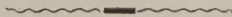

---

We, the undersigned, having attended to our duties as School Board to the best of our abilities, submit the following report :

We have endeavored to so arrange the schools that all the scholars should have an equal advantage, by having the same number of weeks (21) in each school district, except the Center district, which on account of illness of the teacher had but 20 weeks, and the Champion district having the benefit of the Abigail Drake fund had 24 weeks.

The teachers of each school have had (with one or two exceptions,) several years' experience in teaching, and have given excellent satisfaction. The average attendance has been better than the preceding year. The scholars have made good progress, and as a whole the schools have been very successful.

There are many things which could be changed for the better, but until the parents are willing to work with the School Board for the success of our schools, there will be some things for the parents and scholars to complain of. Parents, see to it that your children are at school every day, and investigate reports before deciding against a teacher.
