TOWN MEETING WARRANT**State of New Hampshire**

To the inhabitants of the Town of Wentworth, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, in said Wentworth, on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.

3. Article B. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for Construction of the Class II road known as North Dorchester Road, and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$796.50; or will accept State Aid for Construction of Class V roads and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$479.03.

4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Highways and Bridges.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal.

6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the library.

8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the fire engine.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for repairing Town building.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for support of a Doctor.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell either at public auction or private sale to such purchaser and for such price as they may determine any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds, and until such sale is made to administer such property in the interests of the town.

12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

13. To see how much the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for support of town poor.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money if necessary.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

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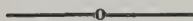

**REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT
OF SCHOOLS**

To the School Board and Citizens of the Wentworth School District:

I hereby submit my fifth annual report as Supt. of Schools.

Three changes have occurred in the teaching staff this year. James Morrill, a graduate of the Keene Normal School is teacher of the Grammar room and Viola Pray, Plymouth Normal graduate of successful experience, is teacher in the primary room. Both these teachers are maintaining the high standards of this school and their cheerful participation in the community life is highly commendable. Ruth Douglass of the Foster School is a graduate of of the Plymouth Normal School and a very promising teacher.

It became evident before school started in the Fall that the village school could not accommodate all the children from the area which it usually does. The increase was due to children moving into the village from another part of the town and other children who are probably not permanent in the district. The situation seeming on the whole temporary and somewhat due to the present economic general condition, it seemed advisable to transport the East Side scholars to the Buffalo School for the present year. The children appear to be happy and to have experi-

enced no setback from the change. Last year a large box stove was installed in this school. The outside toilet should be connected with the building in the summer.

There are 24 pupils of the district enrolled in high schools of the state. Of the 46 children graduating under the present supervision 35 are known to have entered high school. This is a commendable number particularly in view of the fact that children have to secure their secondary school education out of the district.

The Board during the last year held 12 meetings. The finances were conservatively handled. The amounts expended followed closely the amounts approved for state aid and a balance of \$589.36 partly in bank and due from the town was realized at the end of the school year.

The district has reached the point where it must make some plans either to enlarge the village school or build an entire new one. Even with transporting the East Side children to the Buffalo School which is not an altogether ideal situation as to transportation the anticipated enrollment at the village school will exceed even a crowded capacity.

Owing to the present setup of the supervisory union it seemed advisable that the office of the Supt. of Schools be located in Plymouth during the winter months.
