ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD

FOR THE

YEAR ENDING FEB. 15. 1904.

In submitting our Annual Report we take pleasure in stating that our schools generally have been successful and progressive.

We have been obliged to secure the services of several new teachers during the past year, but their work has been satisfactory, and worthy of commendation.

We have had twenty nine weeks schooling, which is a longer period than our scholars have enjoyed in the past; and we are particularly fortunate in receiving a goodly sum from the State which will aid us so materially that it will not be necessary to raise as much additional money as last year; although we should raise \$ 300. more than the law requires, and by so doing we can maintain three terms of ten weeks each. We believe that the interest of our citizens in educational matters will impel them to raise the amount above named that we may take no backward step in the welfare and education of our youth, upon whose progress and attainments we look for the prosperity of our institutions.
