

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TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the 12th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, at which time the polls shall be open and shall not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects, all except 1, to be considered at seven-thirty in the afternoon.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.*
- 2. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote in relation thereto.*
- 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.*
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriation for the same as set forth in the following budget.*

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$90,000.00 to be used in defraying the cost of final plan preparation for sewage and sewage treatment facilities, inclusive of land acquisition, easement and rights of way as are required, such sum to be raised by the issuance of not exceeding \$90,000.00 in Serial Bonds or Notes under and in compliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 33 of the New Hampshire Statutes Annotated 1955 and any amendments thereto) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other actions as may be necessary to effect the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds or notes as shall be in the best interests of the Town of Lisbon, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1,400.00 to purchase a new police cruiser.
7. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ABOUT SELECTMEN

New England towns had Selectmen before they had paved roads, indoor plumbing, or forced hot water heat, but somehow or other Selectmen remain one of the most misunderstood, maligned groups of public officials today.

Perhaps it's the influx of "city people" moving out to the suburbs from Boston, or the "foreigners" (people from West of the Berkshires) who now make up a great part of the suburban population.

Many people think a Selectman is someone you call when your neighbor's dog bites you, or the garbageman spills his bucket on your front lawn, or when the snow plow blocks your driveway after you've just shovelled it out.

Most Selectmen will listen to these gripes, and even try to help you out. But their duties lay primarily in other fields. They are the joint executive authority of the corporate body known as a 'town' in New England.

To be a Selectman takes a rare combination of qualities. First and foremost, one has to be a little bit crazy to be a Selectman. Why? Probably because you must plan to spend anywhere from \$50 to \$500 to get elected to a job which pays an average of \$10 a week, or about 50 cents an hour, as some Selectmen have figured it.

If you do get elected, you're entitled to sit with two or four colleagues at Town Hall once a week, and listen to the collected gripes of the citizenry. During the course of a year, a Selectman will sit and hear himself called just about every name you can think of, and a few more that you can't. He gets calls at all hours of the day and night about lost dogs, and children. His weekends are taken up dedicating new buildings, officiating at tree planting ceremonies, and checking on requests made during the week.

And through all this, a Selectman must be courteous kind and cheerful -- if he expects to be re-elected by the voters. Because on election day, the voter will remember each affront, minor or major, intended or unintended.

So a Selectman must be something of a diplomat and amateur psychologist. He must be able to call everyone in town by his or her first name, know them well enough not to pass them by on the street without saying "hello" or "good morning."

And he must acquire a specialized body of knowledge, necessary for the performance of his duties. He must know how a dump works or doesn't; who collects the garbage and rubbish and when; why such and such a street is paved or isn't; and a million and one other such items of information.

Why does anyone bother to be a Selectman? Most people will tell you they get graft, money under the table, or kickbacks. That's doubtful. Have you ever seen a rich Selectman who wasn't already wealthy when he took the job? In fact, just the opposite is true in most cases. A Selectman actually loses money while in office. If you figure his time at the minimum wage of \$1.50 an hour, add in the cost of campaigning, the extra gas, the extra telephone calls, it doesn't come anywhere near what most Selectmen receive in payment for their services.

So the next time you feel mad at the town and feel the urge to call your Selectman, wait a minute. Think. Get your story straight, and if you still feel the urge to "tell someone", at least be polite to the poor Selectman. If he's a good one, he's a rare bird, and you should be nice to him.

If he's a bad one, then maybe you ought to run yourself -- that is if you're ready to work for 50 cents an hour, be yelled at, complained to, and whispered about. And if you know the workings of town government 'like the palm of your hand'. And if you're public-spirited enough to sacrifice your time and money to do an almost thankless job.

LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Nov. 1, 1966 to Nov. 30, 1967

The department had a total of 37 calls, of which 13 were general alarms. Out of town fires included 3 fires in Lyman, 1 fire in Bath, and no fires in Landaff.

Calls included the following:

- 10 house or building fires
- 9 brush or grass fires
- 5 truck or automobile fires
- 1 oil burner fire
- 1 false alarm
- 1 call for cleaning gasoline spillage from street
- 10 calls for shoveling hydrants, fixing hose, and truck maintenance

Your department members have participated in four courses offered by the State of New Hampshire in fire service training under the Division of Fire Control. Station classes and demonstrations were given to the members participating. Twenty of the department's men have taken at least one of the four courses offered. Statistics for these courses are as follows:

1964 & 1967	17 men	Basic Pump Training
1964	7 men	Scott Air-Pack and Rescue
1966	10 men	Ladder Training
1967	7 men	Resuscitator

The department purchases approximately \$500.00 worth of hose each year. This past year we purchased 25 helmets, 25 pairs of winter gloves, 3 first-aid kits, and equipped 2 trucks with new winter tread tires.

The Lisbon Department extends its fire protection to the towns of Landaff, Lyman and to parts of Bath and Sugar Hill. Landaff and Lyman are billed for their calls. When this money is received it goes into the general fund. Bath and Sugar Hill are members of the Mutual Aid System.

The members of the department have appreciated the help and good will shown by the townspeople each summer when we sponsor the Annual Horse Show. We feel that this is a drawing card to the town of Lisbon and a help to our taxpayers. With the funds received from this summer project we have been able to repair valuable equipment, make minor repairs to the fire station, and buy and equip a much needed tank truck without adding to your tax dollars. At the present we are saving this money to build a new fire station.

We thank you all for the cooperation we have received. Remember: One ounce of prevention is worth 20 tons of equipment!

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF

After several successive years of drought, the rains of 1967 came as a welcome change. Our record of the past fire season is good. Our thanks to all who contributed to achieve this good record. Continued improvement in the matter of accurate, prompt detection and rapid effective suppression action can help to maintain this good, worthwhile record even though we do not have an abundance of rain as in the fire season of 1967.

It will help if we follow these simple suggestions:

1. No burning of debris and waste between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and 5:00 P. M. and then only with a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.
2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.
3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
4. Keep matches away from young children.
5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING STUDY COMMITTEE

A study committee was appointed by the Selectmen in response to the voters at Town Meeting last year. This committee was appointed to learn if the need existed for town planning to control water pollution and future land use.

Statistics indicate that this is one of anticipated growth. Among these indications are the relative quantity of expansion in surrounding areas, the availability of developable property, expandable recreational facilities, the continuing search of city inhabitants to find a quiet atmosphere, and the natural warmth of the citizens of this community.

The committee found that the need for town planning of a liberal nature does exist. The factors that make town planning necessary for Lisbon are as follows:

1. If Lisbon fails to place a control on future land use it may become a dumping area for more progressive neighboring communities.
2. To assure the citizens of Lisbon the right to own, inhabit, and develop their property without fear that it might be devalued by the development of adjacent property which is noisy, odorous, or unsightly.
3. Many investors, private and commercial, and the State of New Hampshire have indicated that they will not make investments in areas where no land usage controls apply.
4. Seasonal residents hesitate to buy or build where they aren't afforded the protection of land use ordinances.
5. Green Affiliates engineering firm has recommended that regulations be adopted for the protection of the taxpayers to prevent undesirable or burdensome use of sewerage facilities.

We feel that it is mandatory to begin planning before major changes occur in the use of land in the town - not afterwards. We recommend the establishment of a planning committee.

LISBON DISTRICT NURSING ASSOCIATION

The Lisbon District Nursing Association is a non-profit organization servicing the towns of Lisbon, Landaff, Lyman, Sugar Hill, Franconia, Bath and Easton. Its objectives are to provide skilled nursing care and at least one other therapeutic service under the direction of a physician, by a registered professional nurse, in the place of residence used as the individual's home.

The organization is supported by appropriations from the towns served, gifts from interested persons, Sunset Hill House summer benefit, membership drives, and collections of the nurse.

Any one who needs the services of the nurse may call. She will answer each call, but repeat visits are continued only under the guidance of a physician. She stays long enough to give the nursing care ordered by the physician and to teach someone in the family how to give care between her visits.

General nursing care is available to everyone regardless of age or economic status. The Association is certified by Medicare and offers service to anyone under this program. Wheelchairs, hospital beds, walkers, crutches, etc. are loaned on a rental basis to anyone needing them.

The nurse is in her office at the Lisbon Town Hall from 1 to 2 P. M. phone 838-6616 and is on duty Monday through Friday 8-4 P.M. The fees are \$3 per visit.
