Wally Weaver Sr. was born on August 25, 1928 in Kingston, New Brunswick, Canada. Wally moved to Stoddard in 1955 to work at Pitcher Mountain farm as a hired hand. He became a manager of the farm in 1971, eventually becoming nationally known as an expert in raising and breeding Scottish Highlander cattle. Many other breeders looked up to Wally for advice and information. Wally was involved in 4-H as a leader in woodworking for about 15 years. He also joined the fire department where he served as Deputy Fire Chief and was heavily involved for many years. He became a Deputy Warden for the State of New Hampshire Forest Fire Service and held that position also for many years. Wally died on August 19th, 1998 and was put to rest on top of the mountain overlooking the farm and all its beautiful surroundings. He will be greatly missed throughout the town, and will always be in our hearts.

John Secco was an active member of the Stoddard Fire and Rescue Department. John's involvement in our town activities were many. He was a jolly Santa for the children's Christmas parties. SELECTMEN'S NARRATIVE

The 1998 year started off with a bang! That was the sound of ice crashing down from trees, wires and roof tops. This storm, perhaps one of the worst in the history of the town, caused damage to our forests that will take years to recover. We have been reimbursed for many of our expenses by FEMA, and this year's warrant includes a matching amount for a forestry grant.

A drive on Route 123, through the center of town shows a face lift. The town Library has been painted and windows reglazed. A more dramatic change is at the Transfer Station. The town barn has been removed and a new fence installed. The bell in the town Hall rings again, too, after structural decay was repaired in the belfry. Turn onto School Street and you'll soon see the site of our new town ball field. Two warrant articles this year are associated with the formation of a Recreation Commission and funding the development of the site.

The most startling change in landscape is the completion of the multipurpose room at the Faulkner Elementary School. That is why we chose it for this year's cover. This room will be an asset to both the school and the community.

TOWN OF STODDARD TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the ninth (9th) day of March 1999, next at eleven (11:00AM) of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles: The Polls will be open from 11:00AM to 7:00PM.

ART. 1: To choose by ballot all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ART. 2: To vote by ballot to amend the Stoddard Community Planning Ordinance Article II to include a Village District and to insert a new Article III-A to govern the Village District. (By Petition) Recommended by the Stoddard Planning Board. Majority vote.

ART. 3: To vote by ballot to amend the Stoddard Community Planning Ordinance, as proposed by the Stoddard Planning Board concerning Wireless Communication Facilities.

You are hereby notified to meet at the School Multipurpose Room in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the sixteenth (16th) day of March 1999, next at seven (7:00PM) of the clock in the evening, to act upon the articles 4 through 31.

ART. 4: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to maintain E-911 records. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the operation of the Stoddard Conservation Commission. The Conservation Commission and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1200 for the Lay Monitoring Program. The Conservation Commission and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 7: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for the residents of Stoddard to participate in four (4) town house-hold hazardous waste collection days at the City of Keene Recycling Center. Collection dates are scheduled for 4/24, 5/15, 6/5 & 6/19 - 1999 from 8am – 1pm. The Conservation Commission and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 8: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$52,000 for the operational expenses of the Stoddard Recycling and Transfer Station. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 9: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,225. For the operation and maintenance of the Davis Library. The Library Trustees and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 10: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,215 for the operating budget of the Stoddard Fire & Rescue Department for the ensuing year. The Fire & Rescue Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 11: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$23,976. for the lease payment of the four-wheel drive, front line pumper fire engine. The Fire and Rescue Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 12: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500 for Antrim ambulance service for the ensuing year. The Fire & Rescue Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 13: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for Marlow ambulance service for the ensuing year. The Fire & Rescue Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 14: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for the purchase of building material, to construct a building behind the Fire Station to house the Rescue Boat. The Fire & Rescue Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 15: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 for the operating budget of the Stoddard Fire Warden. The Fire Warden and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 16: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,500 (\$6,500 to be raised by taxation - \$24,000 in revenue) for the purpose of clean-up/damage caused during the 1998 ice storm. This grant from the NH Ice Storm Community Forestry Grant approved by the Governor and Council. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 17: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000. for the purchase of a second hand one ton four-wheel drive vehicle to replace the old surplus three-quarter ton vehicle, known as the brush truck. The Fire Warden recommends this appropriation. The Selectmen recommend this article on a two to one vote.

ART 18: To see if the Town will accept a 7/10ths of a mile section of Kings Highway, extending from the Hidden Lake Civic Association sign/map south to that portion of Kings Highway that is currently a Town Highway, as a Town Highway (Class V). The cost for conforming the highway to the Town's construction standards and requirements, if necessary, are to be allocated by way of a betterment assessment on the owners of property abutting and served by Kings Highway as provided for by RSA 231:29. (by Petition) The Selectmen have no recommendation on this article.

ART. 19: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$119,854 for winter and summer maintenance, emergencies and planned repair of Town roads and bridges. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART 20: To see if the town will vote to appoint the Selectmen as agents to expend funds in the Shedd Hill Bridge Capital Reserve Fund created in 1994. The Selectmen recommend this article.

ART. 21: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$128,570 to defray Town charges for the ensuing year. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 22: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,000 for the operating budget of the Stoddard Police Department. The Police Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 23: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,635. as the operating budget for the Stoddard Planning Board for the ensuing year. The Stoddard Planning Board and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 24: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$711. for the membership to the Southwest Region Planning Commission for the ensuing year. The Stoddard Planning Board and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 25: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200. as the operating budget of the Stoddard Zoning Board for the ensuing year. The Stoddard Zoning Board and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 26: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,160. for the purchase of an Intel Pentium 233 MHz computer with Windows 98 operating system and Lexmark printer for use by the Planning Board, Supervisors of the Checklist and Zoning Board of Adjustment. The Planning Board, Supervisors of the Checklist, Zoning Board of Adjustment and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

ART. 27: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 to Home Healthcare, Hospice and Community Services (HCS) to support the continuance of home and health services being provided to the residents of Stoddard. (by Petition) The Selectmen have no recommendation on this article.

ART 28: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$630.00 for services provided by Monadnock Family Services to uninsured and underinsured residents of Stoddard. (by Petition) The Selectmen have no recommendation on this article.

ART 29: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,474.00 to help support the work of The Community Kitchen Inc., in Keene NH. (by Petition) The Selectmen have no recommendation on this article.

ART 30: To see if the Town will agree to form a Recreation Commission consisting of three residents appointed to three year staggered terms pursuant to RSA35-B:4 (by Petition) The Selectmen recommend this article.

ART 31: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten thousand dollars and 00/100 (\$10,000.00) to be used by the Recreation Commission to further the development of the ball field beside the James Faulkner Elementary School and to promote recreation in the town. (by Petition) The Selectmen recommend this article.

STODDARD FIRE & RESCUE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT

In 1998 we responded and participated in a total of 171 emergency calls and activities: 37 fire calls, 47 rescue responses, 7 motor vehicle accidents, 50 radio checks, 15 training drills and 15 meetings.

We received delivery of our new 4-wheel drive pumper in March and have it fully equipped and ready for any emergency. We have been pleased with its performance.

Through donations in memory of John Secco, we have begun construction of a 15' X 30' building in the rear of the fire station to house the rescue boat for better access and response time. We hope to appropriate the sum of \$5,000 through a town warrant article to complete construction.

This year we purchased, through a warrant article, a defibrillator. We believe this will greatly enhance our rescue capabilities in the event of any cardiac emergency.

Seven rescue personnel recently participated in an emergency first responder class. All members passed and we appreciate all their time and efforts.

We appreciate all the townspeople's support and help in our fund raising and public relations events.

FIRE WARDEN'S ANNUAL REPORT 1998

As you all know, we experienced two ice storms in January 1998 which caused severe damage to our forests and lands, not only in the town of Stoddard, but all over the State of New Hampshire. Severe fire problems could be eminent because of the surface fuels resulting in downed branches and trees. Bent over trees provide lateral fuels for the canopy above. Travel in some of these areas is impassable either by vehicle or foot travel. The deputy wardens and myself did a survey of the damage in early March and found the destruction to the forest shocking. I am asking everyone who will be traveling in our forests to be extra careful with cigarettes, atv's, and motor vehicles that can cause any type of ignition.

We experienced some minor fires this year due to ashes being thrown out in leaves, permit burns not being attended and electrical fires due to wires down. There were several fires caused by careless disposal of ashes throughout the state that almost burned several structures. This year we were lacking rainfall in the early fall. Cheshire County was extremely dry and our fire danger was ranging from the high class 4 day to class 5 days. We stopped issuing any fire permits for a period of time, until we received adequate rainfall.

Once again there were a few of us who attended the state wide forest fire training put on by the Division of Forest and Lands Forest Fire Service. The state once again called one of our firefighters to duty with the state forest fire crews to Grand Marois, Minnesota for a period of two weeks to help aid in fighting forest fires.

Remember that you need to obtain a fire permit for any open burning or cooking unless it is with a gas or charcoal grill. This can be done by contacting your local forest fire warden or any of his authorized agents.

In closing, I ask everyone to be extra careful this coming year. The fuel will be at their prime and very dangerous to any fires that they come into contact with. None of us would like to experience another 1941 fire. History does have a way of repeating itself and it will take all of us to protect our Forests and Lands that are so dear to us.

Remember only you can prevent Forest Fires

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

To aid your Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department and State Forest Ranger, contact your local Fire Department to find out if a permit is required before doing ANY outside burning. Violations of RSA 227-L:17, the fire permit law and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines of up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail. Violators are also liable for all fire suppression costs.

There are ten Forest Rangers who work for the New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands, Forest Protection Bureau. State Forest Rangers are available to assist communities with forest fire suppression, prevention and training programs as well as the enforcement of forest fire and timber harvest laws. If you have any questions regarding forest fire or timber harvest laws, please call our office at 271-2217.

There are 2400 Forest Fire Wardens and Deputy Forest Fire Wardens throughout the state. Each town has a Forest Fire Warden and several Deputy Wardens who assist the Forest Rangers with forest fire suppression, prevention, and law enforcement. Early in 1998 we experienced an ice storm, which caused severe damage to forests of New Hampshire. This damage created a greater potential fire hazard as well as safety hazards to many areas of the state. Your local fire warden and Forest Rangers need your assistance in preventing wildfires in these hard hit areas and throughout the state. If you need assistance or information dealing with ice damaged woodlands, please call 1-800-444-8978.

The State of New Hampshire operates 15 fire towers, 2 mobile patrols and 3 contract aircraft patrols. This early detection and reports from citizens aid in the quick response from local fire departments. This is a critical factor in controlling the size of wildland fires and keeping the loss of property and suppression costs as low as possible.

STODDARD POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

Burglaries have taken a sharp increase. We are doing our best to combat this trend, but we need your help by calling in suspicious activities, or suspicious vehicles.

Speeding on Route 123 North is still the number one complaint. I recorded we did over one hundred motor vehicle stops with numerous warnings and summonses issued. With the increased volume of traffic we need to increase our speed enforcement.

We are very fortunate this year, having acquired the services of Roger Turcotte as a new Police Officer for the Town of Stoddard. Roger brings with him experience and a sense of commitment and impartiality. Roger has been very active and successful in prosecuting our DWI cases. We have cases pending that are being investigated jointly with other agencies.

At this time, I would like to again thank the Townspeople for their continued support and assistance over the past year. A special "Thank-You" goes to Animal Control Officer Joan Zelasny and the Stoddard Fire & Rescue Department for all their extra effort on our behalf during 1998. Without their help we could not have had such a successful and productive year.

I would again like to encourage anyone that has a comment or question relative to the Police Department to please come in and talk with me about it. Several people have taken the opportunity to do this over the past year and even though we may not always agree on the outcome, at least we can reach a mutual understanding of the matter.

PLANNING BOARD REPORT 1998

Several trends were noted this year. More citizens chose to discuss their plans, ask questions and work with Town Boards in an informal manner before finalizing their projects, thus avoiding later problems. Also a number of taxpayers holding adjacent lots executed voluntary mergers.

One reconfiguration of a previously accepted subdivision was approved. The Board worked with a local business to establish an "as built" plan to serve for future reference and the reclamation status of a gravel pit was evaluated.

Many hours were spent on the Village District proposal, hearings and subsequent legal questions. The controversial vote and Special Town Meeting required much of the Board's working time. Throughout this difficult period the Board worked harmoniously and with respect for individual member perspectives.

The Board has continued to review regulations for wireless communications facilities (towers) and to develop a proposal for the March warrant. While the Town has some regulatory control, it is limited by Federal Communications Acts.

Members shared land planning information throughout the year including a review of recent legislative and court rulings pertaining to land use, the authority for local environmental legislation and the prevention of sprawl as presented in the annual municipal law lectures.

As outgoing chair of the Board, I would like to thank its members for their commitment, faithful attendance and cooperation. I especially want to thank Patricia Putnam who willingly honors every request and works long into the night to present information in a timely manner.

The Stoddard Police responded to an additional 5 complaints relating to animals. I would like to stress the importance of identification being secured to your dog's collar in the event it should wander from your premises. If your animal can be identified by the police or animal control, a trip to the Humane Society could be avoided. Unless we are familiar with an animal and might recognize it, we need to take it to the shelter for the safety of the animal. We make every attempt to avoid this, but cannot possibly know each dog in the town. The trip is costly in terms of wages, mileage to the Town; costly to an owner who may have to reclaim the dog and most importantly is very distressing to these pets.

Also, if your cat disappears, please put up notices and contact the Animal Control officer or police in the event your cat shows up elsewhere and is thought to be a stray. Unless the cat wears some sort of identification, the shelter is not obligated to keep the cat for the 7 day period.

The close proximity of lakes and ponds becomes dangerous in the winter. Dogs who wander on the ice could break through. Several towns in the area have already responded to this type of call at great risk to human safety. One dog did not make it out.

If your pet becomes lost, please be sure to call the Animal Control Officer or the Stoddard Police. The phone numbers are listed in front of the Town Report.

STODDARD CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission continues to meet regularly on the first Monday of the month to review applications. Nine dredge and fill permits were requested and the Commission reviewed and commented on all of them in addition to making site visits. The State Department of Environmental Services granted 1 variance granted for a septic repair on Highland Lake.

Again this year the Conservation Commission hosted a Lakes Monitoring kickoff meeting in June. Lake monitors reviewed sampling stations and results from last year. See the Lakes Monitoring report for a summary of conditions on each of the lakes or ponds.

In addition, the Conservation Commission hosted a workshop "Living with Big Game". Mark Ellingwood of the NH Fish and Game Department gave an interesting presentation on the black bear in NH. The workshop was held on the Old Home Days weekend and was well attended.

This year the Conservation Commission sponsored the Household Hazardous Waste Collection which was held in conjunction with the City of Keene's program. Two dates of collection were available to Stoddard residents, one in June and the second in October. A total of 31 people participated. We were pleased with the great turnout and hope that future collections are as successful.

As usual the Commission would like to remind folks that any work involving dredging, or fill in wetlands - including docks, piers, abutments, retaining walls, etc... or new construction within 250' to lakes and ponds require an application to the DES. In addition, the Town has an established 50' buffer zone to wetlands and surface waters. No alteration is allowed in that zone for new construction projects except by special exception granted through the Board of Adjustment.

Persons interested in joining the Conservation Commission should petition the Selectmen for appointment.

Lake Monitoring Program

Lakes Report Summaries/Concerns - Sampling Season 1997

Note - the Lakes Reports are issued the winter following the sampling season. Therefore to be included in the Town report, the summary is that of the previous year. For the 1998 summaries contact your lake monitors, they should be available by March.

Center Pond

The pH rebounded from its all time low in the pond in 1996. Large volumes of precipitation during the spring flush and the summer rains increased pond acidity for that year. Conductivity in the pond continues to be extremely low. Because conductivity often increases as human impacts increase, these values are signs of watershed and pond health. An increase in leeches was noted however. While they are considered unpleasant company by most humans, leeches are not a sign of poor water quality. They often live under leaves in a pond; when these areas are disturbed, leeches are observed more frequently.

Granite Lake

Granite Lake monitors increased sampling frequency to three times this year. This is extremely helpful in adding data for evaluating the condition of the lake. Townline inlet has shown little improvement since its severe decline inequality in 1994, around the time of the route 9 bypass construction. High levels of conductance is of concern (>100 is generally an indicator of human pollution sources) as an indicator of excessive untreated runoff of road salt, faulty septic systems or other runoff source. Sampling should continue along this section to better pinpoint the source. Oxygen saturation levels are high, a healthy sign for the lake ecosystem.

Island Pond

While large volumes of snowmelt and rain had caused the water in the pond and stream to be more acidic, acidity was back to normal, healthy levels for the health of the pond and its dependent wildlife. Inlet phosphorus was lower on average than all previous years, an encouraging trend. Bacteria levels measured in July were very low. High use areas (beach/launch) should be monitored during peak use times.

Highland Lake

Bacteria samples collected in August at the Hidden Lake Association Beach and on the west side of the Outlet had very low levels of *E. coli*. Samples should be taken during peak use times. Freezeland Brook was sampled showing good water quality. This dark tea colored stream is naturally influenced by surrounding wetlands. There is concern with low dissolved oxygen at the bottom of the lake at the North Station. Low dissolved oxygen influences the release of phosphorus from bottom sediments - a water quality concern. Rice Brook continues to be monitored for phosphorus and nutrients.

Robb Reservoir

The reservoir is an aging water body with natural wetland influences. There has not been a monitoring program here for several years.

Strategies/Issues

*Address runoff due to unstable beaches and construction erosion. *Septic system maintenance.

*Test road runoff in areas noted.

*Add tributaries for more complete monitoring.

*Control invasive plants.

*Monitor mercury levels more closely.

*Add Robb Reservoir back in to monitoring program.

*Establish phosphorus reduction program.

*Address increased boating activity - size and speed.

*Improve regulation education and enforcement.

A brief recap of lakeside DOs and DON'Ts:

*Do pump out your septic tank every 3-5 years

*Do maintain your system and check your leachfield area

*Do use low or no-phosphate detergents

*Do keep land clearing to a minimum

*Do maintain a buffer of natural vegetation at least 50' wide along the shore

*Do Not bathe, shampoo, wash boats, pets, or things in or near the lake with soap

*Do Not wash automobiles near the lake

*Do Not use fertilizer near the lake shore

*Do Not burn brush or leaves near the shore, or on the ice in winter

*Do Not urinate or defecate in the lake, and don't allow pets to do so

This information is summarized from the Lake Monitoring reports issued by the Department of Environmental Services. These reports are developed with the data collected by Stoddards lake Monitors. For more information contact your local Lake Monitor or the Conservation Commission chair.

TEST DESCRIPTIONS

pН

A measurement of acidity. A pH of 7 is neutral. Lower pH values indicate acidic conditions. High pH values indicate basic (alkaline) conditions. Little or no fish life remains when pH falls much below 5. NH average is 6.0

Transparency

A measure of water clarity, affected by the amount of phytoplankton, color (dissolved organic compounds), and particulate matter in the lake. Meaured by lowering a Secchi disk into the water and observing depth for disappearance. Standard: >13.1 ft. is Oligotrophic, 6.6 to 13.1 ft. is Mesotrophic, and <6.6 ft. is Eutrophic. NH average is 12.8.

Chlorophyl a

A green pigment in plants required for photosynthesis. A good indicator of abundance of microscopic plants and algae. Units are mg. per cubic meter. Standard: <4 is Oligotrophic, 4 to 10 is Mesotrophic, and >15 is Eutrophic. NH average is 7.3.

Total Phosphorus

Limiting nutrient that promotes plant and algae growth in lakes. Increased TP encourages excessive weed growth and algae blooms. Comes from decaying matter, soils, leachfields, land clearing, and agriculture runoff. Units are ug/L. Standard: <10 is Oligotrophic, and >20 is Eutrophic. NH average is 11.

Color

A measure of dissolved metals (iron and manganese), dissolved organic compounds, and suspended matter in water. Standard: 0 to 20 is crystal clear, 20 to 35 is slightly tea-colored, and 35 to 10 is tea colored to highly colored. NH average is 25.

Conductivity

Ability of water to carry an electrical current. High conductivity may indicate pollution from road salting, faulty septic systems or agriculture runoff. Units are umhos/cm. Standard: 0 to 50 is Oligotrophic, 50 to 100 is Mesotrophic, and >100 is Eutrophic. NH average is 56.4.

Bacteria

Most surface waters contain a variety of microorganisms including bacteria, fungi, protozoa and algae. Most of these occur naturally and have little or no impact on human health. Specific types of bacteria, called indicators, are the basis of bacterial monitoring, because their presence tends to indicate fecal contamination. Contamination arises most commonly from sources such as failing septic systems, nonpoint source runoff from wildlife habitat areas, livestock or pets having access to surface waters, and swimming beaches with heavy use or shallow swim areas.

Article 5. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to add to the capital reserve fund for dam maintenance and repair.

The motion was appropriately moved and seconded.

<u>Article 6.</u> To see whether the district will accept funds from the Granite Lake Association and from any other source for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, and replacing and dam.

The motion was appropriately moved and seconded.

The vote was affirmative.

The moderator called for any new business. A discussion followed regarding the drawdown date for this fall. Most N.H. lakes have an Oct. 12. date and there is a question of the state's liability before that date. Dave Costin said he would check with an attorney before we proceed with a date of Oct 1., as requested by the Granite Lake Association.

Motion was heard to hold next year's meeting directly following the Granite Lake Association meeting. It was appropriately moved and seconded; the vote was affirmative.

ARTICLE II - Community Planning Ordinance

The Town of Stoddard is hereby divided into the following districts as shown on the Community Planning Map of Stoddard, NH. The original map is filed in the Office of the Town Clerk.

1. Residential Districts:

The two residential districts include the areas commonly known as Stoddard Center and South Stoddard. Both districts include land within three hundred (300) feet of the public road measured perpendicularly from the center of the public road.

A. Residential District One begins at the intersection of Route 123 and Center Pond Road and extends along both sides of the road to the westerly side of the intersection of Old Forest Road and Route 123 and includes:

- a. Along both sides of the road from the intersection of Route 123 to the Elementary School.
- b. Along both sides of Mt. Stoddard Road a distance of one thousand two hundred ninety (1,290) feet from the intersection with Route 123.
- c. Along both sides of King's Highway a distance of one thousand three hundred fifty (1,350) feet from the intersection with Route 123.
- d. Along the westerly side of Old Forest Road a distance of five hundred (500) feet from the intersection with Route 123.
- e. Along both sides of the road from the center of the Shedd Hill bridge nine hundred fifty (950) feet east on the Old Antrim Road, and from the center of the bridge two thousand two hundred (2,200) feet north along Shedd Hill Road.

B. *Residential District Two* extends along both sides of Route 123 from Route 9 fifteen hundred (1,500) feet south.

3. Lakeside District:

This district will include land surrounding Highland Lake, Granite Lake and Island Pond to a distance of five hundred (500) feet measured from the normal lake level as maintained by existing dams at the effective date of this ordinance except for land otherwise included in the residential Districts or Village District.

4. Rural District:

This district includes all land not included in the Residential, Village or Lakeside Districts.

The Fire & Rescue Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Moved by John Wilder, Seconded by Candy Wilder . AN AMENDMENT by John Wilder to raise \$6,300.00 Seconded by Candy Wilder. The Amendment passes. Article 15 is adopted as amended for the amount of \$6,300.

Art. 16: Petition to Lay Out Highway was submitted to the Selectmen and a request that a highway be laid out (altered) at the following location:

> From where the Town has determined the Town road ends to the Hidden Lake Civic Association sign (map), located at the intersection of Kings Highway and Kennedy Brook Drive. Approximately 1.5 miles in length.

(by Petition) BALLOT VOTE

The actual miles noted by the Moderator is 8/10. Moved by Cheryl Woods, Seconded by Paul Dionne. Discussion follows. The section of the road in question currently is not owned by the Development or the Town. The President of Hidden Lake Civic Association who is not a resident and asked to speak at this time is not allowed. Discussion on how much it would cost the Town to bring the road up to specifications follows. The Selectmen report the money would have to come out of the Road Budget. After more discussion Mr. Sullivan (a nonresident) and President of the Association is allowed to speak to answer any questions. He states there are 130 year round residents, 53 Households and 33 school children. To bring this road up to a Class V Highway it would cost anywhere from \$80,700.00 to \$137,900.00. More discussion follows. A motion to limit debate passes unanimously. Of 102 ballots cast there were 71 NO 31 YES. Article 16 fails.

- Art. 17: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,400.00 for Winter and Summer maintenance, emergencies and planned repair of Town roads and bridges. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Moved by Brenda Bryer, Seconded by Louis GrandPre'. Article 17 is adopted.
- Art. 18: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 for cost associated with the ice storm of 1998 to be offset by up to 87.5% reimbursement from FEMA and the State of N.H. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Moved by Louis GrandPre', Seconded by Brenda Bryer. Article 18 is adopted.
- Art. 19: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$126.535.00 to defray Town charges for the ensuing year. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Moved by Brenda Bryer, Seconded by Louis GrandPre'. Article 19 is adopted.
- Art. 20: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,180.00 to repair existing bell yoke, frame and supporting sub-structure for Town Hall bell tower. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Moved by Louis GrandPre', Seconded by Brenda Bryer. Article 20 is adopted.

- Art. 21: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,500.00 for the operating budget of the Stoddard Police Department. The Stoddard Police Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Moved by David Vaillancourt, Seconded by Louis Clark. Article 21 is adopted.
- Art. 22: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to continue a lease agreement established for the purpose of leasing a Police Cruiser for the Police Department and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,602.00 for the Police cruiser lease agreement. This lease contains an escape clause. (Majority vote required). The Stoddard Police Department and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Motion by David Vaillancourt, Seconded by Joe Sarcione. Art. 22 is adopted unanimously.
- Art. 23: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 as the operating budget for the Stoddard Planning Board for the ensuing year. The Stoddard Planning Board and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Motion by Pat Campbell, Seconded by Harry Power. Article 23 is adopted.
- Art. 24: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$695.00 for the membership to the Southwest Region Planning Commission for the ensuing year. The Stoddard Planning Board and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Motion by Pat Campbell, Seconded by Louis GrandPre'. Article 24 is adopted.
- Art. 25: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for the operating budget of the Stoddard Zoning Board for the ensuing year. The Stoddard Zoning Board and the Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Motion by Beverly Power, Seconded by Brenda Bryer. Article 25 is adopted.
- Art. 26: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800.00) to Home Healthcare, Hospice and Community Services (HCS) to support the continuance of home and health services being provided to the residents of Stoddard. (By petition) The Selectmen have no recommendation on this article. Motion by Deborah Krider, Seconded by Martha McDonough. Discussion follows. Article 26 is adopted.
- Art. 27: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1.00 per resident (total \$630.00) for services provided by Monadnock Family Services to uninsured and underinsured residents of Stoddard (by Petition) The Selectmen recommend this article on a two to one vote. Motion by Brenda Bryer, Seconded by John Adams. A voice vote on Art. 27 is questioned. On a hand vote Art. 27 is adopted unanimously.

- Art. 28: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to help support the work in the Community Kitchen, Inc., in Keene, NH (By Petition) The Selectmen recommend this article on a two to one vote. Motion by Richard Follansbee, Seconded by Meg Cline. Discussion follows. Article 28 fails unanimously.
- Art. 29: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 to be added to the Shedd Hill Bridge replacement Capital Reserve Fund established in 1994 and to appoint the Selectmen as agents to expend from this fund. (Majority vote required). The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. Motion by Louis GrandPre', seconded by Brenda Bryer. Louis GrandPre' reports on the status to date. The bid price on the bridge came in way over the price the State projected, therefore the State has put the bridge on hold. Discussion follows. More studying and engineering will be done by the State. After more discussion Article 29 fails unanimously.

The chair recognizes Louis GrandPre', Selectman, to present Brenda Bryer outgoing Selectperson with some gifts in appreciation for her dedication and experience to the Town during her term. We will all miss her.

Meeting adjourned at 9:22 P.M.

Are you in favor of amending the Stoddard Community Planning Ordinance Article II, as proposed by the Stoddard Planning Board, to include a Village District and to insert a new Article III-A to govern the Village District as described below?

ARTICLE II

4. The Village District

The Village District begins at the junction of Route 123 North and the easterly corner of Old Forest Road going in an easterly direction along both sides of Route 123 to a point six hundred (600) feet south of the intersection of Route 123 and Shedd Hill Road. The district includes land within five hundred (500) feet, measured from the edge of the right-of-way of Route 123, to the south to Route 123 and three hundred (300) feet, measured from the edge of the right-of-way, to the north of Route 123 except that no portion of Highland Lake or the outlet shall be included in the district. The westerly bank of the outlet from the dam southerly forms the easterly boundary of the District. (Residential District 1 and the Highland Lake Lakeside District are diminished by the area included in the Village District zone.)

When the Village District boundary divides a lot, the use in the Village District may be permitted to extend over the more restrictive portion of the lot to a distance of not more than thirty (30) feet beyond the Village District boundary line.

ARTICLE III-A Village District Requirements

1. Purpose:

The purpose of the Village District is to create a district in which limited business enterprises may exist for the convenience of residents and vacationers. Permitted uses shall enhance village character and be compatible with residential uses. All new business enterprises shall be in existing or architecturally comparable structures and be subject to Site Plan Review by the Stoddard Planning Board.

2. Permitted Uses:

A. Residential Dwellings, as defined in Community Planning Ordinance Article III, #3.

- B. Retail Establishments, such as: craft or artisan shops, antique shops, boutiques, general stores, sporting goods shops, drug stores.
- C. Office Uses that provide professional services for residents and visitors.
- D. Consumer Services such as banks and other financial services, beauty shops, travel agencies, day care centers.
- E. Bed and Breakfast / Lodges
- F. Eating establishments, not including drive through establishments
- 3. Non-residential uses are permitted in the Village District subject to all the following conditions:

A. Conditions:

- There shall be no nuisance to the neighborhood by reason of noise, dust, smoke, odor, illumination or other hazard to the public health.
- 2. All business properties in the Village District shall have frontage on and access from a Class V or hetter highway.
- Structures, including communication structures, shall not exceed two stories or thirty-five (35) fect.
- Adequate parking shall be provided; on-street parking is not permitted.
- Signage shall conform to Stoddard sign regulations.
- 6. External storage is not permitted in this district. Displays of goods-to-be-sold shall be permitted outdoors only during business hours of that business. External vending machines shall be permitted only with the approval of the Stoddard Planning Board.
- 7. Lot subdivisions and new construction in the Village District shall conform to the setback, lot size and frontage requirements as outlined in Article III General Regulations. Appeals for a variance to the Zoning Board of Adjustment are provided for by State Statute.
- B. All businesses to be located in the Village District, as in any other district, require Site Plan Review approval by the Stoddard Planning Board.

4. Appeals of Planning Board Decision

Planning Board Decisions, based on the terms of the Zoning Ordinance, may be appealed to the Zoning Board of Adjustment as provided by State Statute.

School Board Report

This was an exciting year for the School Board and community with the welcome addition of the Community Room. Beginning with a groundbreaking ceremony in June and continuing through mounds of plans, paperwork, changes, choosing colors and furniture – we finally have a community room we can all enjoy. The board hired Ray Lagasse as Clerk of the Works for the project. We appreciate the many hours of hard work and dedication Ray put into the project.

Mark LaFleur, Principal, and Ray Lagasse put in many hours pricing furniture and other needed items for the new room. The two saved the district many hundreds of dollars to outfit the room. Items purchased include 400 chairs, 10 round tables and four multi-use tables, chair and table racks, a portable partition, stage, lighting and portable basketball fixtures.

The first event held in the new community Room was the school's annual Christmas program in December with students performing before a full house. It was a welcome sight - the first time in many years so many people have attended one event in the town and all fit in one room. The tone was set by the students' enthusiasm, so proud to perform at their own school, on stage with lights shining on them, before a full crowd.

The board recently completed a policy for use of the Community Room after many revisions and input from residents. Reservations have already been scheduled for meetings and events. The grand opening has been rescheduled from January to a later date.

During all the construction the board decided to create an office in the existing school by removing a wall between the copier room (located off the kitchen) and a storage area. This will allow meeting space for staff, one location for all school records and important documents, and an administrative workspace without interrupting classrooms. The room will also be used by the school nurse; a portable cot has been purchased to be used by sick students.

Other items the board addressed this year include an Educational Study, Staff Development Plan and Aids Policy.

The educational study of the James Faulkner Elementary School was recently completed by Dr. Mark V. Joyce of the New Hampshire School Administrators Association. The purpose of the study was to review the instructional program and administrative structure of the school district and assess its level of effectiveness and efficiency. Strengths of the school include:

- School staff work as a team.
- Small size promotes a family atmosphere.
- The multi-age grouping allows for accommodation of individual student needs.
- School staff has been effective at developing a coordinated series of curriculum.
- A high degree of familiarity of the school by parents and community.

Challenges include:

- Tightly scheduled work environment causes lack of planning and preparation time for teaching staff.
- A serious lack of secretarial and reception support for the school.
- The design and size of the school causes challenges in staffing, instruction and program alternatives.
- An abundance of administrative paperwork to be completed on a daily basis.

Some Recommendations:

- Upgrade part-time special education position to full-time teacher with certification in learning disabilities.
- Hire a secretary/receptionist with responsibilities to include general building reception, building security and access, record management and emergency health care.
- Extend administrative time and compensation for Teaching Principal for increasing responsibilities.
- Develop an off-grade norm-referenced achievement testing program.
- Develop a "Rural Schools Initiative" by arranging a common workshop day with other small elementary districts.

The board was very pleased with the results of the study and hopes to implement some of the recommendations in the near future. People interested in reading the results of the study are welcome to obtain a copy from the James Faulkner School or the SAU Office.

School computers are now networked within the building. The school board gives special thanks to Maggie Sergeant, Grade 2/3 teacher and Technology Coordinator, for her many early mornings and late nights working on this project. She has also created a Web Page for our school which includes lunch menus, school bus information, important school notices, PTO and School Board meeting dates, minutes, etc. You can access it at <u>http://adam.cheshire.net/~stoddardschool/home</u>.

Also this year the board agreed to hire a new bus driver, Lanney Seaver of Stoddard. At this time we truly want to thank Betty Weaver for her many, many years of service to the Stoddard School system and its students.

Lastly, the budget: As many of you are already aware, our special education budget has spiraled this year due to five new students in our district. The costs for services to these students are out of the board's control. The board's major concern has been the difficulty of hiring a certified special education teacher. We have been operating this year with a substitute teacher. Testing and other services, which have to be provided by a certified special education teacher, have been provided outside of our district, which is very costly. The teaching position has been advertised several times, but it has been difficult to interest a certified teacher to travel this distance to work at 60% time with no benefits.

There are currently 56 students at James Faulkner Elementary School with six in our special education programs. We are also sending 20 students to Keene Middle School and 23 students to Keene High School. There are currently five outof-district students attending either the Washington Elementary School or the Hillsboro-Deering School District.

Marline Leotta resigned this year as clerk. Her position has been filled by Sherry LaPointe. The board appreciates all the time Marline committed to the meetings and thanks Sherry for taking the challenging position.

This has been a challenging year for the board and staff at our school. We are very fortunate to have such dedicated staff and we appreciate their hard work and commitment to our school. Special thanks to everyone for their patience during construction of our new community room. It has been well worth the wait!

The Stoddard School Board will continue to work in the best interest of our students and the residents of Stoddard. We welcome anyone to our monthly meetings and please feel free to call us any time with your concerns.

Principal's Report

This past year has been filled with changes. The Stoddard School lost several staff members, and several new people have joined us. Janet King is our new Art teacher. In the special education department we have a totally new group of people. Filling in as a long-term substitute is Janice Mullen, who graduated form Keene State College. Nancy Cressy is a tutor aide in the K/1 class, who is a graduate of the University of New Hampshire. Pam Dionne is a tutor aide in the 2/3 class, and is a graduate of Keene State College. After many meetings and lots of hard work, we finally passed the building of a multipurpose room. With this new room will come many wonderful programs and opportunities for Stoddard!

Looking back at the K/1 classroom in the spring of 1998, we find that Mrs. Hamilton's students worked on a study of communities and families. They concluded by creating portraits of their families using lace, buttons, wallpaper, burlap, and anything else they could get their hands on. The class then moved to a study of maple sugar that ended with a field trip to Stonewall Farm.

Caterpillars came with the arrival of spring, while the students cared for their new found friends as they evolved into butterflies. The butterflies were released in May. The final unit of the year was an intense study of sea otters, sea lions, sea turtles, penguins, and seals. The year ended with a trip to the New England Aquarium in Boston.

During this time, the 2/3 class started the new year studying the Oregon Trail. Students gained a broad knowledge of the American West, with a clearer knowledge of the history of the Oregon Trail between the years 1840 - 1860. During this unit, students were introduced to early explorers, the "jumping-off" places, the people who traveled the trail, reasons for traveling, famous landmarks, hardships of the trail, forts and towns, Native Americans, and the end destination of a 2,000 mile journey. Students participated in classroom cooperative role-playing in order to better understand the decisions and hardships faced by pioneers of years ago.

Following the Oregon Trail study, Mrs. Sergeant's class moved on to studying endangered animals. This unit involved the study of specific animals and the causes of all endangered animals. Students created presentations demonstrating their knowledge of their particular animal. The unit ended with a field trip to Gap Mountain in Troy, NH. They found many animal tracks on our trip and even saw several hawks. My class of 4/5 had an in depth study of penguins, which was the basis of our reading program's book; Mr. Popper's Penguins. Along with penguins, we also learned about Antarctica, and its explorers.

As we continued to learn about NH history, our class made a very interesting trip to the NH Historical Society, in Concord. We even had a special tour of our own town of Stoddard! Dr. Robert Wellwood met us at the Stoddard Historical Society, and shared some great history with us. He then took us on a hike to point out some historical locations which are located right around us. In closing the school year of 1997/1998, our last trip was to Heritage, New Hampshire, which is always a favorite. It's a great finale to our year long study of colonial life, and New Hampshire History.

As we move along to this past fall, we find that the Kindergarten and Grade one students have been very busy. They started off the year studying different cultures around the world. After that, students moved to a study of pumpkins. They counted pumpkin seeds, made pumpkin seed tambourines and painted pumpkin pictures, which were decorated with everything from buttons to lace.

The students finished up a study of birds in December. They observed quill feathers with magnifying glasses, created bird squawkers, and identified bird calls. We were fortunate enough to have a parent, Josh Cline, who works for the Audubon Society, volunteer his time by giving a presentation on birds. The students were very excited to see a live owl and a live hawk!

Mrs. Sergeant's 2/3 class began this fall by studying about habitats. Students studied over eight different habitats in the classroom. In order to better understand life cycles in habitats, students created actual habitats within the classroom. By combining two soda bottles, students created grassland habitats that resided on top of a wetland habitat.

After the study of habitats, Mrs. Sergeant's class moved on to studying fairy tales from around the world. The study of fairy tales helped to give the students a larger feel of their folk history and experience natural fears and hopes in a safe environment. Students have developed a "fairy tale recipe" and are applying various fairy tales to the recipe to see how they measure up. At the end of the unit, students will be studying various forms of the fairy tale, Cinderella.

During this fall, the 2/3 have also attended field trips to Stonewall Farm, and had a NH Wildlife representative come to the class to demonstrate habitats within New Hampshire.

This year's Science program for the 4/5 class is "Destination Mars". This is a Science-By-Mail challenge about regenerative life support. Students have been preparing for making a trip to Mars. Some of the lessons involved: hydroponics, transpiration, water usage, and other such preparatory experiments to get ready for their big trip! Students are working in small groups, and are corresponding with Scientist Pen Pals as they work towards completing their experiments.

Our 4/5 class is also working on a Middle Ages unit. This is the setting for one of our literature based Reading program books, The Whipping Boy. Students have been learning how to become a knight, and about the suits of armor they wore. Soon students will be designing their own castle models.

Our first program in the new room took place on December 17. The entire school was franticly working to prepare for this grand occasion. Students practiced and rehearsed for their classes' presentation. Staff members packed and moved supplies, set up new equipment, and prepared the multipurpose room for its premiere!

I would like to close by thanking all of you who put in so much time and effort for our school!! The P.T.O. did a lot for the staff and students with putting together a wonderful Thanksgiving Feast, supplying the refreshments for our fall open house and the Christmas Program, and making an ornament for each teacher and student at the school for the Christmas parties. Lynn Jablonski and Cheryl Woods have spent a great number of hours volunteering at the school! Thank you, very much!

A. One School Board Member - 3 year term
B. One Moderator - 1 year term
C. One Treasurer - 1 year term
D. One Clerk - 1 year term
E. One Auditor - 1 year term

Brenda Howard moved that the polls be open until 9 p.m. or the close of the meeting whichever occurs last. The motion was seconded by Lynne Jarest. Motion carried unanimously by voice vote. The Polls opened at 7:07 p.m.

Moderator Daniel Eaton called voting recess to allow those present to vote. The recess was over and the meeting called to order at 8:50 p.m.

Moderator Dan Eaton read Article 2.

ARTICLE 2. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$490,000.00 (four hundred ninety thousand dollars) for the purpose of designing, construction, renovating, equipping and related fees and expenses for an addition of a Community/School Room at the James Faulkner Elementary School; the \$490,000.00 (four hundred ninety thousand dollars) to be raised by the issuance of bonds or serial notes in accordance with the provisions of RSA 33; the School Board to determine the terms and conditions of said bonds or notes; and further to appropriate to the purposes set forth in the bond issue any interest or income earned, not to exceed \$15,000.00 (fifteen thousand dollars), on the proceeds from the sale of bonds.

Lynne Jarest moved Article 2 and Denise Pratt seconded. Proposal was presented and explained by Dan Bisson, architect; Jim Delisle, Construction Manager; Don Jones; Jim Crane; and Carol Clark, Chairman of the Building Committee. Discussion followed. Brenda Howard moved to move the question.

To see what sum of money [\$799,790.00 (seven ARTICLE 5. hundred ninety nine thousand, seven hundred ninety dollars)] the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, and for the payment of salaries of School District officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District. (This warrant article is supported by the School Board.)

Lynne Jarest Moved Article 5. Denise Pratt seconded. Motion carried by voice vote.

Moderator Dan Eaton read Article 6.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the District shall vote to raise \$40,000.00 (forty thousand dollars) to reduce the general fund deficit pursuant to RSA 189:28-a. (This warrant article is supported by the School Board.) (Majority vote required.) (This appropriation is in addition to Warrant Article #5, the operating budget.)

Denise Pratt moved Article 6. Lynne Jarest seconded. Motion carried by voice vote.
