REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

TO THE CITIZENS OF THE TOWN OF WARREN:

Our school laws call for a report from the school board to the selectmen in connection with the annual report of board to the superintendent of public instruction at the end of school year in July; but custom suggests one at the end of fiscal year, which, coming with the town report, is more sure to reach the homes.

Six schools have been maintained during the year, ending February, 1910: Average length, 31 weeks; average per cent. of attendance, 92; total cases tardiness, 136; number scholars, 149. The board desire to express their gratification with the large per cent. of attendance as well as the small number cases

tardiness, evidencing increased interest on the part of the home in the prosperity of the school—a most encouraging symptom.

The last legislature changed from the town to the school district the work of providing for the payment of high school tuition, salaries of school board and truant officer, and paying for school books and supplies. The school board is required to notify the selectmen of the amount needed for each of these purposes, the district, at its annual meeting, having fixed the amount to be raised for the salaries. This notice must be given after the school meeting and before taxing time. The number of high school scholars sent from Warren was at the spring term at Plymouth, six; at the fall term, four. Five were graduated from the grammar school at the close of the last school year, of whom one entered Plymouth high, and one took the advanced course in our grammar school. Is it not wise for us as a community at once to secure the services of a competent teacher for those who ask for the opportunity of advanced study in the home school? A large majority of our young people will enjoy school privileges at home or nowhere. No one until recently ever questioned their right to all the home school can give them. The work of a really able teacher is needed in checking the tendency to spread out, to multiply branches of study at the expense of thoroughness in fundamentals. The call for easier text books in mathematics does not come from scholars seeking real education. The tendency to superficiality is no less marked in prevalent methods of teaching. The scholar is no longer given a problem to demonstrate on the board by himself, but almost always the whole class have the same problem, "so," as a scholar said to the writer, "those who can't do the work may see how others do it." Making the way easy does not point in the way of work of much value.

Repairs made early in the year in the school room at Warren Summit render it one of the two most comfortable school rooms in the district, Ore Hill, the other. The house at Warren village is the coldest, even after the work done this season

—storm windows and improvements in furnace. There is an urgent call for a change in roof over the entrance. Six times, at least, each school day every member of those three schools must pass over that flight of stairs under dripping eaves, while an occasional ice and snow slide covers entire flight. Twice the present winter the register of village schools say, No school; too cold.

There has been about the same number of miscellaneous calls from different parts of the town as has been in past years. Five buildings have been thoroughly disinfected following scarlet fever, typhoid fever and tuberculosis. Two complaints came during the hot weather from the outskirts of the town in regard to dead bodies of animals decomposing on top of the ground. No dead animal should be allowed unburied or burned, as the stench can be detected at a long distance when the wind is right. All animal matter, however small it may be, near buildings, should be buried or burned on account of flies if for no other reason.
