THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

L.S.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified
to vote in town affairs.*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Second. To choose three Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Third. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

Fourth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Fifth. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

Sixth. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town, or act thereon.

Seventh. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day, or act thereon.

Eighth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock Memorial Hospital, or act thereon.

Ninth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association, or act thereon.

Tenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

Eleventh. To see what action the town will take to

enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of "An Act to Provide for State Aid and for the permanent improvement of Main Highways throughout the State." Approved April 10, 1909, or act thereon.

Twelfth. To see what action the town will take to enable it to secure the benefits of the provisions of "An Act in Amendment of Section 8, Chapter 35, of Laws of 1905, and of Section 20 of Chapter 155 of Laws of 1909, relating to maintenance of Highways," approved April 15, 1911, or act thereon.

Thirteenth. To determine the division of the school money.

Fourteenth. To hear the reports of the Auditors and the Town School Board.

Fifteenth. To see what action the town will take in regard to repairing and improving the Town Hall, to raise money therefor, or act thereon.

Sixteenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground, or act thereon.

Seventeenth. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars to hire a playground at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

Eighteenth. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of brass bands, or act thereon.

Nineteenth. To see if the town will vote to widen the highway on what is known as River Street in the center village of said town, and build a sidewalk of suitable dimensions adjacent thereto.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

During the year there have been in Lebanon village 70 cases of measles, 10 cases of typhoid fever, six of which occurred in one house, due, probably, to some faulty local condition, and 14 cases of diphtheria in nine different families.

No fatalities occurred from any of the acute contagious diseases.

Many unsanitary places were remedied by the owners connecting with sewers, although considerable work of the same kind needs to be done the coming season.

In the whole town there were six deaths from tuberculosis.

In the west part of the town there have been 95 cases of measles and two of scarlet fever, compelling quarantine to be placed upon 32 dwelling places; two cases of typhoid fever, two of whooping cough. Eighteen complaints of conditions regarded as nuisances, aside from like conditions found by the board in looking after suspected and other locations as required by the Statutes, have been attended to. Six owners of dwellings near public sewer facilities have complied with Chapter 108 of the Public Statutes by connecting water closets and entering the sewers.

The large number of cases of measles during the year again suggest that more care should be taken by parents and guardians of children having coughs or colds, by keeping them at home, and away from other children and persons who have not had measles.

This disease appears to be most contagious during the coughing period at the beginning of the attack. A little extra care at this stage of the disease would not only lessen the severity of the attack, but would greatly lessen the danger of conveying the contagion to

others. It would also lessen the public expense of quarantine. The family physician should inform and counsel parents as to the time when individuals having hard colds could safely be permitted to mingle with the public.

The water supply for the village of West Lebanon furnished by the Hartford Water Company during the months of November and December 1913 occasioned much anxiety because of its being pumped from the Connecticut river to a small reservoir of spring water at the foot of Sargent's Ravine, and thence to the mains. The river water being forced through rapid filters before being discharged into the reservoir.

The State Board of Health permitted this temporary supply, requesting that the hypochlorite treatment be constantly applied to the water before it was pumped into the mains. Frequent analysis of samples of the water taken from the river, the reservoir and from a tap in the village gave evidence of the good results of the hypochlorite treatment.

The local Board of Health, by direction of the State Board, made frequent visits of inspection to the plant, collecting samples of the water for analysis by the State Laboratory during the time of this temporary supply.

There were many cases of diarrhoeal intestinal troubles observed and reported to the board by persons using the water. Also one case of typhoid fever from which another member of the family evidently contracted the disease. How far or how much this was due to the water in question the board is not able to accurately state. However, the reports of the analysis of the water give sufficient evidence to warrant the extraordinary care taken by the Board of Health and the manager of the company to keep the temporary supply free of disease producing germs.

There is no question as to the purity of the water supplied to this village at the present time, as proved by analysis made January 5th, 1914.

Analysis made in October, 1913, of two samples of the water supply for the village of Lebanon gave evidence of excellent quality, yet it is our opinion that it would be well to add the hypochlorite process to the treatment of this supply as a final safeguard.

The hypochlorite treatment has been adopted and thoroughly tried in many places. It has proved to be exceedingly efficient as a disinfectant of water, and is extensively used in conjunction with filtration as a final measure of precaution.

The Cemetery Committee have expended a larger amount of money than in previous years owing to extraordinary expenses, and for the benefit of the tax payers will say that we have not received any funds from the town other than the amount raised for cemetery purposes. The balance of the amount received, as shown in the foregoing report, being money derived from the sale of lots by the town and held subject to the call of the Committee and as is shown in the Selectmen's report, there is still a small balance in their hands due the cemeteries. We have paid the Selectmen for the materials received from the town the same as if purchased elsewhere.

In the spring of 1913 the Glenwood hill road was washed out by the surface water and in a few hours carried away what cost more than one hundred dollars to repair. The Committee were aware of this danger and to prevent its reoccurrence we have put in a partial system of sewerage, laid low enough in the ground so as not to interfere with sale of any lots, but on the contrary making salable and desirable many that were worthless before. The pipe is extended down the hill far enough with proper inlet, so we think we are well protected against another washout. The expense is not the only thing to be thought of, as there is at present but one approach to Glenwood Cemetery, and if this should be impassable it might cause serious inconvenience.

With the ordinary care and repair of lots and the extraordinary work done, our expenses have been large, but this is in the way of an explanation rather than an apology, as we were obliged to repair the roads and we consider the sewer a permanent and valuable asset.
