# WARRANT.

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## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Plymouth in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs.*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and one library trustee for the term of three years.

2. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.

3. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the repairs and preservation of highways.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to pay firemen.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate to be used in decorating soldier's graves.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate in addition to that required by law for the support and maintenance of its free public library.

7. To see if the town will vote to discontinue so much of the winter road as was laid across the land of Otis W. Draper.

8. To see if the town will vote to purchase a pair of horses to be owned by the town for the use of the town for highway purposes, and instruct the highway agent to purchase the same to be paid for from the highway money.

9. To see if the town will vote to put electric lights into the library building and light the same.

10. To see if the town will vote to instruct the tax collector to enforce the State law to collect 10 per cent. interest on all taxes not paid before December 1, 1900.

11. To see if the town will vote to give a discount on all taxes paid before September 1, 1900, and if so how much per cent.

12. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to procure the original plan of the Town of Plymouth and to raise or appropriate money for the purpose.

13. To see what additional sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for the town history.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate for school purposes including free text books and supplies.

15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money to pay the debts of the town and give therefor notes of the town countersigned by the Town Treasurer.
