TOWN MEETING WARRANT
The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 14th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all articles except 1, to be considered at seven-thirty in the afternoon.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
2. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriation for the same as set forth in the following budget.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1788.00 for the purpose of uniting with other towns in this area in supporting the work and program of the White Mountain Community Services, Inc.
6. To see if the Town will note to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the White Mountain 93 Association, Ski 93.
7. To see if the Town will vote to accept and maintain a road to be built to subgrade by the Lisbon Development Co., Inc. Said road to lead from residence of Elwin Capron toward US 302 through Development Co. property. (By Petition)
8. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a Town Road and maintain said road, the old county road off from Savageville Road, and extending from the A. Elmore Tyler property to the William Hadley property. Said road passing through land now or formerly of Eric Davis. (By Petition)
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 to make repairs to Town Hall Roof.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty-six Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-nine Dollars (\$46,269.00) for the purpose of financing final plans and specifications for a municipal sewage disposal system, including sewerage, interceptors, pumping station, treatment works and other related facilities, and authorize the expenditure of the same under the direction of the Board of Selectmen.

11. If the Town votes in the affirmative on the preceding Article, to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town the sum of money so raised and appropriated; and for this purpose authorize the issue of serial notes or bonds of the Town under and in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act, R. S. A. 33:8, or any other enabling authority.
12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and direct the Board of Selectmen to take all steps necessary to obtain a special act of the legislature organizing a separate Lisbon Water Department vesting the management, control and direction of the Lisbon water-works system in a board of three commissioners.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7000.00 to purchase a new truck and snowplow.
14. To see if the Town will accept Fire Fighting Help and render assistance requested under the Mutual Aid Program.
15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

As you will note in studying this report our surplus dropped from \$14,220.64, as reported in last year's report, to a surplus of \$7,045.27 as of December 31, 1966. On instruction from the State Tax Commission we found it necessary to abate \$3,203.49 in taxes for the year 1965 and to abate \$4,609.37 for the year 1966. If we had not been forced to abate these excessive taxes our surplus would have increased rather than decreased.

The new truck we are asking for is to replace a truck that is eleven years old and the plow to go with it has been used for 32 years.

Our T.R.A. Program will be completed this summer with the oiling of the Bishop Road.

The Police Cruiser was purchased with a savings of \$750.00 from the amount appropriated.

Unfortunately we had to borrow \$110,000.00 to pay our bills before monies came in. We realize this interest was more than anticipated but we felt the bills should be paid on time.

Old Age Assistance is unusually high this year because the November and December bills of 1965 were included in this years payments.

It has come to light that the past three mortgage tax sales have been illegal and this means that the Town has already lost approximately \$2,300.00.

There was a State Audit which we had no control over, it was insisted upon by the state Tax Commission. As the voters would not except the Town Report or the budget last March this was necessary.

The Chairman of the Board of Selectmen did not finish her term of office and as she did not resign it was impractical to appoint a third member to the board.
