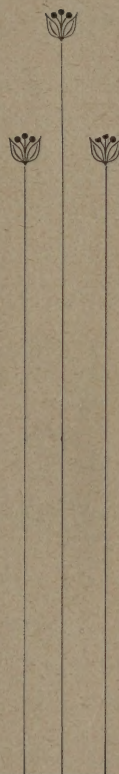

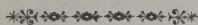

The State of New Hampshire.

[L. s.]

To the inhabitants of the Town of Tamworth, in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Tamworth, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE I.

To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

ARTICLE II.

To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations of the same.

ARTICLE III.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairing highways and bridges for the year ensuing, and make appropriations of the same.

ARTICLE IV.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for breaking snow for the year ensuing, and make appropriation of the same.

ARTICLE V.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the rebuilding of Chocorua River Bridge at West Ossipee, and make appropriation of the same.

ARTICLE VI.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in addition to summer tax, for the relief of the highway district known as Levi Whiting district. This district runs from Butlers Bridge to the store of John L. Mason.

ARTICLE VII.

To see if the town will vote to purchase snow rollers, and make appropriations for the same.

ARTICLE VIII.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for decorating soldiers' graves.

ARTICLE IX.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise in addition to the amount required by law for the support of the town Library.

ARTICLE X.

To see if the town will vote not to appoint a liquor agent.

ARTICLE XI.

To see if the town will vote to discontinue that portion of the public road leading from the highway which passes the residence of William James to the Hammond farm, so called, and which lies westerly of a gate and posts on the west side of Stony Brook, so called, and leading from said gate to the house on Hammond farm.

ARTICLE XII.

To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the building of a wall or embankment to prevent overflow of highway at high water near foot of Stevenson Hill, so called.

ARTICLE XIII.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
