GUINTA REMAINS UNPOPULAR IN FIRST DISTRICT

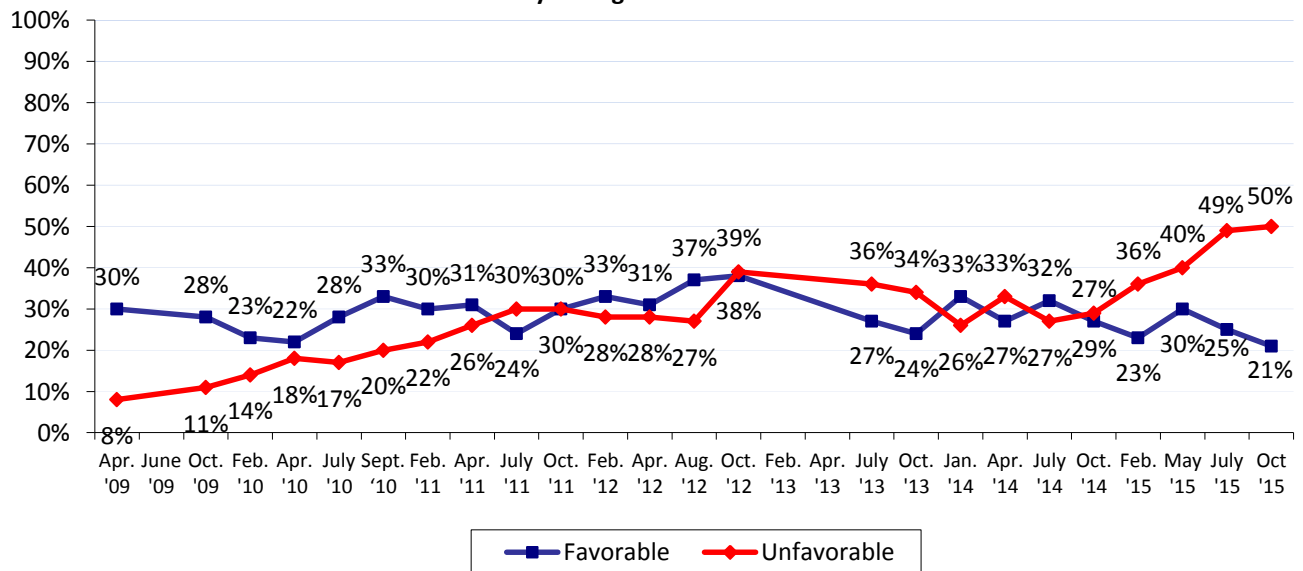
DURHAM, NH – First District Congressman Frank Guinta’s favorability ratings continue to slide in the wake of campaign finance violations. In the Second District, Democrat Ann Kuster remains unpopular.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighty-seven (587) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between September 24 and October 2, 2015. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.0 percent. Included in the survey were 286 residents of New Hampshire’s First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 5.8%) and 301 from the Second District (MSE = +/- 5.6%).

Favorability Ratings – Frank Guinta

First District Congressman Frank Guinta is increasingly unpopular in his district after the negative publicity stemming from a settlement with the Federal Election Commission (FEC) over campaign finance violations from his 2010 run for Congress. Currently, only 21% of 1st C.D. adults have a favorable opinion of Guinta, 50% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 6% are neutral and 23% don’t know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is -29%, down from -24% in July. Guinta is unpopular among Republicans (net -3%) and Independents (-13%) and very unpopular among Democrats (-56%).

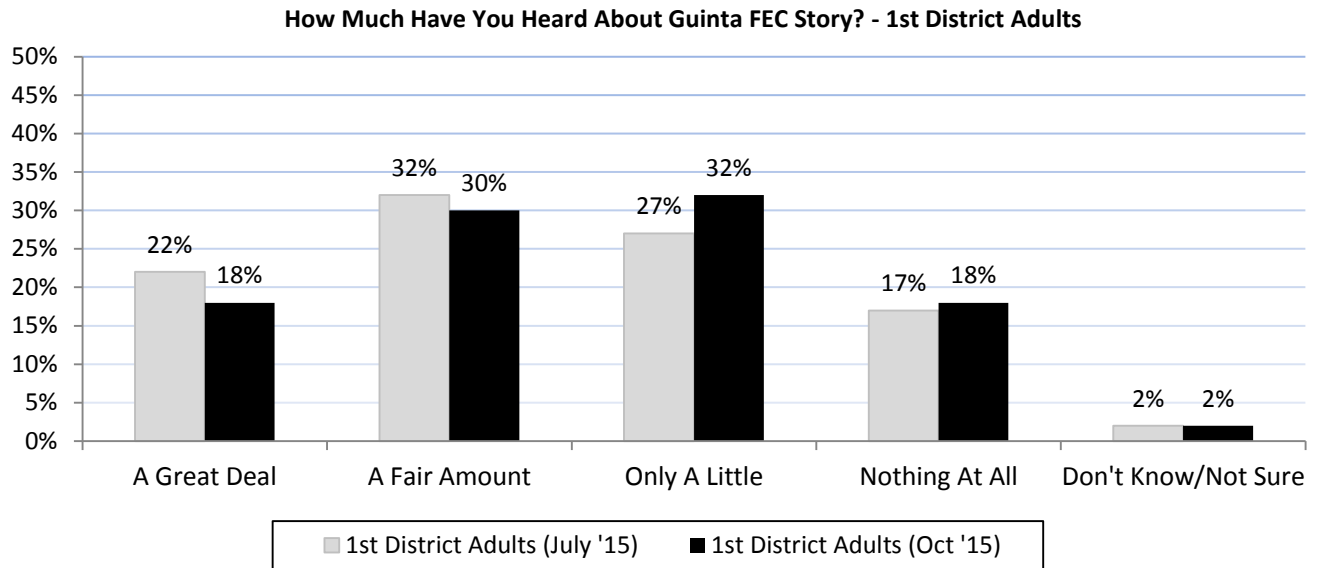
Favorability Ratings - Frank Guinta NH 1st District

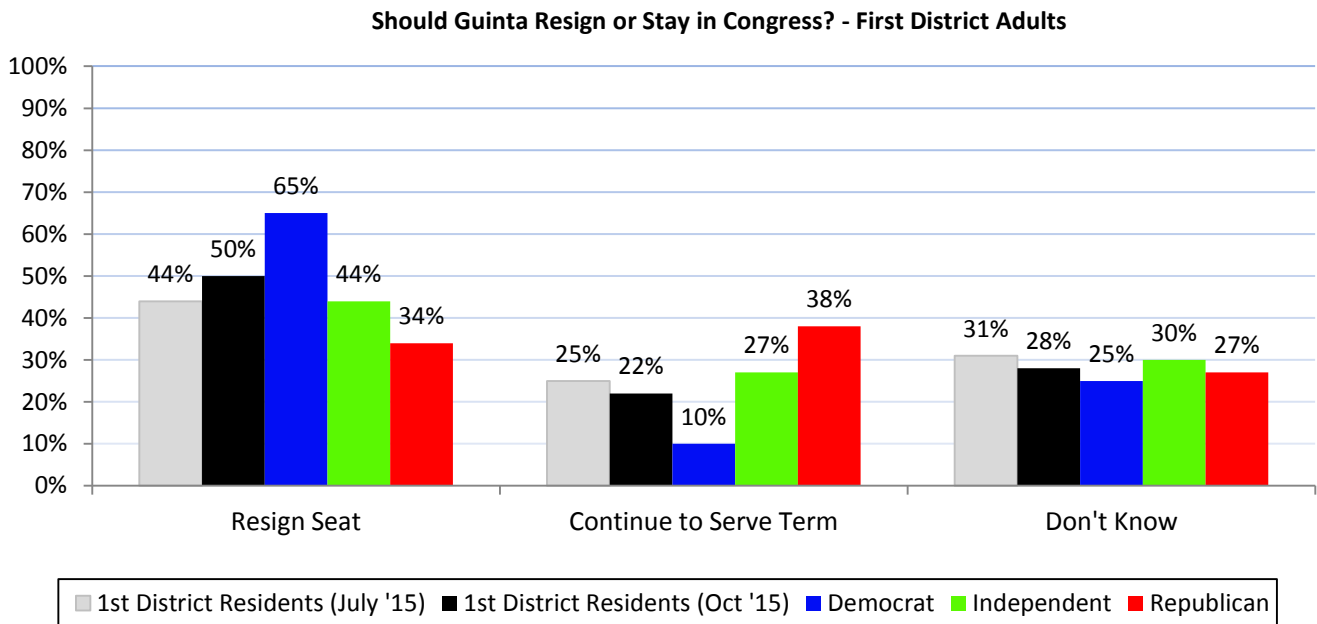
Knowledge of Frank Guinta FEC Story

Residents of the First District are fairly well informed about the campaign finance controversy. Almost half of first district residents have heard a great deal (18%) or a fair amount (30%) about the Guinta story, 32% have heard only a little and 18% have heard nothing at all.



Should Guinta Resign or Stay in Congress?

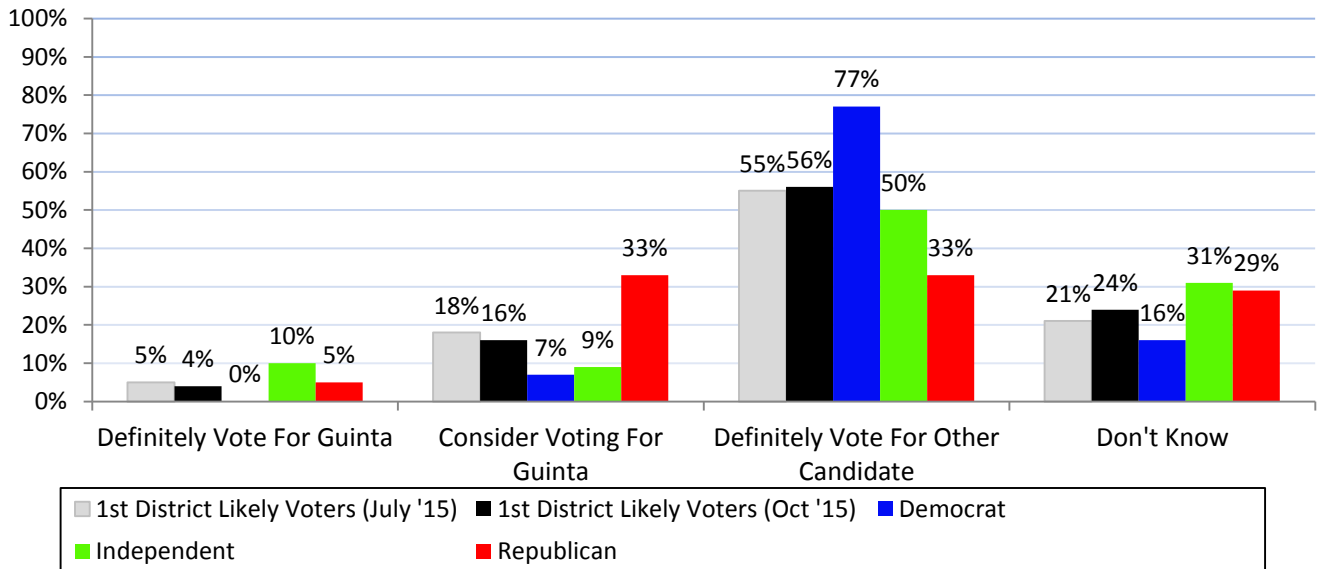
Half of First District residents (50%) say Guinta should resign from Congress, 22% say he should remain in Congress and 28% don't know or are unsure. Sixty-five percent (65%) of Democrats, 44% of Independents and 34% of Republicans think he should resign.



Guinta 2016 Re-Election Bid

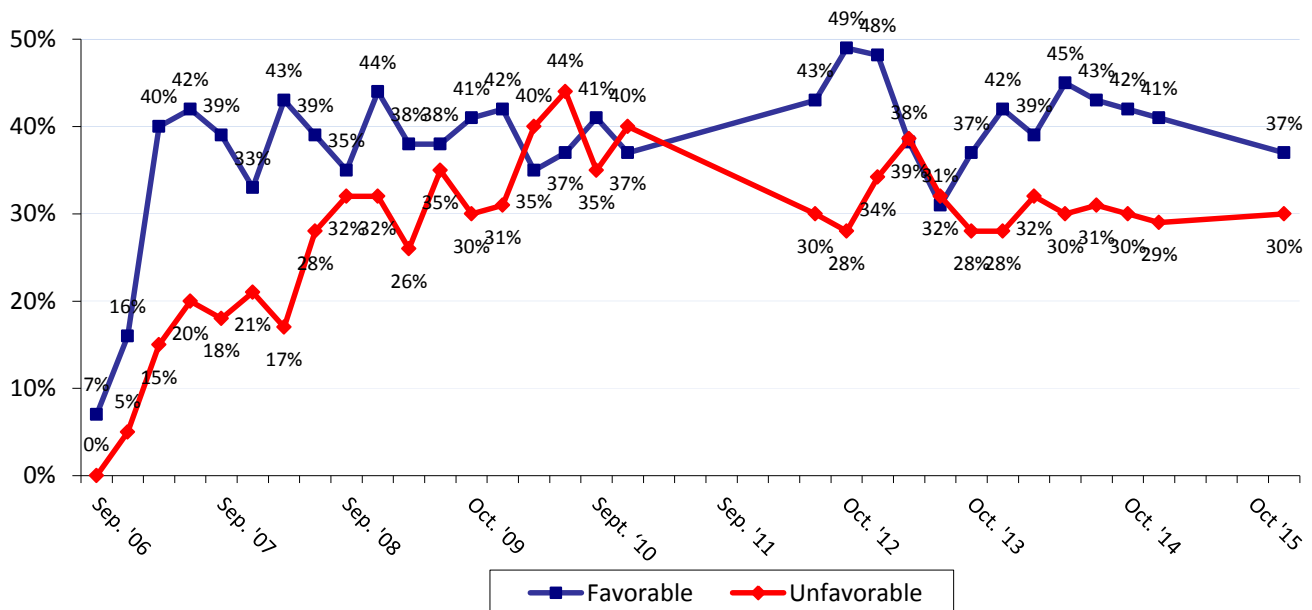
The scandal has greatly damaged Guinta’s chances for re-election in 2016 as a majority of First District likely voters said they would definitely vote for someone else if Guinta were on the ballot – 56% say they would definitely vote for another candidate, 4% would definitely vote for Guinta, 16% would consider voting for him and 24% are unsure. Most Democrats (77%), half of Independents (50%) and a third of Republicans (33%) say they would definitely vote for another candidate. This measure is unchanged since July.

If Guinta Ran for Re-Election in 2016, Would You...



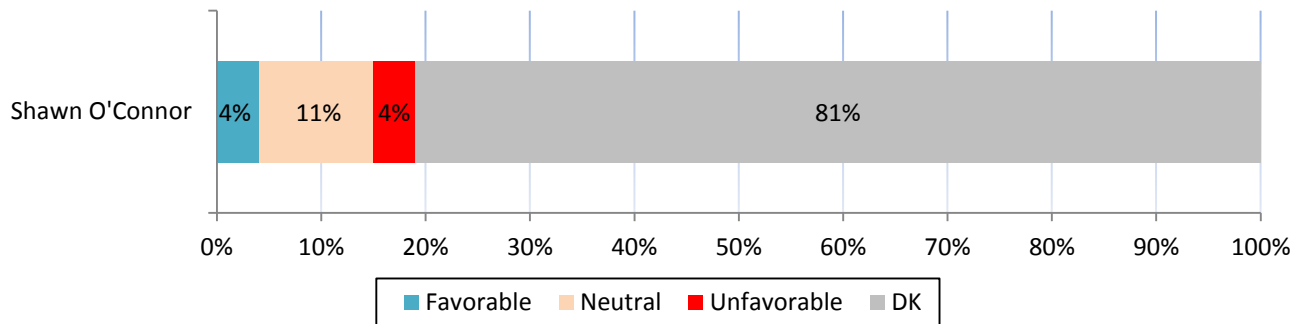
Favorability Ratings – Carol Shea-Porter NH 1st District

Former Congresswoman Carol Shea-Porter, who held the first district seat from 2007-2011 and 2013-2015, has announced she will run in 2016. If Shea-Porter were to receive the Democratic nomination and Guinta were to receive the Republican nomination, it would mark the fourth consecutive election they would be facing off for the seat. Shea-Porter remains somewhat popular in the First District – currently 37% have a favorable opinion of Shea-Porter, 30% have an unfavorable opinion, 8% are neutral and 25% don’t know enough about her to say. Her net favorability is +7%. Shea Porter is very popular among Democrats (+50%), unpopular among Independents (-7%) and very unpopular among Republicans (-47%).



Favorability Ratings – Shawn O'Connor

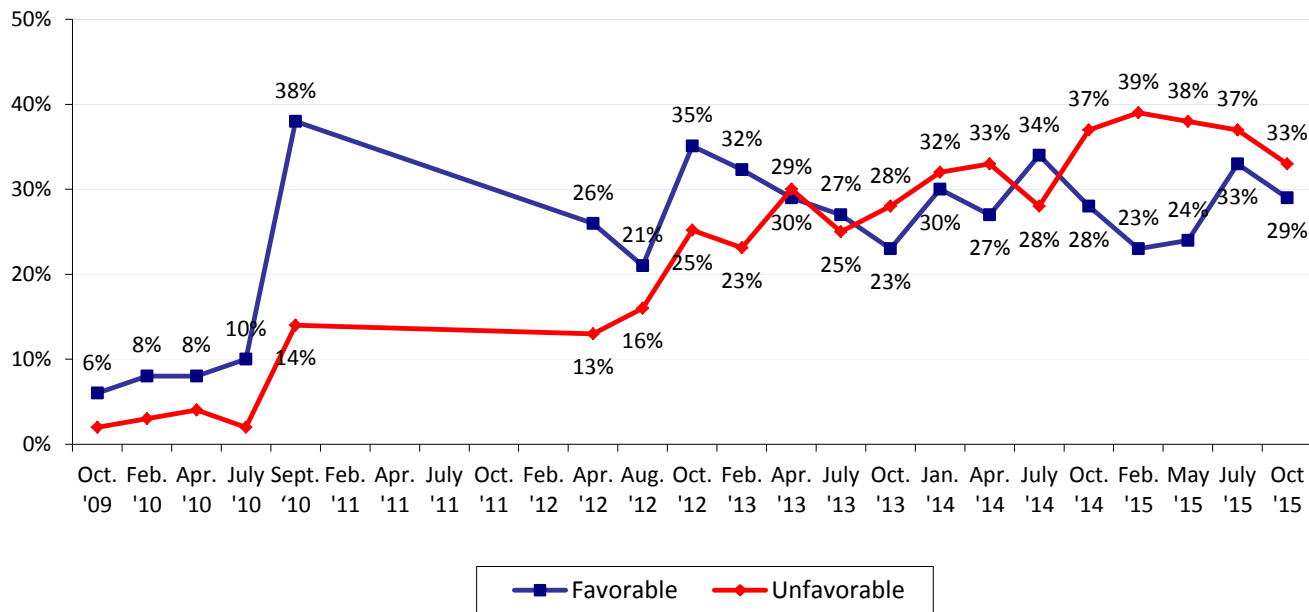
Businessman Shawn O'Connor of Bedford is also seeking the Democratic nomination for the 1st District seat, but is largely unknown among 1st District residents. Currently 4% have a favorable opinion of O'Connor, 4% have an unfavorable opinion, 11% are neutral and 81% don't know enough about him to say. O'Connor's net favorability is 0%.



Favorability Ratings – Ann Kuster

Despite comfortably winning a second term in November, Second District congresswoman Ann Kuster continues to be unpopular in her district. Currently, only 29% of 2nd District adults have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 33% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral, and 30% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is -4%, which is unchanged since July. She is popular among Democrats (net +51%), unpopular among Independents (-16%), and very unpopular among Republicans (-54%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and eighty-seven (587) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between September 24 and October 2, 2015. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.0 percent. Included in the survey were 286 residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 5.8%) and 301 from the Second District (MSE = +/- 5.6%). Also, four hundred seventy-two (472) likely 2016 general election voters are in the sample (MSE = +/- 4.5%). The design effect for the survey is 1.1% and 1.1% for the sample of likely 2016 general election voters.

The random sample used in the WMUR Granite State Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
