Provsions Shall Prevail

To the extent that any specific provision of the Charter will conflict with any provisions expressed in the Charter in general terms, the specific provision shall prevail.

#### Section 9-8 References to General Laws

All references to the general laws contained in the Charter refer to the general laws of the State of New Hampshire and are intended to include any amendments or revisions to such chapters and sections or to include any amendments or revisions to such chapters and sections or to the corresponding chapters and sections or any rearrangement of the general laws enacted subsequent to the adoption of the Charter.

#### Section 9-9 Removals and Suspensions

(a) General - Any appointed officer or full-time salaried employee of the town, not subject to the provisions of the State Civil Service Law, whether appointed for a fixed or an indefinite term, may be suspended or removed from office by the appointing authority for good cause. The term cause shall include, but not be limited to, the following: incapacity other than temporary illness, inefficiency, insubordination and conduct unbecoming the office.

(b) Suspension - Any appointed officer or full-time salaries employee of the Town may be suspended from office by the appointing authority if such action is deemed necessary to protect the interest of the Town. However, no suspension shall be for more than fifteen (15) days.

Suspension may be coterminious with the removal and shall not interfere with the rights of the officer or employee under the removal procedure given below.

(c) Removal - The appointing authority when removing any such officer or employee shall act in accordance with the following procedure:

 A written notice of the intent to remove and a statement of the cause or causes therefor shall be delivered by certified mail to the last known address of the person sought to be removed.

2. Within five (5) days of delivery of such notice the officer or employee may request a public or closed hearing to be held by the Personnel Review Board at which he may be represented by counsel, who shall be entitled to present evidence, call witnesses and to question any witness appearing at the hearing. Such hearings shall be conducted under the rules of evidence.

3. Between one (1) and ten (10) days after the public or closed hearing is adjourned, the Personnel Review Board shall direct the appointing authority to act by either removing the officer or employee or notifying the officer or employee that the notice of intent to remove has been rescinded.

4. After delivery of this notice of intent to remove, if the officer or employee fails to request a hearing, the appointing authority shall either remove the officer or employee or notify him that the notice has been rescinded.

Nothing in this section shall be construed as granting a right to such a hearing to a person who holds a position for a fixed term, when his term expires.

#### Section 9-10 Procedures

(a) Meetings - All multiple member bodies of the Town whether elected or appointed or otherwise constituted, shall meet regularly at such times and public places within the Town as they may prescribe. Except in emergencies, special meetings of any multiple member body shall be held on the call of the respective chairperson or by one-third of the members thereof by written notice delivered to the residence or place of business of each member at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the time set. A copy of the said notice shall also be posted on the Town bulletin board (s). Special meetings of any multiple member body shall also be called within one week after the date of the filing with the Town Clerk of a petition by at least one hundred (100) voters which states the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is to be called. Except in cases of emergency as otherwise authorized by the general laws, all meetings of all multiple member bodies shall be open and public; however, the multiple member body may meet in a closed or executive session as permitted by RSA 91A.

(b) Agenda - Except in cases of emergency at least fortyeight (48) hours before any meeting of a multiple member body is to be held, an agenda containing all items which are scheduled to come before it at the meeting shall be posted. No action taken on a matter not included in the posted agenda shall be effective unless the body first adopts by special vote a resolution declaring that an emergency exists and that the particular matter must be acted upon at that meeting for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, safety or convenience of the town.

(c) Rules and Minutes - Each multiple member body shall determine its own rules and order of business unless otherwise provided by the Charter or by law. The Town Clerk or his designee shall take and keep the minutes of the respective proceedings. These rules and minutes, excepting as provided for in RSA 91A, shall be a public record kept available in a place convenient to the public at all times and certified copies shall be kept available in the Town Clerk's office.

(d) Voting - Except on procedural matters all votes of all multiple member bodies shall be taken by a call of the roll and the ayes and nays shall be recorded in the minutes, provided, however, that if the vote is unanimous only that fact need be recorded.

(e) Quorum - A majority of the members of a multiple member body shall constitute a quorum, but a smaller number may adjourn from time to time and compel the attendance of the absent members in the manner and subject to the penaltics prescribed by the rules of the body. No other action taken by a number of members smaller than the quorum shall be valid or binding.

#### Section 9-11 Definitions

Unless another meaning is clearly apparent from the manner in which the word is used, the following words as used in the Charter shall have the following meanings:

(a) Charter - The word "charter" shall mean this Charter and any amendments to it made through any of the methods provided under RSA 49B.

(b) Days - The word "days" shall refer to calendar days.

(c) Emergency - The word "emergency" shall mean a sudden, unexpected, unforseen happening, occurrence or condition which necessitates immediate action.

(d) Full Town Council - The words "full Town Council" shall mean the six (6) councilors and the Mayor.

(c) Initiative Measure - The words "initiative measure" shall mean a measure proposed by initiative procedures under the charter, including a specific item in a Town budget but excluding:

1. proceeding relating to the organization or operation of the Town Council;

2. an emergency measure passed in conformity with the Charter;

3. the Town budget as a whole;

4. tax anticipation notes;

5. an appropriation for the payment of the Town debts or obligations;

6. any appropriation of funds necessary to implement a written agreement executed relating to collective bargaining;

7. any proceeding or part thereof, relating to the election, employment, appointment, suspension, transfer, demotion, removal or discharge of any Town officer or employee;

8. any proceeding repealing or rescinding a measure, or a part thereof, which is protested by referendum procedures.

(f) Majority Vote - The words "majority vote" shall mean a majority of those present and voting, provided, that a quorum of the body is present.

(g) Measure - The word "measure" shall mean an ordinance passed or which could be passed by the Town Council or an order, resolution, vote or other proceeding passed or which could be passed by the Town Council.

(h) Multiple Member Body - The words "multiple member body" shall mean any body consisting of two or more persons, whether elected, appointed or otherwise constituted.

(i) Number and Gender - The singular number may be extended and applied to several persons or things; words imparting the plural number may include the singular; words imparting the masculine gender shall include the feminine gender; and words imparting the feminine gender shall include the masculine gender.

(j) Referendum Measure - The words "referendum measure" shall mean:

 a measure protested by referendum procedures under the Charter, including a specific item in the Town budget, but excluding items 1 through 7 mentioned under the definition, (e) Initiative Measures, or:

2. any proceeding of the Town Council providing for the submission or referral of a matter to the voters at an election.

(k) Town - The word "Town" shall mean the name "Town of Derry".

(1) Town Agency - The words "Town Agency" shall mean any board, commission, committee, department, or office of the Town government.

(m) Voters - The word "Voters" shall mean registered voters of the Town of Derry.

### Article 10

#### **Transitional Provisions**

#### Section 10-1 Continuation

All by-laws, ordinances, resolutions, votes, rules and regulations of the Town which are in force at the time the Charter is adopted, not inconsistent with the provisions of the Charter, shall continue in force until amended or repealed.

Section 10-2 Continuation of Government

All members of Town agencies shall continue to perform their duties until reappointed, reelected, or until successors to their respective positions are duly appointed or elected or their duties have been transferred.

### Section 10-3 Continuation of Personnel

Any person holding an office or position in the administrative service of the Town, or any person serving in the employment of the Town shall retain such office or position and shall continue to perform his duties until provisions shall have been made in accordance with the charter for the performance of the said duties by another person or agency; provided, however, that no person in the permanent full-time service or employment of the Town shall forfeit his pay grade or time in service. All such persons shall be retained in a capacity as similar to their former capacity as is practical.

#### Section 10-4 Transfer of Records and Property

All records, property, and equipment of any Town agency, the powers and duties of which are assigned in whole or part to another Town agency, shall be transferred forthwith to the Town agency to which such powers and duties are assigned.

#### Section 10-5 Effect on Obligations, Taxes and other Legal Acts

All official bonds, recognizances, obligations, contracts and other instruments entered into or executed by or to the Town before its adoption of the Charter; all taxes, special assessments, fines, penalties, forfeitures incurred or imposed, due or owing to the Town, shall be enforced and collected, and all writs, prosecutions, actions and causes of action, except as herein otherwise provided, shall continue without abatement and remain unaffected by the Charter; and no legal act done by or in favor of the Town shall be rendered invalid by the adoption of the Charter.

#### Section 10-6 Salaries

(a) Mayor's Salary - The salary to be paid to the Mayor elected at the first election shall be determined by the Town Council but under no circumstances shall it exceed \$15,000.00 per annum. This salary, if any, shall continue until changed by ordinance under the provisions of Section 3-4(f) of the Charter.

(b) Council Salaries - The salary to be paid to each member of the Town Council elected at first election shall be determined by the Town Council but under no circumstances shall exceed \$1,500.00 per annum. This salary, if any, shall continue until changed by ordinance under the provisions of section 2-3 of the Charter.

#### Section 10-7 Time of Taking Effect

This Charter shall become fully effective on January 1, 1986 but it shall take partial effect in accordance with the following schedule.

(a) The first regular election shall be held in accordance with Artičle 7-1 of this charter on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in November 1985. All of the provisions of the Charter which relate to the conduct of regular Town elections shall take effect as stated in the Charter.

(b) At the first regular election all councillors and the Mayor will be elected and serve the following terms:

I. One At Large Councillor and one District Councillor will serve until December 31, 1986,

II. One At Large Councillor and one District Councillor will serve until December 31, 1987, and

III. Two District Councillors and the Mayor will serve until December 31, 1988.

(c) The powers and duties of the Mayor and Town Council shall become fully effective on the first day of January 1986, but in the meantime, the Selectmen shall prepare for the transition to the new form of government. As part of the transition, the selectmen shall provide for an eighteen (18) month accounting period running from January 1, 1985 thru June 30, 1986 and arrange for the division of the Town into four (4) voting districts. (d) The Town officials in office upon the adoption of this charter shall continue in office until December 31, 1985. There will be no election of Town officials in March of 1985.

(e.) The following Town agencies shall be abolished effective midnight December 31, 1985:

1. The Board of Selectmen

2. The Budget Committee

(f) The following officers and boards shall be appointed rather than elected effective January 1, 1986.

1. Town Clerk

2. Treasurer

3. Tax Collector

4. Planning Board

(g) The Moderator shall continue in office until the Town election in November of 1986 and thereafter be elected in accordance with RSA 40:1.

#### Section 10-8 Expiration of Terms of Office of Continued Boards

Boards which are to continue in operation as described in Article 5 shall have the various terms of office expire as follows:

1. Planning Board, Conservation Commission, Housing and Redevelopment Authority and alternates thereto if any:

A. Terms which would normally expire in 1985 will expire March 31, 1986,

B. Terms which would normally expire in 1986 will expire March 31, 1987,

C. Terms which would normally expire in 1987 will expire March 31, 1988,

D. Terms which would normally expire in 1988 will expire March 31, 1989 and

E. Terms which would normally expire in 1989 will expire March 31, 1990.

2. Other Administrative Boards and Committees: all terms will expire March 31, 1986.

3. Zoning Board of Appeals and alternates thereto:

A. Terms which would normally expire in 1985 and 1986 will expire March 31, 1986,

B. Terms which would normally expire in 1987 and 1988 will expire March 31, 1987 and

C. Terms which would normally expire in 1989 will expire March 31, 1988.

4. Trustees of Trust Funds, MacGregor Library Trustees and Taylor Library Trustees.

A. Terms which would normally expire in March of 1985 will expire on December 31, 1985 with the successor(s) having been elected in November of 1985.

B. Terms which would normally expire in March of 1986 will expire on December 31, 1986 with the successor(s) having been elected in November of 1986.

C. Terms which would normally expire in March of 1987 will expire on December 31, 1987 with the successor(s) having been elected in November of 1987.

#### Section 10.9 Absorption of the East Derry Fire District

If at any time the voters of East Derry vote to dissolve the district, the functions, responsibilities and duties of the district shall become the responsibilities of the Town of Derry. All permanent full time employees of said district will be absorbed into the Derry Fire service in a capacity as similar to their former capacity as is practicable.
