To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the sixth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1) To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2) To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of current year taxes.

4) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$315.00 for support of the Concord Hospital. (At request of the Hospital.)

5) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$1,700.00 as the Town share of the cost of hiring two men to operate the Center Barnstead Ambulance during day time hours only. (At request of the Barnstead Fire Dept.)

6) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 to be expended in cooperation with the N. H. Dept. of Resources and Economic Development for opening and maintaining of Trails and Old Roads for forest fire protection, the N. H. Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$50.00 for this purpose.

7) To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum not to exceed \$1,500 for General Funds to Capital Reserve Funds toward purchase of a replacement Town Grader.

8) To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum not

to exceed \$2,000.00 from General Funds to Capital Reserve Funds toward purchase of a fire truck. (At request of the Chichester Vol. Fire Dept.)

9) To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$12,000.00 toward purchase of a fire truck, \$2,000.00 to be raised by current year taxes and the Selectmen to issue Serial Notes for the remaining \$10,000.00 payable in equal installments of \$2,000.00 each in the years 1974, 1975, 1976, 1977 and 1978. (At request of the Chichester Vol. Fire Dept.)

10) To see if the Town will vote to adopt the National Building Code and National Fire Protection Association's Life Safety Code 101.

11) To see if the Town will vote to join the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission and appropriate the sum of \$698.00 as the Town share for the studies and operation of this Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes. (At request of Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission.)

12) To see if the Town will vote to join in the establishing of a Central Dispatch Center for towns in the Concord Area Compact and to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,000.00 as this year's costs.

13) To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls will be open until 6:00 P.M.

All articles except No. 1, above will be taken up beginning at 7:00 P.M.

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

In reporting for the Fire Dept. this year we answered only 10 calls of which 5 were for out of town assistance.

This compares with 22 calls in 1971. Although this is a decided decrease in calls for assistance over last year let us not become unconscious of the danger of fire at any time.

Again this year I would like to urge the voters to support an appropriation for a new truck for the Fire Dept. Because of the lack of water in the rural areas tank trucks become a prime requirement to transport water to the location of the fire.

Another matter which I would like to bring to the attention of the people of Chichester is the establishing of a Central Dispatch Center for area towns in the Concord Area Compact. In effect this would mean all fire or emergency calls would be reported to, and dispatched by this center which would be located in the Central Station of the Concord Fire Dept. This matter should be given thorough study and attention before the town enters into any agreement in regards to this dispatch center. As the operating cost of this center is pro-rated among the participating towns an article will be presented for appropriating Chichester's share.

At the present time it seems that the Fire Dept. can live within its present budget, however added use of the fire station for community activities has increased the operating costs for heat and light.

I am always ready to answer or discuss any matter relating to the fire station or service in our community.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative State-town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire; remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

The library during the past year has been operated by the trustees with the kind assistance of Mrs. James Bates, Sr. and Mrs. Floyd Blackman, retired librarian, who has acted as consultant, and the ever faithful library aides. After an unsuccessful attempt to obtain a librarian, it was decided to divide the duties to assure a smooth operation until a librarian is appointed.

Mrs. Mary Edmunds, who retired after serving 30 years as a trustee, was honored at an open house celebration given in her honor during National Library Week and Rachael Carson's "House of Life" was dedicated in her name and added to the library shelves.

Mrs. Alfred Carson, who became her replacement, became a most welcome addition to the trustees. A professional librarian, she has been able to advise and add a wide range of information, all beneficial to the total library program. She has been in charge of ordering children's books and conducted a reading, music, arts and crafts program last summer for children of Grades 3 to 5.

During the year over 200 new books were processed to add to the permanent collection. There were several anonymous gifts, as well as gifts from Mrs. Clarence Shaw, Mrs. Howard Fleming, Mrs. Jane Coons, Mrs. Alvin Hussey, Mrs. Donald Brasley, Mrs. Andrew Bailey, Mrs. John Varney, Mrs. Ronald Pike, Miss Shirley Waters and Mr. and Mrs. Robert Myers. Dr. Ursula Sanders of Concord gave a memorial gift the National Geographic "Man's Best Friend," a complete book on dogs, in memory of her former neighbor, Howard Burton.

For the eighth year Mrs. Ruth Blackman Caskey, made a most generous gift of money to be disbursed for the benefit of the library at the discretion of the trustees. Several new books have been purchased from this fund.

The trustees have continued cooperating with the school. Mrs. Dana Ordway served as the liaison aide taking books to the school when requested and returning them. During the winter months library sponsored films were shown at the school with a member of the staff in attendance to meet the requirements of the State Library.

The library aides have continued to meet monthly to work on the growing catalog and met last fall to beautify the Town Hall grounds. This was in addition to their staffing the library Monday and Thursday evenings from 7 to 9 p.m.

The Friends of the Library have continued their support by holding a film party for the school children during their winter vacation, participated in the Grange flea market, Old Home Day parade and assisted in other library fund raising activities.

Work has been started on making additional space on the shelves in the library by removing the large panels between and it is hoped soon to have the library rearranged to make for more efficient use of its facilities.

The trustees responding to the great need for more space, more efficient facilities and easier access decided last March to start a fund for a new library building which they felt was badly needed. Several ac-

tivities were conducted with a large portion of the townspeople assisting in one way or another. The goal of \$1,000 for '72 was met and '73 will be another successful year with the continued help of all those interested in seeing their town library grow and expand.

REPORT OF THE CHICHESTER SCHOOL BOARD 1972-73

During the past year, the State Board of Education studied the advisability of splitting Supervisory Union 53. The Union Boards met several times and carefully considered the plan and the cost. Because of the added burden of expenses to the smaller towns (estimated double the cost to Chichester of the 1972-73 share), the majority of the towns wished to continue in the present unit. The State Board has agreed to this plan, for the present, with the understanding another Assistant Superintendent and secretary be hired to relieve the work load of the present staff. The Union office recently moved into much needed larger space. This move was delayed nearly a year — waiting the decision of the State Board of Education on possible reorganization.

In October, the State Board of Education instructed this school board to make an effort to settle the ever-recurring problem of exceptions for Chichester students attending Pembroke Academy. Your chairman met with Mr. Paire and the Pittsfield School Board to try to find a workable solution to the problem. A public meeting was held, and the people present were unanimous in their decision not to request a change in the AREA agreement at this time. Pittsfield could not offer a contract for more than three years for twelve students. The possibility of bus service to Restaurant 28 should be very helpful in solving the transportation problem. Parents may still appeal individually in extreme "hardship cases."

Our Chichester staff is continuing their efforts to improve the curriculum offered our students and co-ordinate programs with Pembroke Academy. The number of students have remained nearly the same for the past few years. There is still a need for a cafeteria and physical education facility. Because of soaring construction costs, increased tuition and items we cannot control, your board is not recommending a building program at this time.

The library space is becoming too small. Very soon, long range planning will need to be considered in this area. Library volunteers are continuing their cooperative efforts with Mr. Fowler to manage the library to utilize the facilities most effectively for students and teachers. The help of the volunteers is deeply appreciated.

The past year has seen changes in several areas. Mrs. Rose Welch, our very efficient and capable cook, resigned at the end of the school year in June 1972, after serving the school for several years. We are presently fortunate to have the services of Mrs. Carol Anderson as cook. She, with the help of Mrs. Mabel Stevens, has continued the high quality of our hot lunch program.

We are indebted to Mr. James Brown for his continued efforts in keeping our school clean. No major projects are planned for the summer except for possibly some grading and seeding to help with the mud problem. The usual routine of preventive maintenance is planned for furnace, roof, plumbing and painting.

We are extremely fortunate to have Mr. Kempton Ricker increase his bus service in the area with the purchase of a second large bus. He now furnishes transportation to Pembroke Academy for local high school students. By utilizing two buses, the grammar school students are picked up later in the morning and nearly all the waiting after school has been eliminated. Parents, students and faculty all appreciate the added services.

The entire community shares with Mr. Kempton Ricker and his family the sorrow of the untimely death of his wife, Irene Ricker. She won the respect and affection of all students and their parents whom she so capably and faithfully served as bus driver for fifteen years. She will be missed by all of us.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Today's schools are indeed becoming more and more complex. We see evidence of this here in Chichester. The job of the teacher is ever more demanding and one that requires constant re-evaluation in terms of today's business. Inside and outside education, there are forces that propose changes in our schools.

Some call for a return to "basic education," while still others want more emphasis on "creativity" and "individualized instruction." This is the dilemma facing your School Board.

At our town level, we realize that the curriculum is affected by the availability of materials, physical facilities, and community demands, including financial resources.

Teaching techniques previously have been geared toward drill and repetition. Today we find the stress on developing understanding and overall content, rather than studying isolated factual material.

There is great need to adjust the curriculum to the needs of the times. We might very well find in the near future, full-time teachers working on developing the curriculum when students are not in attendance.

Libraries or media centers will need to receive a high priority in our town budget if standards are to be maintained. Title II of the Elementary and Secondary Act of 1965 has helped us some but much more local effort is needed in the years to come.

We need and hopefully will see much stress in the future on Vocational Education. A school program is certainly needed that will enable every young person completing Grade 12 to be ready to enter higher education or to enter useful and rewarding employment. We are really talking about the capacity of our people to

sustain and accelerate the pace of progress in this country during a lifetime of learning.

I appreciate the cooperation of the School Board and the community in our educational endeavors.
