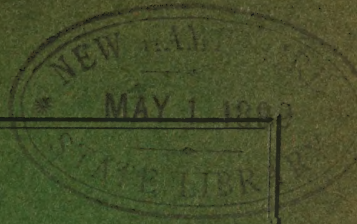

## WARRANT.

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

---

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Milan qualified to vote in town affairs:—*

You are hereby notified to meet at Androscoggin hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote three Selectmen.
4. To choose by ballot and major vote a town Treasurer.
5. To choose road agents and all other necessary town officers including fish and game wardens.
6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor and other necessary charges arising within the town.
7. To see what sums of money the town will raise for laying out, building and repairing highways and bridges.

---

8. To see what sums of money the town will raise for breaking roads during the winter of 1899 and 1900.

9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools.

10. To see if the town will vote not to distribute inventory blanks until such time as the selectmen shall examine and appraise property to be taxed.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.

12. To choose library trustee to serve for three years.

13. To see if the town will vote not to have a liquor agent.

14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of widening and straightening the walks in the cemetery at Milan.

15. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation for a term of ten years a grist mill and butter factory combined, with the necessary machinery, or either one single, or a lumber or shingle mill, if built by responsibly parties during the year 1899, in the village of West Milan.

16. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation for ten years any saw mill or mills and the necessary machinery and plant for the sawing of logs and the manufacturing of lumber in this town if built within the next two years.

17. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation a grist mill or grist mills with the necessary machinery and plant or plants if built within the next two years, in the town of Milan.



18. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

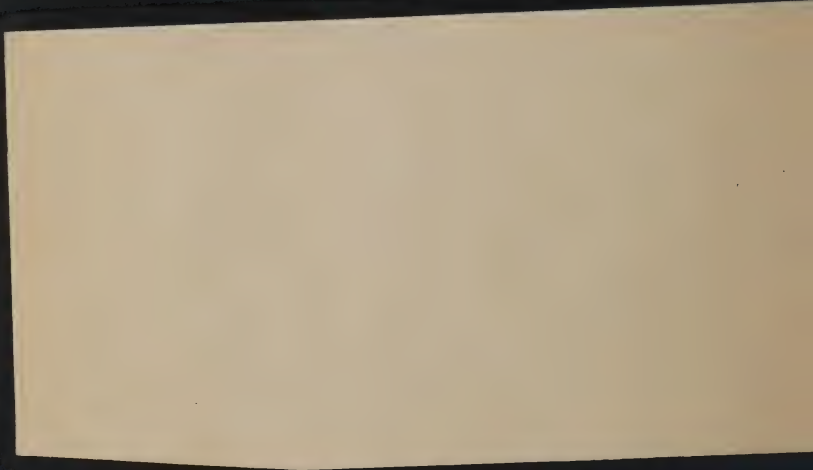
