# TOWN WARRANT

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

**To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lee in the County of  
Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:  
(L.S.)**

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lee on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects: Polls to close at 6:00 p.m.

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a zoning ordinance recommended by the Planning Board. (Ballot Vote)

Articles 3 through 22 on appropriations will be taken up at the Mast Way School on Wednesday, the ninth day of March at eight o'clock in the evening.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of Highways.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand six hundred dollars (\$1600.00) for old age assistance and Town relief.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for fire protection.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five hundred forty four dollars and thirty five cents (\$544.35) for the construction of Class V

highways under the provisions of the TRA, so called. The State will contribute the sum of three thousand six hundred twenty eight dollars and ninety eight cents (\$3,628.-98).

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

9. To see if the Town will vote to buy a new Fire Truck and make appropriation for same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Trustees of the Trust Fund to draw moneys now in Trust for a Fire Truck.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to be deposited with the Town Trustees of the Trust Funds as a capital reserve for equipment for the Fire Department.

12. To see if the Town will vote to accept the old Boston & Maine Railroad well on Route 125 now owned by Melvin Jenkins and make appropriation for a cover and dry hydrant.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty five hundred dollars (\$2500.-00) to be used on Wednesday Hill Road.

14. To raise and appropriate for the economic advancement of the Town through publicity and promotional service of the Seacoast Regional Development Association in cooperation with other regional communities a sum not exceeding one-one-hundredth of one per cent of assessed valuation, namely, two hundred thirty dollars (\$230.00).

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the Town Dump.



16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of approximately seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7500.00) to defray the cost of its share of the Strafford County Government.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to mow cemetery lots not having perpetual care.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the control of Pine Blister Rust.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired from Tax Sales.

20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Town Bicentennial.

21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

## LEE FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT FOR 1965

The Lee Fire Department answered 51 calls in 1965 plus many calls from the fire towers; twice as many as in any previous year since 1949.

The total fire loss is estimated at less than \$1,000.

There were 9 building fires, 17 woods and grass fires, 8 unauthorized dump fires, 7 out-of-town fires, 6 car and truck fires, 2 chimney fires and 2 false alarms. Outside help was called in on 4 occasions.

Numerous calls from the fire towers to investigate smokes were all checked out.

About 40 acres of grass and woodland were burnt over.

Quick response by the department kept most of these fires to minimum size and expense.

Many thanks to everyone who has contributed to our effort to reduce the fire loss in Lee.

Again we remind you that the fire phone number is 9-3900 and is to be used just for emergencies. For fire permits the numbers to call are 9-3447 or 9-3858.

Meetings of the department are open to anyone and you are welcome to belong or just come to visit.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN  
AND DISTRICT CHIEF

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the

line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindfull that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

1. To teach our children the danger in lighting matches.
2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
3. To safely despose or rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush;
  - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
  - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5:00 pm.
  - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.
