### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the inhabitants of the Town of Errol, qualified to vote in town affairs.*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Errol on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools for the ensuing year.

5. To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the public library for the ensuing year.

6. To see what action the town will take on Chapter 133, Laws of 1903.

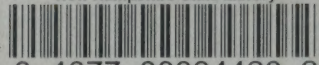
