Town of Chichester Population 1970 Census — 1,080 To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the seventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendments of the Constitution proposed by the 1971 session of the General Court shall be approved.

3. To take the sense of the qualified voters on the following questions:

Are you in favor of the adoption of the following amendments as proposed by the Planning Board for the Town Zoning Ordinance as follows?

1.) To delete Par. 3a, Sec. D, Article III of Zoning Ordinances.

"The use of land for trailer park sites operated in accordance with sanitary laws and regulations of the N. H. State Department of Health."

2.) To change Par. 1, Sec. F, Article III to read:

"Every building lot shall have a minimum area of 87,120 square feet (2 acres) with minimum frontage of 150 feet." Where a lot in separate ownership at the time of passage of this amendment does not conform to the area requirements, such lot may be occupied for any use permitted by this ordinance.

3.) To amend Article XI of Zoning Ordinances. (Definitions) Adding:

H. Mobile Home — A single-family dwelling designed for transportation after fabrication on streets and highways on its own wheels or on flatbed or other trailer, and arriving at the site where it is to be occupied as a dwelling complete and ready for occupancy, except for minor and incidental unpacking and assembly operations, location on jacks or permanent foundation, connection to utilities and the like. A travel trailer or a sectional housing is not to be considered a mobile home.

I. *Travel Trailer* — A vehicular, portable structure designed to be used as a temporary dwelling.

J. Sectional Housing — Conventional designed and constructed modules fabricated at a factory and transported to their destination on specially designed vehicles which are not an integral part of the dwelling. The modules are moved from the vehicle onto a permanent foundation and cannot be relocated without major structural modification.

4.) To change sentence three, Par. 3, of Building Regulations and Authorization of a Building Inspector to read:

"A fee of five dollars shall be paid for all permits issued, of which the Building Inspector shall receive two and one half dollars."

4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of current year taxes.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$328.00 for support of the Concord Hospital. (At request of the Hospital)

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1,700.00 as the Town share of the cost of hiring two men to operate the Center Barnstead Ambulance during day time hours only. (At request of the Barnstead Fire Dept.)

8. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum not to exceed \$1,500.00 from General Funds to Capital Reserve Funds toward purchase of a replacement Town Grader.

9. To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 from General Funds to Capital Reserve Funds toward purchase of a fire truck. (At request of the Chichester Vol. Fire Dept.)

10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 toward purchase of a fire truck, \$2,000.00 to be raised by current year taxes and the Selectmen to issue Serial Notes for the remaining \$8,000.00 payable in equal installments of \$2,000.00 each in the years 1973, 1974, 1975 and 1976. (At request of the Chichester Vol. Fire Dept.)

11. To see if the Town will vote to reopen "Locke" Road so called. (The road was "discontinued (subject to gate and bars) the road running from Walter Locke's house to the so called Kaime Rd.," by article 9. Town Warrant 1945 Town Meeting.)

12. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and appropriate the sum of \$772.00 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of this Commission. (At request of Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission)

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls will be open until 6:00 P.M.

All articles except No's. 1, 2, and 3 above will be taken up beginning at 7:00 P.M.

#### **REPORT OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT**

The Chichester fire dept. responded to a total of 22 calls during 1971. The breakdown of calls is as follows:

During the year we bought a new Scott Air Pack, Smoke Ejector, Extinguishers and battery charger, all being new equipment. We have 20 radio monitors, 2 base stations and 6 mobile radios therefore radio repairs is one of the largest expenditures in our budget.

Our accident and medical insurance on the members is of the minimum coverage and I recommend an increase in coverage during the next year.

I also recommend consideration be given to the purchase of a new tank truck and our 1942 pumper retired. In the thirty-six years of the fire dept. the town has only aquired one new truck and one used pumper and four have been built up from used commercial trucks by members of the department.

I would like to emphasize the need for safety features which are met by fire equipment manufacturers of commercial fire trucks which we do not have by building up second hand trucks for fire fighting use.

As fire equipment is used for emergency service consideration must be given in comparing it with regular commercial truck operation.

The days of volunteer labor and time seem to be a thing of the past and citizens of the town must accept the fact that new fire apparatus should be obtained from fire apparatus manufacturers to meet the underwriters standards. I hope the voters will recognize these needs in considering an appropriation for a new tank truck.

#### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

#### Lest We Forget - It Can Happen Here

Disastrous forest and brush fires that destroy hundreds of homes are more prevalent on the west coast with their dry seasons and strong dry hot winds but 25 years ago this fall is the anniversary of a disaster that devastated large areas of northern New England leaving villages in ashes with rows of cellar holes and chimneys in a number of summer vacation home locations. Many lives were lost on that destructive day of October 23, 1947; nothing could stop the wind driven flames.

It is true that such conditions are unusual for New Hampshire but they happened once, they can happen again. The fuel for fires is all around us. All it takes is a firebrand. Only by cultivating a habit of carefulness with fire at all times can we meet the challenge of protection when dry conditions prevail. Please let these reminders be your guide:

- 1. Never, either when walking, riding or driving, discard a firebrand a lighted match or a glowing cigarette.
- 2. Always obtain a permit for any outside burning. The burning of household rubbish is not permitted if your town has rubbish collection. Burning of grass or garden litter can be dangerous. See your warden first.
- 3. If you camp or picnic, be sure open fires are allowed and if they are, put them *dead out* when leaving.
- 4. Most Important Instruct your children in the danger of the lighted match. A lighted match and dry grass or forest litter is a dangerous combination which leads to destructive loss and can lead to tragedy.

The past year — 1971 was a favorable year for the control of fires. There were too many fire starts in some towns. We thank those who remember and asks others to heed Smokey's message.

#### **REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN FOR 1971**

Though I have held the title of librarian through the year, Mrs. James C. Bates Sr. (with unfailing understanding and devotion to Floyd and me and the library) took on more and more of the duties for which I had insufficient time. Suddenly, in October, my entire time was needed at home. Henceforth I would be unable to assume any outside responsibilities whatever. This put a problem on the shoulders of the Trustees at a very busy time of year for everyone.

Be it remembered that ours is a *public library*, so voted by the town in 1899. There are State requirements that a librarian must fulfill. She must also do her best to meet the library needs of the community with their different interests and aspirations. For many years our library has been wholly served by dedicated, untrained volunteers but what is *seen* of the librarian *in* the library is only a wee tip of the iceberg of hours she must spend on library work beyond its walls. It might be several months before an unpaid librarian would be found who could give the necessary time.

What happened? The most enheartening, enlivening cooperation that could possibly be imagined! Every worker immediately offered to take on additional work until a new librarian was appointed. It was unthinkable to them that the usefulness of the library should be impaired for an instant! Mrs. James Bates Sr. and two Trustees, Mrs. Frank Hatch Jr. and Mrs. Robert Myers, agreed to share the major responsibilities pro tempore. This was a Triumvirate of high competence, fairness of mind, sincere human concern, and devotion to the purposes and potential of the library, (essential requisites in library work). Also accepting additional duties were the faithful, absolutely indispensable library Aides. On each person's part there was real sacrifice of time needed elsewhere. The Trustees, Mrs. Bates Sr. and the Aides consulted together, fresh ideas came forth and an invigorating new look came into the operation of the library. It was needed; the retiring librarian was getting old.

On 31st December, our library had a collection of 1492 books of adult fiction; 930 books of adult non-fiction; 38 adult pamphlets of continuing value; and 658 books for children and youth.

The circulation of books (including those from Mrs. Varney's very beneficial branch) was 5668 books in 1971; which is 172 more than in the previous year. When special requests were received, which could not be filled from our library, Mrs. Bates or I made special trips to the State Library and/or the District office to obtain these books. Approximately 197 books were in this category.

All gifts of books and magazines are accepted by the library with the understanding that they may be disposed of in whatever way the

Book Selection Committee (or the librarian) thinks in the best interest of the usefulness of the library. There were several anonymous gifts, as well as gifts from Miss Bessie Baker, Mrs. Grace Boyd, Mrs. Paul Clark. Mrs. Samuel Clark, Mrs. Edward Edmunds, Miss Betsy Gould, Mrs. John Hutchinson, Mr. Harry Lionstone, Mr. Arnold Newcomb. Mrs. Ernest Randall, Mrs. Harold Ricker, Mrs. Leon Sanborn, Mrs. Clarence Shaw and Miss Margaret Smith. The most beautiful gift book, "America the Beautiful" was given in memory of Mr. Kenneth M. Huckins by his daughter, Mrs. Joseph Rogers. For these gifts, we are very grateful. If any name is omitted in this list it is due to inadequate recording for which I am sorry. For the 7th year, Mrs. Paul deW. Caskey (Ruth Blackman) made a generous gift of money to be disbursed for the benefit of the library at the discretion of the librarian. Only a librarian knows the joyous satisfaction such a gift means, in meeting an occasional emergency and in extending the scope and depth of the collection.

The Saturday afternoons from 2 to 5 p.m., were staffed by Mrs. Bates Sr. or by me, with the capable assistance of Mrs. Edward Edmunds, who is also a Trustee. The evening hours, Mondays and Thursdays from 7 to 9 p.m., were entirely staffed by library Aides without whose dependable and conscientious help the usefulness of the library would be greatly diminished. These Aides were Mrs. Paul Clark, Mrs. Frank Hatch Jr., Mrs. Peter Hammen, Mrs. Jaan Luikmil, Mrs. Robert Myers, Mrs. H. Franklin Parker, Mrs. Ronald Pike, Mrs. Edgar Reed, Mrs. Emory Sanders and Mrs. Clarence Shaw. We were very sad when three of these excellent Aides were obliged to leave us in the autumn; Mrs. Shaw for other more necessary demands on her time, Mrs. Clark for reasons of health and Mrs. Sanders because of moving to Warner.

For the second year Mrs. Ronald Coffey served as the library liaison Aide. She visited the school regularly in order that the library could co-operate as effectively as possible. She deserves high praise for her constructive work in taking books to the school from the library and returning them when the school no longer needed them to supplement their work. It was to our great regret that she was unable to continue in September for a third year. The library was very fortunate, however, that Mrs. Dana Ordway was able to accept this important responsibility.

During the year Mrs. Bates picked up eleven requested films at the State Library and took them to a teacher at the school. Pertinent books from our library were also supplied to (hopefully) enhance the interest of the children in the subject of the films. To meet the requirements of the State Library, a member of our staff was in attendance during the presentation of the films.

In September, the Trustees, the Aides, Mrs. Bates Sr. and I had a merry, vigorous afternoon "beautifying" the grounds around the Town Hall, which houses our library on its second floor by the courtesy of our friendly and interested Selectmen. Mrs. Reed cut the 2 foot grass, Mrs. Hatch pruned the shrubs and the rest of us uprooted weeds and raked. Mr. James Brown raised our spirits enormously by planting his gift of a lovely, young willow and Mrs. Reed received a most enthusiastic response to her gentle suggestion that spring tulips might be attractive in the front of the building. With habitual kindness, she agreed to plant them, and did so.

The Friends of the Library were beacons of light and achievements. Under the leadership and mesmerism of the President, Mrs. Frank Hatch Jr., as many as possible of the Aides and Staff attended regular, monthly work meetings at the library to complete the ever growing catalogue and fill other library needs. "The friends" held two film parties that were enjoyed by nearly 100 young people. They also augmented their funds by the profit from two tables at the Grange Flea Market.

In August, for the second year, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Myers designed and constructed a marvelously imaginative, pertinent, prize-winning float, — the library entry in the Old Home Day parade. With a replica of the Town Hall and enticing travel posters, it beckoned the viewers to take wonderful journeys via the books in the library.

In this, my 8th and final report, I want to add how very much I have enjoyed being your librarian. To you all, my gratitude is bound-less and my happy, good wishes are warm and sincere.

#### REPORT OF THE CHICHESTER SCHOOL BOARD 1971-72

The quality of any educational facility can best be measured by the competency of the students it educates and graduates into our competitive society. Chichester Central Elementary School is an important link in that education process of developing students and preparing them for the challenges and opportunities that await them. Your school board feels that great strides are being taken to formulate a system which will meet the constantly changing educational needs of our children. Obviously, there is always room for continued improvement and this demands closer coordination of effort between our Chichester staff, Pembroke Academy and the superintendent's office which is beginning to be accomplished. New programs are now being developed at Pembroke Academy under the direction of Mr. William Martson, Headmaster and Mr. David Cawley, Assistant Superintendent. In this regard, Mr. Richard Fowler, Principal, has been attending several curriculum development sessions at Pembroke Academy, already reflecting in an updated English program which will be installed next school year. This is just the beginning of a program which promises to provide continuity in the learning process of our children.

As was reported last year, consideration will have to be made very soon for a building program to provide a cafeteria and facility for physical education classes. Your board considered an article in the warrant to establish a capital reserve fund for this purpose but the idea was withdrawn this year due to the substantial increase in estimated tuition costs. This approach of setting aside a sum of money each year in anticipation of future construction deserves the townpeople's consideration now for subsequent planning. We are extremely pleased with the progress that has been made in our library. Sincere thanks to all those volunteers that have participated in doing such a great job. Budgeted for next year is approximately \$2.50 per pupil for library books and \$340 for a librarian's desk and chair, a children's reading table with adjustable legs and five chairs, a filing cabinet and a film strip storage container. Continuing support of this library cannot help but pay dividends in the near future.

Mr. James Brown, our custodian, continues doing an excellent job keeping our building in the proper state of cleanliness. Anticipated maintenance projects for the ensuing year are painting the north-south corridor, installing shelves in Mrs. Sanborn's room, repairing sink cabinets and classroom storage areas, replacing toilet floor tiles, continue sealing a segment of the asphalt driveway and installation of the furnace fire brick. Continued preventative maintenance of this nature should offset imminent capital expenditures.

Last but not least, a special thanks goes to Mrs. Rubie Plumb who is retiring at the close of this school year after twenty-three years of teaching of which eleven years were at Chichester Central. Mrs. Plumb will be missed by the staff and children and all of us wish her the very best and healthiest retirement possible.

#### ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

It is with pleasure, but also some hesitation, that I submit this brief report. Half a year "on-the-job training" is hardly enough to evaluate Union No. 53, its present status, its future, and its ever increasing school population.

Two areas of great concern are growth and financial assistance. Each district within the next decade will show rapid growth — in some instances, a doubling of present enrollment. We are at present studying every facet of space needs, double sessions and extended or year round schools. We must take a good hard look at all alternatives.

Although the number of teacher applicants have increased steadily in the last year, we must be selective in choosing the candidates that offer the best for our children.

Our education is fundamentally sound. The instructional program is ever improving, as the science and art of education develops. Instructional areas have been updated and show signs of continuity with our high school programs.

In closing, I would say that good education costs more money than poor, and that quality education costs the most. It is our intention to give you the best quality education for the amount of money spent. We can, however, always show improvement day by day. This is the basic philosophy we like to think is part of our educational belief.
