*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chichester in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chichester on Tuesday, the 5th day of March, next at 10:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1) To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.  
2) To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of current year taxes.

4) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$310.00 for support of the Concord Hospital. (At request of the Hospital.)

5) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 as the Town's share of the cost of hiring two men to operate the Center Barnstead Ambulance during day time hours only. (At the request of the Barnstead Fire Dept.)

6) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum — not to exceed — \$1,000.00 for the Chichester Library Building Fund, and to transfer said sum to Capital Reserve Fund.

7) To see if the Town will vote to transfer to Capital Reserve Fund the sum of \$1,000.00, raised and appropriated at the 1973 Town Meeting, for the Chichester Library Building Fund.

8) To see if the Town will vote to appropriate from Revenue Sharing Trust Fund a sum of \$6,061.54 plus interest for the purchase of a new fire truck.

9) To see if the Town will vote to transfer the Grader Capital Reserve Fund of \$6,344.18 plus interest toward the purchase of a new fire truck.

10) To see if the Town will vote to transfer a sum not to exceed \$1,000.00 from General Funds to Capital Reserve Fund toward the purchase of a new fire truck.

11) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$14,000.00 toward the purchase of a new fire truck, of which \$2,000.00 to be raised by current year taxes and to authorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes for the remaining \$12,000.00 payable in equal installments of \$2,000.00 in the years 1975, 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979 and 1980.

12) To see if the Town will vote to adopt absentee voting at any annual or special town meeting.

13) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$45,450.00 as the Town's share for construction of a new bridge across the Suncook River on Webster Mills Road.

14) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$45,450.00 as the Town's share for construction of a new bridge across the Suncook River on Webster Mills Road of which \$10,000.00 to be raised by current year taxes and to au-



thorize the Selectmen to issue serial notes for the remaining \$35,450.00 payable in equal installments in the years 1975, 1976, 1977 and 1978.

15) To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the regional planning commission, now organized and named the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. This Commission has membership of more than ten municipalities and has jurisdiction over the planning region delineated by the Office of State Planning. The objective of the Commission is to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide consensus on major problems of regional concern and to assist in the effectuation of projects within, and which extend beyond, the boundaries of a particular town. The Commission has only the authority conferred on it by Chapter 36:45-53, Revised Statutes Annotated 1955, and is advisory to local governments in the Region. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with State Law. Two representatives will be appointed from Chichester.

16) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$719.00 at a rate of 60 cents per capita as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

17) To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the Capital Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Board.

The Board is organized in conjunction with other member communities of the Central N. H. Regional Planning Commission to prepare a detailed proposal to solve the solid waste management problems of the communities as required under New Hampshire Statutes. The Solid Waste Management proposal is to include site selection, detailed engineering, operations requirements, costs, financial, legal and implementation data to be presented to the member communities for final action. Three representatives will be appointed from Chichester in accordance with the bylaws of the Capital Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Board.

18) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$359.70 at a rate of 30 cents per capita as the Town's share of costs of the Capital Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Board, conditional upon the terms set forth in the Board's bylaws.

19) To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls will be open until 6:00 P.M.

All articles except 1 above will be taken up at 7:00 P.M.

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CHICHESTER VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

In submitting the annual report for the Volunteer Fire Department I will first give the fire statistics for 1973. By comparison to the 10 calls for assistance in 1972, the Fire Department responded to 32 calls in 1973. This is a large increase over last year and should alert everyone to the ever present danger of fire. The following calls for assistance were recorded:

- 12 mutual aid
- 8 structural
- 5 brush
- 4 car
- 3 chimney

We are now being presented with a new danger of fire, resulting from the increased use of wood burning fires as caused by the shortage of fuel oil. Many people are now using wood stoves, never before having had any experience with them, and are installing and using them improperly. Already, we are experiencing fires caused by dangerous installations. The Fire Department is available to anyone wishing information on installation of wood stoves and proper connection to chimneys.

This year, I am asking for a slight increase in our operating budget, due to the price increases of fuel and other items. Also, some new equipment is needed. We have accepted about a dozen new members this year, of which most are young men and show favorable interest in becoming good firefighters. It should be noted that to equip a man with his gear, coat, boots, and helmet costs about \$100.00 and to supply a radio receiver for his home costs \$110.00. This, plus regular replacement of equipment constitutes the Department's budget.

For two years the Fire Department has tried to have the Town raise and appropriate enough money to purchase a new tank truck, but has twice been defeated, the

last time by only one vote. I hope that this year the voters will approve our request and vote the appropriation. The cost of the apparatus increases 5% annually, thus we have already lost about \$1500.00 which had been set aside for the new truck. The need for a new tank truck has already been well presented, and I hope that the voters will support our request.

Finally, I would like to point out that we are more frequently called to the assistance of other towns as the area has grown. In return, we have made greater use of the mutual aid systems, resulting in saving several local dwellings. I feel the accomplishments of the volunteer firemen this past year should be commended for their performance in protecting life and property in our community.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the forest fire warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the fire warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The fire warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

### LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

The year 1973 has been another successful year for the library with the help of The Friends of the Library and the Trustees.

On March 29, I became librarian at the request of the Trustees. Since I had no formal library training, it was decided that a course offered by the University of New Hampshire would be pursued in the summer months. Due to illness last summer, it was impossible, but if the course is offered in 1974, we will take advantage of it.

5,622 books were in circulation last year. During the year 147 new books were purchased to add to the permanent collection in our library. There were several anonymous gifts as well as gifts of books from the N. H. Masons, Kay Shaw, Dr. Gloor, Nancy Boyd, and Mrs. Doris Lake in memory of her husband, Kenneth. For the ninth year, Mrs. Ruth Blackburn Coskey made a most generous gift of money. Several new books were purchased from this fund.

The Friends of the Library held a kite flying contest in June and the Trustees' held one in October. Jane Coons graciously offered her home on Garvin Hill for both contests. Proceeds from the kite flying contests were added to the library building fund.

We have continued cooperating with the school, serving as liaison, taking books to the school upon request, and ordering books from the State Library and Book-mobile.

All the book shelves and the floor were painted, and books were rearranged to make more room for newer additions this past year.

We are hoping that 1974 will be another successful year with the continued help of all those interested in seeing their town library grow and expand.

A special thank you, to Mrs. John Varney, who again has opened her home as a branch library. 644 books were borrowed through the branch during 1973.

1. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

To see if the School District will vote from this date forward to indemnify and save harmless from loss or damage any person employed by it, including the Superintendent of Schools and any member of the School Board, administrative staff or agencies, from personal financial loss and expense including reasonable legal fees and costs, if any, arising out of any claim demand suit or judgment by reason of negligence or other act resulting in accident injury to a person or accidental damage to or destruction of property if the indemnified person at the time of the accident resulting in the injury, damage or destruction was acting in the scope of his employment or office.
5. To see if the School District will vote to authorize the School Board to purchase a comprehensive



general liability insurance policy in order to protect the School District employees, officers, administrative staff and itself against personal liability suits.

6. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
7. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen, the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

## REPORT OF THE CHICHESTER SCHOOL BOARD 1973-74

We all realize that there have been changes in our school personnel this year. The school board was sorry to learn that Mrs. Hill and Mrs. Tuttle, after many years of dedicated service to our students and community, were to retire last June. Mrs. Metcalf also asked to resign, for personal reasons, which meant the loss of another experienced teacher. It is difficult to fill positions left open by competent personnel. The board filled the fourth-fifth grade assignment with an experienced teacher Mrs. Sue Williams. The grade one position was filled by a first year teacher Miss Kathy Corkum. The seventh-eight grade math science position was extremely difficult to fill. There were very few qualified candidates available. The position is now filled with a first year teacher, Mr. James Fifty. It is our sincere hope that students and parents will find these teachers helpful, understanding and competent. Also, Mr. James Brown who served as a custodian for more than four years retired in August. This position was also difficult to fill. The board has hired Mr. Nelson Perron, who as Mr. Brown has interest in the maintenance of our building.

The State Board of Education has placed Chichester in a smaller Supervisory Union which will be made up of Pembroke, Allenstown, Deerfield, Epsom, and Chichester and will take effect July 1, 1974. Mr. Gerald Croteau our present assistant superintendent will be superintendent of the smaller Union which still will be Supervisory Union number fifty-three. The board feels that Mr. Croteau will give us the needed assistance we have been looking for.

Many contributions were given to the Irene Ricker Memorial fund. A decision made by Irene's family and the board was to purchase a set of book shelves for the library and also to establish a fund so that an annual

monetary award can be given to a graduating girl and boy each and every year.

Many new homes are being built in town which means the school enrollment is likely to increase. We presently have a large fifth grade and at this time it is split between two teachers. We have room to split one more grade which would take away the room presently used for learning abilities, music, art, and extra curricular activities. The board realized an addition means, more tax dollars and that every year our present facilities are adequate will give us time to pay on our present mortgage. We must realize that the facilities in our school are now being used pretty much to their capacity.
