To the inhabitants of the School District in the town of Roxbury, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 12th day of March 1918, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
7. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of the Schools.
8. To see how much money District will raise to pay on Schoolhouse debt, including interest.
9. To raise money to pay insurance.
10. To see if the District will vote to sell schoolhouse No. 3.
11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Roxbury, in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Roxbury on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
3. To hear the reports of the Selectmen or officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
4. To raise such sum of money as may needed for repairing highways and bridges.
5. To see if the Town will vote to establish a town library and raise money therefore.
6. To see if the Town will apply for State Aid or Permanent Improvement and Maintenance and raise money therefor.
7. To see if the Town will vote to observe Old Home day.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to cut brush on the road-side.
9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
10. To elect a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention.
