To the inhabitants of the town of
Haverhill qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next (March 9) at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following matters:

1. To choose a town clerk.
2. To hear the reports of the selectmen, treasurer, cemetery commissioners, and any other town officers heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.
3. To choose three selectmen, town treasurer, one or more highway agents, one or more auditors, one library trustee for the term of three years, one cemetery commissioner for five years, and any others necessary to fill vacancies, one trustee of trust funds for three years, and all other necessary town officers.
4. To raise and appropriate money for the support of the poor.
5. To raise and appropriate money for the construction of state trunk line roads.
6. To raise and appropriate money for maintenance of state trunk line roads; and to see if the town will vote to accept the provisions of Chapter 117, Laws of 1917, on a section of the Moosilauke road, so called, and appropriate or set aside from the amount raised for highway work the sum of seventy five dollars for this purpose.
7. To raise and appropriate money for the construction of state aid roads.

8. To raise and appropriate money for the maintenance of state aid roads.

9. To raise and appropriate money for laying out, building and repairing highways and bridges.

10. To raise and appropriate money to provide funds for the treasury sufficient to defray the cost of the settlement agreed on concerning the Woodsville highway money.

11. To raise and appropriate money to pay interest and principal of outstanding town notes.

12. To raise and appropriate money for town libraries.

13. To raise and appropriate money for Memorial Day.

14. To raise and appropriate money for the support of the Cottage Hospital.

15. To raise and appropriate money for band concerts.

16. To raise and appropriate a sum of money to be paid to the Cottage Hospital, to be held by said Hospital in trust, the interest and principal thereof to be expended under the authority and direction of a committee of three appointed by the Tracey Ross Post of the American Legion in caring for soldiers, sailors and marines who were in active service in the late war from this town.

17. To raise and appropriate money for other town charges.

18. To see if the town will vote to establish one or more voting districts and additional polling places therein, as provided for by Chapter 30, Laws of 1919.

19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to issue prescription permits to druggists.

20. To see if the town will vote to discontinue that part of the river road lying westerly of the railing in front of the blacksmith shop of Frank I. Keyes, near Oliverian village, so called.

21. To see if the town will appoint a budget committee to supervise the appropriations of said town, and to recommend to the next annual meeting the amounts to be raised for various purposes, such recommendations to be printed in the next annual report.

22. To transact any other business proper to come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SELECTMEN

To the Citizens and Taxpayers of Haverhill:

The selectmen submit herewith their report for the year ending January 31, 1920. Upon the following pages will be found the detailed statements.

CHANGE IN DIVISION OF ASSESSED VALUATIONS

Whereas during the past few years the division between assessed valuations of the town and Woodsville Fire Precinct has been upon the basis of 52% to the former and 48% to the latter, the 1919 appraisal shows an increase in the town valuation sufficient to make the division 54% to the town and 46% to the Woodsville Fire Precinct. Therefore upon highway monies, for every dollar raised or expended, 46c goes to Woodsville Fire Precinct and 54c to the balance of the town.

REDUCTION OF THE TOWN DEBT

Notes for \$12,000 and \$5,000 were paid and burned in the presence of the selectmen and town treasurer. Notes outstanding now are as follows:

The net decrease in the town debt for the fiscal year just closed is \$13,292.52.

STAHL vs. TOWN OF HAVERHILL

In protecting the Town's action in assessing taxes to Mr. Stahl, the selectmen have had to defend court action on the part of Mr. Stahl. The New Hampshire State Tax Commission has held that the town's action was legal. The taxes in question have been collected and the court costs assessed to Mr. Stahl. He still has the right to appeal to the Supreme Court.

TAX COLLECTIONS

The amount collected by taxation this year was \$96,833.32 with abatements of \$242.36, sold to the town \$447.64.

BUDGET COMMITTEE

The recommendations of the budget committee are substantially the same as last year, with the exception of suggesting a larger appropriation for the maintenance of the poor. Charges to this account are largely beyond the selectmen's control and have been particularly heavy during the last year and with no relief in sight. The recommendation of the budget committee
