

Town Meeting Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lyman, in the county of Grafton in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Lyman town hall in said town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges and for support of the poor for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars for breaking out roads in winter.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to resurface with gravel four inches deep and twelve feet wide and oil from the State Aid road near Dugway hill, so-called, past Ogontz camps to the cement bridge, and raise and appropriate necessary money for the same.

- 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to buy a two-horse grader, and raise and appropriate necessary money for the same.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid on its highways, and raise and appropriate such sums as may be necessary.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sum for state aid maintenance.
- 9. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for white pine blister rust control.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate seventy-five dollars for the Lisbon District Nursing association.
- 11. To see what action the town will take towards fixing the compensation of the tax collector.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to allow two percent. discount on taxes paid before July 5th.
- 13. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial day.
- 15. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.
- 16. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.
